The overwhelming participation of NSS students, along with NGOs like LBL and Narmada Kidney Foundation, Rotarians, and Rotaractors, made the walkathon a grand success. The event culminated in an insightful panel discussion featuring eminent doctors, including Rtn. Dr. Pallavi Saple (Dean, JJ Hospital), Rtn. Dr. Nilesh Satbhai (Hand Transplant & Plastic Surgery Specialist), and Dr. Nikhil Naste (Ophthalmologist), along with organ donors and recipients. Their discussion provided a deeply informative perspective on the importance of organ donation.

This event also coincided with another heartwarming initiative—the donation of AI glasses and smart canes to five visually impaired individuals. This contribution will significantly enhance their quality of life, helping them navigate the world with greater ease.

Additionally, the installation of a water filter at the Dementia Daycare Centre run by Dignity Foundation was more than just a donation—it was an opportunity to spend meaningful time with the residents. Seeing their struggles firsthand reinforced the urgent need to prioritize mental health as a key area of focus in our club's initiatives.

Another significant project was inaugurated on February 22nd at Neral Vidyamandir School for underprivileged children. Our very own Rtn. Dr. Darekar introduced a transformative personality development program called 'Madli Sutti', aimed at shaping young minds for a brighter future.

Overall, it has been a fulfilling month, proving that great work continues to happen when members take the initiative. Looking forward to even more impactful projects ahead!

MASIK CHAKRA - EMPOWERING SESSION ON MENSTRUAL HEALTH

On 5th February 2025, RCMM organized an insightful and interactive session on Masik Chakra at CSV School, Dharavi, benefiting 150 girls from classes 6 to 9. The session was led by the dynamic Rtn. Shruti Dharamsi, President of RC Mumbai Ghatkopar West, who created a safe and engaging environment for open discussions on menstrual health.

The session began with a 20-minute audio-visual presentation, laying the foundation for an informative and engaging dialogue. Rtn. Shruti skillfully addressed doubts, dispelled myths, and encouraged an open conversation, ensuring that by the end, the students felt more confident and comfortable discussing menstrual health.

To further support menstrual hygiene, she distributed comic books and cramp relief pads to the students. AG Padma Kapoor generously contributed period panties, which were distributed among Interact girls. Rtn. Shruti also highlighted the importance of proper hygiene, regular exercise, and balanced nutrition in managing menstrual cycles for a healthier, stress-free life.

The event was attended by Rtn. Tejaswini, exchange student Isabella, and members of RCM, adding to the enthusiasm and impact of the session. PR Vidula along with Rtns. Seema and Jayanti were present throughout the session.





WAY TO INDEPENDENCE – SUPPORT TO DIFFERENTLY ABLED

At RCMM, we believe in empowering individuals not through sympathy, but by providing them with opportunities to become self-reliant. In line with this philosophy, we donated a sewing machine, an atta chakki, and a laptop to differently-abled women in Ahmednagar. The request was received through Akanksha Rehabilitation Centre, an organization dedicated to supporting differently-abled individuals in achieving independence.

Akanksha Rehabilitation Centre was founded on 22nd June, 2002 by Savita Kale, and it has been instrumental in creating opportunities for the differently-abled, enabling them to earn a dignified livelihood. RCMM has been associated with Akanksha through Rtn. Anand Limaye, who serves on their board. Over the years, RCMM has extended its support to Akanksha, including constructing a small tapari and donating an atta chakki to help a visually impaired couple sustain themselves.

This year, we received a request to support three women:

- Ambika Pimpale** – Deaf from birth, Ambika lost her husband, who was also hearing impaired. She now single-handedly raises her daughter and needed an atta chakki to start a small flour milling business and support her daughter’s education.
- Anjali Sanjay Tarwade** – Also deaf since birth, Anjali recently lost her husband, who worked as a peon. She has learned sewing and fall-pico work and needed a sewing machine to earn a livelihood.
- Anjali Suryavanshi** – Skilled in computer operations, Anjali currently has a job but was at risk of losing it as she lacked a laptop to work from home.

Understanding the urgency and impact of this request, RCMM members—Rtns. Sunita, Dr. Supriya, Dr. Latika, Usha, and Nita—personally traveled to Ahmednagar to hand over the atta chakki, sewing machine, and laptop to these deserving women. It was deeply moving to hear their stories and witness their determination to achieve financial independence despite their challenges.

The event was a significant step in promoting the noble cause of organ donation and encouraging more people to pledge their organs.

The event was graced by honorary member and Dean of JJ Hospital, Rtn. Dr. Pallavi Saple, who attended as the Chief Guest. She was joined by renowned medical professionals and key panelists who actively supported the cause:

Donors, recipients urge citizens to save lives by donating organs

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MUMBAI: "While casually checking my messages on my phone a few years ago, I saw a forwarded message that said, 'Need O+ve, I responded to the call,'" said Varsha Kavishkar, 58, a retired school principal from Mumbai. "But the person at the other end said they needed an organ."

She said it took a day for it to sink in and to understand the process. "The next day I agreed," she said. The organ coordinator from a Delhi hospital explained the process of liver donation and that the liver is regenerative. "I said my family of my decision. Initially, they were sceptical but eventually they agreed," she said.

Kavishkar was speaking at an organ donation awareness programme organised by the Rotary Club of Mumbai Mahim, in association with the Sir JJ group of hospitals and Live Beyond Life Foundation, a transplant advocacy group, on Friday.

Kavishkar travelled to Delhi as the recipient was in that city. "I was admitted to hospital for five days and got 67 stitches on the stomach." She said she turned down the option of plastic surgery as "the scar is a symbol of giving life to someone and I will flaunt it."

At the event on Friday, Dr Palavi Saple, dean, Sir JJ Hospital, said, "JJ Hospital has the highest number of transplant surgeries. Currently, there are 6,500 patients on the wait list for kidney, 500 for liver, 119 for heart, 34 for pancreas, and two for the small intestine. These numbers can come down to zero if a greater number of people take the initiative and pledge their organs." Saple said the government-run JJ Hospital is in process of setting up a liver transplant wing, which should be operational soon.

The awareness programme, held at Shivaji Park, hosted a comprehensive discussion of donors, recipients, and medical experts that highlighted the different types of organ donation. In another case, Goregaon resident Anamta Ahmed, 13, said she almost lost her right hand after she accidentally touched an open electric cable at the age of nine. "The doctors tried to save my hand but couldn't. We reached out to several hospitals for a transplant but they declined because I was under 18."

Then Dr Nilesh Sathbhav of Gokuldas Hospital, Parel, took up the transplant surgery. "We registered for transplant at the hospital and was lucky to receive a cadaver donation from a nine-year-old from Ahmedabad," said Ahmed.

Dr Saple said, "No donation goes waste. If the body does not have any viable organs, it can be used for scientific purposes by medical students."

RCMM will be giving Certificate of Participations to 200 NSS students and Rotaractors who pledged their organs. Cotton bags with Organ Donation Awareness messages and refreshments were distributed to the audience. Live coverage by Doordarshan and various media houses ensured that the message of the event reached a wider audience. An online link for organ donation registration was actively shared, allowing more people to pledge their organs digitally.

The Organ Donation Awareness Drive was a resounding success, not just in terms of participation but also in its impact. By bringing together medical experts, donors, recipients, students, and the general public, the event created a strong and lasting awareness about organ donation. Forty members of the general public pledged to donate their organs during the event, including two women who made their contributions on the spot. This remarkable response is a testament to the event's success and the growing awareness of this noble cause.

The participation of NSS students is truly commendable. As the young changemakers of our nation, they serve as true ambassadors of the gift of life. Rotary Club of Mumbai Mahim extends heartfelt gratitude to all participants, dignitaries, organizations, and media personnel who contributed to making this event a milestone in the journey of Organ Donation Awareness.

आजपर्यंत एकूण वेगवेगळ्या अशा २४ हातांचे प्रत्यारोपण करण्यात आले असून रुग्णालयातील हे १३ वे यशस्वी हात प्रत्यारोपण ठरले आहे.

अनेक महिन्यांच्या प्रसिद्धेनंतर आणि योग्य अवयव दाखवाची वाट पाहिल्यानंतर, गेल्या आठवड्यात हॉस्पिटलने हात प्रत्यारोपणाची शस्त्रक्रिया यशस्वीरित्या पार पाडली. इंदो रमधील ६९ वर्षीय दात्याकडून मिळालेला हात हातिकासाठी योग्य ठरला ३० डिसेंबर २९२४ रोजी सुरु झालेली ही शस्त्रक्रिया आणि नवीन वर्षाच्या पूर्वसंध्येपर्यंत म्हणजेच १५ तासांहून अधिक काळ सुरु होती. अशा महत्त्वपूर्ण शस्त्रक्रिया करण्याचा आम्हाला अभिमान वाटतो असे स्नेहनिहास हॉस्पिटलचे सीईओ डॉ विभिन चवले यांनी सांगितले.
