Anupampattu Toilet Project

The Irula Tribe, a cluster of about 500 families live in and around Devadhanam Village (includes Anupampattu and other villages) live in thatched huts. Their socio economic living conditions have been marked by poverty, illiteracy and with no social security. Because they do not have toilets at their houses/thatched huts, had to walk daily around 1 to 2 kilometers to use the common toilets and found it a tedious journey all the time. Children, women found it difficult to walk each time to the toilets so far away. The immediate need was to have a healthy and clean life.

When the Village heads of Devadhanam and Anupampattu village approached RC Chennai Towers requesting for help in any form for the Irula Tribe, we looked at building toilets at a common point closer to the houses of one large cluster of 170 families. After consultation with the village heads, RC of Chennai Towers Board and members, and a number of visits to the site, the place to build the toilets was selected. After meticulous planning, finalising of vendor, drawing the layout, and arranging all logistics for the construction etc, the project was completed efficiently, and launched by our DG J Sridhar!



RCCT Project Akshayam

It is our eternal obligation towards a human being to not let them suffer from hunger when one has the chance of feeding someone who is unsure about their next meal. This equals to feeding their soul itself. This thought was what that sparked the birth of project Akshayam. This is a project done mostly by the women (Rotarians/Anns /Annettes) of RC Chennai Towers, where they pack 100 - 150 packs of food and distribute it to the needy on the road once a month.



Anjugam School Project – Communicative English Teaching

Post COVID, after a gap of two years, as schools have reopened, most little children had forgotten all basics of core subjects as well as English language. The ladies at RC Chennai Towers decided to help out the Anjugam Primary School. Once a week for 6 weeks, they went in and conduct Communicative English Sessions for the students. The topics were from animals and birds to shapes and fruits. Another project that brought a sense of satisfaction for all of us on a project well done



RCCT Dialysis Centre

RCCT raised over 80 Lakhs to build a Dialysis centre in partnership with the Greater Chennai Corporation and the TANKER Foundation. This Centre is situated at Retteri and provides this much needed life saving medical procedure to those in need absolutely free of cost. The Dialysis machines are state of the art and the facilities match the best hospitals in the Country. This facility provides over 7200 sessions each year benefitting thousands of patients suffering from kidney diseases.



Smart Classroom Project

We have set up 20 Smart Classrooms in 2 Govt Girls Schools in Shenoy Nagar & Porur. This will help the over 2700 Students understand & learn better through interactive and visual animations based on the Samacheer Kalvi syllabus. moreover there are assignments, question banks & continuous assessments that help the students to be better prepared



Kanavu Meipada

Due to the COVID 19 pandemic, many bright students were not able to continue with their education nor cope with online classes as they did not have computers or smart phones.

RCCT in association with our CSR partners procured 100 laptops and 100 mobile tablets to be distributed to deserving children. We identified students in 12th standard who had got extremely good marks, first generation learners and children of front-line workers and distributed these products. This will be a continuous project and we hope to donate over 100 laptops every year.



Oxygen Concentrator Distribution

In line with the need at the medical front due to COVID, Rotary Club of Chennai Towers has distributed free of cost Oxygen Concentrators that were sponsored to RC Chennai Towers by the Hospital without Borders, Belguim.
