The Rotary Club of Madras, founded on May 10, 1929, and chartered on July 19, 1929, proudly holds the legacy of being South India and Sri Lanka's pioneering Rotary Club. As the third-oldest Rotary Club in India, after Calcutta and Bombay, our members have consistently demonstrated a steadfast commitment to selfless service. Over the years, their tireless efforts have transformed the lives of millions in disadvantaged and marginalized communities.

A significant milestone in the journey of philanthropy was reached in 1971, when The Rotary Club of Madras Charitable Trust was formally registered under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860. This pivotal step marked the institutionalization of the Rotary Club of Madras's charitable endeavors, laying the foundation for a legacy of service that continues to uplift communities. Building on this commitment, the Rotary Club of Madras inaugurated the Boys Town project in 1988, further deepening its impact on society.

Additionally, we are registered with the Ministry of Corporate Affairs, facilitating our participation in Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiatives. As an FCRA-registered organization, the Rotary Club of Madras is eligible to receive foreign contributions, enabling us to partner with global organizations and individuals to support our projects.

Our trust is duly registered under Section 12 AA of the Income Tax Act, 1961, and holds 80G status. This enables donors to avail tax benefits, making their contributions go even further in supporting the causes.

This partnership enables us to collaborate with like-minded organizations, amplifying our impact and creating a lasting difference in the lives of those we serve.


We are proud to share that this year:

During the year, RCMCT embarked on over 75+ impactful projects, committing a total budget of Rs. 24.4 crore. Of this, Rs. 16.3 crore worth of initiatives reached successful completion, while the remaining Rs. 8.1 crore projects are progressing steadily through various phases. Our efforts spanned critical areas including:

- Healthcare (Rs. 10.9 crore): Enhancing access to quality medical services and preventive care.
- Housing and Anganwadis (Rs. 5.2 crore): Providing safe and dignified living spaces for vulnerable communities.
- WASH Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (Rs. 4.5 crore): Promoting health and well-being through improved sanitation infrastructure.
- Skill Development (Rs. 3.2 crore): Empowering individuals with vocational skills to foster sustainable livelihoods.

These initiatives have positively impacted numerous communities across Chennai and North Tamil Nadu, embodying the Rotary spirit of "Service Above Self."

#### **Robust Financial Stewardship**

Our treasury funds were strategically invested across reputable banks, balancing liquidity, security, and returns to ensure the sustainability of our mission. We maintained impeccable compliance with all statutory requirements—including GST, Society returns, Income Tax, and FCRA filings—demonstrating our commitment to exemplary governance standards.

Further, we upheld transparency by issuing utilisation certificates to our CSR partners within 45 days of the financial year's close, reinforcing our accountability and trustworthiness.

In every initiative — from housing to hygiene, education to environment — we've aimed not just to build structures, but to restore self-worth and strengthen communities.



# COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

**1000+** Families Touched

**41** Infrastructure Created



#### Objective

Established in 1988, the Boys Town Project aims to provide a safe, nurturing, and empowering environment for economically disadvantaged boys from grades 6 to 12. Located on a 34-acre green campus near Gummidipundi in Thiruvallur District, the project supports approximately 100 children annually. Funded by Wärtsilä and approved by relevant government authorities, the program offers residential care, quality education, and holistic development opportunities.

#### **Beneficiaries**

The boys supported through this initiative come from highly marginalized backgrounds, with little access to education, healthcare, or stable family environments. Many have faced neglect or abandonment, making the need for a structured, compassionate support system essential to their well-being and growth.

#### Impact (2024-25)

In the reporting year, 80 boys benefited from the project's comprehensive support. They received nutritious meals, uniforms, safe accommodation, and free transport to nearby Government schools. In addition to formal education, digital classrooms, subject-specific tutoring, computer literacy, and spoken English classes enhanced their academic learning.

Regular counselling sessions addressed mental health and career guidance. The project also continued its commitment to long-term support by providing college scholarships to deserving alumni, empowering them to pursue higher education and self-reliant futures.

#### **Academic Highlights**

The Boys Town Project has maintained an impressive academic record. In 2023–24:

- 100% pass rate was achieved by all 11 students in Class XII.
- 14 students in Class XI and 17 students in Class X passed with merit.
- 16 graduates from the 2022–2024 batches secured admissions in reputed Arts, Polytechnic, and Engineering colleges across Tamil Nadu.

These milestones reflect the program's commitment to academic excellence and continuity in higher education.

#### **Beyond the Classroom**

The project prioritizes holistic development. Boys actively participated in a range of enrichment activities, including:

- Educational and recreational camps to build confidence and teamwork
- Inter-school competitions in academics, sports, and arts
- Workshops, awareness sessions, and cultural events that broaden perspectives

Through these engagements, students gain life skills, exposure, and a strong sense of identity and achievement.

The objective of this initiative is to provide safe, sanitary, and dignified housing for marginalized Irular tribal families, thereby laying the groundwork for a model village and significantly enhancing their overall quality of life. The project directly benefits 76 families—comprising over 270 individuals, including men, women, and children—living in a remote rural hamlet in the Chengalpattu District. Through this effort, the initiative aims to bring lasting change by ensuring stable living conditions and promoting social inclusion for one of the region's most underserved communities.

#### **Proiect Details**

- Each home measures 340 sq. ft.
- Features: Kitchen, Thinnai, Toilet, Water Connection, Kitchen Garden, Fans, Lights, and Cupboard
- Designed for sustainable rural living and better hygiene practices
- Each house is constructed at a cost of Rs. 4,35,000.

#### Impact (2024-25)

The Home for the Homeless project has brought about a transformative shift in the lives of the Irular families. The provision of secure, well-equipped homes has instilled a renewed sense of safety, dignity, and stability among the beneficiaries. Access to toilets and clean water has significantly improved hygiene and sanitation practices, contributing to better health outcomes. The project has also fostered community pride and cohesion, marking a vital step toward the creation of a model village and setting the stage for long-term social upliftment.

This initiative aimed to create a cleaner, safer, and more dignified environment for students, particularly in a high-footfall school setting.

## Infrastructure Support to Government Adi Dravidar High School, Melakottaiyur

#### Overview

Recognizing that education is the foundation for a brighter and more equitable future, the Rotary Club of Madras undertook a comprehensive infrastructure development project at the Government Adi Dravidar High School in Melakottaiyur, Kanchipuram District. This initiative focused on enhancing learning conditions and promoting dignity and hygiene for students from economically disadvantaged communities.

#### **Scope of Work**

- Construction of a New Classroom Block to accommodate more students and reduce overcrowding
- Construction of a Toilet Block to improve hygiene and sanitation, particularly benefiting girl students
- Renovation of the Existing School Building to ensure a safer and more conducive learning environment

#### **Beneficiaries**

The direct beneficiaries of this initiative are the students of the Government Adi Dravidar High School, most of whom come from underprivileged backgrounds in and around Melakottaiyur. The improved infrastructure supports not just current students but will benefit future generations as well.

#### Impact

- Improved access to quality education in a safe and welcoming environment
- Better student attendance and retention, especially among girl students
- Enhanced hygiene and sanitation, contributing to overall health and wellbeing
- A renewed sense of dignity and pride among students, teachers, and the local community

## Anchoring Hope in Suleri Kattukuppam

#### **Project Location**

Suleri Kattukuppam, a coastal village located approximately 45 km from Chennai, is home to a resilient fishing community that depends on marine-based livelihoods

#### **Background & Ongoing Engagement**

In the aftermath of the 2004 tsunami, permanent housing was constructed for affected fishermen in and around Nemmeli. This marked the beginning of Rotary Club of Madras's long-standing relationship with the fisherfolk of Suleri Kattukuppam. Even two decades later, we remain actively involved in initiatives that enhance their quality of life.

To support the economic stability of the village, 54 sets of fishing nets were donated to local fishermen, valued at Rs. 9,07,200. These nets are critical tools, enabling the community to pursue their traditional livelihoods with greater efficiency and sustainability.

Recognizing the importance of education, we also refurbished the village school and introduced an e-learning classroom, enhancing the learning environment for local children. This upgrade, costing Rs. 4,50,000, ensures that students have access to modern learning tools and digital resources.

#### **Impact on the Community**

These combined efforts have brought tangible improvements to the lives of Suleri Kattukuppam residents—boosting economic opportunities for fishermen and providing better educational experiences for students.

A fully equipped computer lab with 25 new computers was installed and inaugurated at Rajshree Sugars Ramakrishna Vidyalaya Matric Hr. Sec. School, Mundiampakkam, enhancing digital learning access for students. This initiative, implemented at a total cost of Rs. 10,32,500 donated by Access Healthcare Services Private Limited, marks a significant step toward strengthening technology-driven education in the school.



## Building Blocks of Childhood

#### **Project Overview**

750 sq. ft. Anganwadis were constructed in Kanathur, Padur, and Thazhambur Karanai equipped with basic amenities crucial for a child's early development. The centres are designed to support the most critical phase of a child's life—from birth to age six—ensuring access to nutrition, hygiene, and learning.

#### **Facilities & Features**

Each Anganwadi is equipped with child-friendly infrastructure, safe and hygienic amenities, and early learning tools, offering a nurturing space that meets government ECCE (Early Childhood Care and Education) standards. Key highlights include:

- Bright, colourful walls with alphabets and numbers
- ECCE-aligned visuals for early learning
- Child-sized furniture and learning tools
- Kitchen and toilets
- Natural light and ventilation

Established in 1953, GOS-Bala Vihar is a residential home for intellectually challenged children and adults, functioning under the aegis of the Guild of Service (Central), Chennai. Located in Kilpauk, the home provides dedicated residential facilities for 129 intellectually challenged individuals — 61 boys and 68 girls, aged between 7 and 30 years.

The residents are provided with comprehensive, round-theclock care, including nutritious meals, healthcare, clothing, special education, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech and yoga therapy, music therapy, and vocational training. The accommodation is thoughtfully designed in the form of cottages with dormitories, promoting a nurturing and community-oriented environment.

However, a critical need was identified — the absence of a dedicated space for counselling sessions. One-on-one counselling is essential to support the emotional and psychological development of the residents, and the lack of privacy and dedicated infrastructure posed a significant gap.

#### **Beneficiaries**

- 129 intellectually challenged residents 61 boys and 68 girls, aged between 7 to 30 years
- 118 students receiving special education and therapy services
- 50 dedicated staff members involved in care, education, and therapy
- Therapists and counsellors, who now have a dedicated space to provide focused one-on-one and group support
- Parents and caregivers, who benefit indirectly through improved well-being and development of the residents

#### **Impact**

- Improved emotional well-being of residents through regular, structured counselling sessions in a private and safe environment
- Enhanced therapeutic outcomes with dedicated space for speech, occupational, and behavioural therapy sessions
- Increased comfort and hygiene through the addition of modern toilet facilities
- Supportive environment for group activities, peer interaction, and vocational training in the new multipurpose hall
- Reduced stress on staff and caregivers through better infrastructure to manage behavioural and psychological needs
- Empowerment of therapists and counsellors to deliver quality services without space constraints
- Overall upliftment of the institution's standards of care, aligning with best practices in inclusive and special education

#### Overview

The Old Perungalathur Lake, once a degraded and neglected waterbody, has undergone a transformative restoration. This initiative is a critical response to the challenges of water scarcity, urban flooding, and environmental degradation. By restoring the lake's natural ecosystem, the project has contributed to improved groundwater recharge, enhanced biodiversity, and created a clean, green public space that encourages environmental awareness.

#### Scope of Work

Cleaning and Deweeding: 12,553.72 sq.m

Fencing with Gate Installation: 1,013.19 meters

• Bund Strengthening: 9,862.52 sq.m

Dredging and Desilting: 15,151.30 cubic meters

#### **Beneficiaries**

Approximately 50,000 people reside in the immediate vicinity of Old Perungalathur Lake. These residents benefit directly from improved environmental conditions, enhanced groundwater recharge, and reduced waterlogging. However, the lake's larger regional impact extends well beyond the adjacent neighborhood. An estimated 150,000+ individuals across surrounding areas benefit indirectly

#### **Impact**

- Enhanced Groundwater Recharge through deepened lakebed and improved percolation
- Improved Water Retention and flood mitigation during heavy rains
- Prevention of Encroachments through fencing and defined boundaries
- Revival of Aquatic Life and restoration of the lake's ecological balance
- · Creation of a Clean and Accessible Public Space that fosters environmental stewardship among local residents

#### **Post-Restoration Maintenance Plan**

To ensure the longevity and sustainability of the rejuvenation efforts, a detailed maintenance plan has been implemented:

- Tree Plantation Maintenance (1 Year):
   All saplings planted around the lake will be maintained for one year, with regular watering, mulching, and replacement of any failed plants.
- General Lake Maintenance (3 Years):
   Deweeding and periodic upkeep will be carried out over a three-year period, with trained personnel and necessary equipment deployed to maintain cleanliness and ecological balance.

#### Sustainability Fair 2025 – Igniting Community Climate Action

Sustainability Fair 2025, an initiative by the Rotary Club of Madras under the ICE (Innovation for Climate & Environment) platform, brought sustainability to the forefront of public engagement in Chennai. Hosted at Ampa Skyone Mall, the event served as a hub for climate-conscious learning, innovation, and community building.

With 350+ registered attendees, the fair spotlighted innovations in clean energy, waste management, water access, and sustainable living practices. Key highlights included:

- A hands-on waste management workshop attended by over 70 participants
- An art and slogan competition involving 80 school children, promoting awareness through creative expression
- Interactive exhibits by green entrepreneurs showcasing solutions in urban farming, vegan food, NFC networking, and water-from-air technology

Rooted in ICE's four key pillars — Energy, Water, Waste, and Agriculture/Forests — the fair was more than a one-day event. It fostered a growing community committed to practical, scalable climate solutions and encouraged active public participation in sustainability.

#### Green Schools Recognition 2024–25 – Cultivating Young Environmental Stewards

The Green Schools Recognition Program 2024–25, spearheaded by the Environment Committee of the Rotary Club of Madras (RCM), continued to champion environmental leadership among school communities across Chennai. This initiative is designed to encourage Interact Clubs and their host schools to implement impactful, student-led sustainability projects under the Green Schools framework.

Entries showcased a wide range of ecoconscious activities - action-oriented efforts toward sustainability, with projects focusing on waste management, water conservation, energy efficiency, and greening of campus spaces.

Based on the evaluation, the following schools were recognized as prize winners:

- Sri Sankara Vidyashramam Matric Hr Sec School, Thiruvanmiyur
- MCTM Chidambaram Chettyar International School
- Heartfulness International School (Omega Branch)

The results were announced on World Environment Day, June 5, with formal felicitation to be held at an upcoming Rotary Club of Madras weekly meeting. Additionally, Vidya Mandir Estancia was acknowledged for its enthusiastic participation.

#### Greening Communities – Tree Plantation Drives at Boys Town , Bommanjikulam, Perungalathur Lake

As part of its ongoing commitment to environmental sustainability and community development, the Rotary Club of Madras undertook tree plantation drives in two key project areas:

- Boys Town Pond Area, Gummidipoondi
- Bommanjikulam Home for the Homeless, Tiruvallur District
- Old Perungalathur Lake Bund Strengthening

#### Expansion of Home for Homeless – Boomanjikualm Village

#### **Housing for the Vulnerable**

Recognizing the urgent need for stable shelter among homeless and low-income Irular families, additional three new permanent homes were constructed in Bommanjikulam during the year. Each home was built at a cost of Rs. 3,60,000, designed with basic amenities and a focus on durability, safety, and dignity. These homes offer a transformative shift for families previously living in temporary or unsafe conditions, providing a secure foundation from which they can rebuild their lives.

#### **Early Childhood Development: The Anganwadi**

In parallel, a fully functional Anganwadi (Early Childhood Care and Education Centre) was constructed at a cost of Rs. 4,12,000. This centre serves as a critical support hub for children aged 0–6, offering access to early education, nutritional supplements, and regular health checkups. The Anganwadi is expected to play a vital role in reducing early learning gaps, improving child nutrition, and fostering holistic growth during the foundational years.



#### **A Mission to Eliminate Cervical Cancer**

The Rotary Club of Madras launched HPVax, its flagship initiative to prevent HPV-related cervical cancer, in July 2024, in collaboration with the Cancer Institute, Adyar. This impactful program integrates both awareness creation and vaccination drives, aiming to address one of the most preventable yet prevalent cancers among women.

#### **Strategic Community Engagement**

Through extensive outreach in schools, colleges, and communities, the program has sensitized adolescents, parents, and women about the critical importance of early vaccination. These awareness sessions have helped dispel myths and promote vaccine acceptance, particularly among young girls and their guardians.

What began as a Chennai-based initiative has now expanded to reach districts across Tamil Nadu, with plans underway to scale the program to other states. This rapid growth reflects the urgent need for such interventions and the program's effectiveness in building public trust.

## Strengthening Women's Healthcare

### Digital Mammography in Tiruvannamalai



#### **Project Overview**

In a strategic collaboration with SBI Mutual Fund, the Rotary Club of Madras facilitated the installation of an advanced digital mammogram machine at the Preventive Oncology Centre of the Cancer Institute (WIA), Adyar – Tiruvannamalai Branch. Located at the Old Government Hospital on Chengam Main Road, this initiative addresses the pressing need for early breast cancer screening among rural women in Tamil Nadu.

#### **Objective**

To promote early detection of breast cancer in rural and underserved populations, enabling timely treatment and reducing mortality through improved access to screening technology.

#### **Community Impact**

- Provided life-saving diagnostic services to women with limited or no access to preventive screening.
- Enabled early detection and timely intervention, significantly improving treatment outcomes and survival rates.
- Strengthened the infrastructure of a rural healthcare institution, positioning it as a hub for preventive oncology care.
- Raised awareness about breast health and the importance of regular screenings in surrounding communities.

## Strengthening Women's Healthcare

## Donation of Laparoscopy Machine to RSRM Government Hospital

#### **Project Overview**

As part of its commitment to improving women's healthcare services, the Rotary Club of Madras, in collaboration with SBI Mutual Fund, donated a laparoscopy machine to the RSRM Lying-In Hospital, a leading government maternity hospital in Chennai. The contribution aims to enhance the hospital's capacity to provide advanced, minimally invasive surgical care for women.

Located in North Chennai, RSRM Hospital serves a large and densely populated area comprising communities from Tiruvottriyur, Manali, Madhavaram, Tondiarpet, and Royapuram, most of whom come from lower socio-economic backgrounds. With 550 beds, the hospital conducts over 12,000 deliveries annually and regularly performs gynaecological surgeries.

The equipment was formally dedicated to the hospital and has since been put to effective use, contributing to the hospital's surgical capacity and improved patient outcomes.

#### **Objective**

To strengthen the infrastructure of a public maternity hospital by introducing minimally invasive surgical capabilities, thereby enhancing patient care and supporting safer, more efficient medical interventions.

#### **Community Impact**

- The hospital handles a high patient volume, with an average of 370 outpatients and nearly 500 women admitted daily.
- The donated laparoscopy unit is already in active use and is playing a key role in improving the precision, safety, and
  efficiency of surgical procedures.
- As the hospital plans to expand its bed capacity, the availability of this equipment is timely, supporting the anticipated increase in surgical demand.
- The machine facilitates minimally invasive procedures, reducing patient recovery time, improving surgical outcomes, and enhancing overall healthcare delivery.

## **Save the Little Heart**

## Paediatric Cardiac Surgeries Across India



#### **Project Overview**

The Rotary Club of Madras, with CSR support from Redington Foundation, enabled life-saving pediatric heart surgeries for children from underprivileged backgrounds. Congenital heart defects, if left untreated, can lead to lifelong complications or even loss of life. Recognizing the urgency and impact of timely medical intervention, this initiative focused on providing accessible, high-quality care to those who need it most.

In collaboration with two leading healthcare institutions—Apollo Children's Hospital, Chennai, and Kokilaben Dhirubhai Ambani Hospital, Mumbai—the project facilitated access to advanced surgical treatment. A financial grant of Rs. 50,000 per child was extended, significantly easing the financial burden on families and ensuring that treatment was not denied due to lack of resources.

#### **Bridging Gaps in Access**

By collaborating with hospitals in both South and West India, the program bridged geographical and financial barriers, ensuring that children in need received timely surgical care regardless of their location.

#### Total Impact

- 120 children underwent successful heart surgeries
- Children hailed from diverse regions and socio-economic backgrounds
- The initiative restored health, hope, and normalcy to young lives

#### Outcome

This effort not only saved lives but also transformed entire families. Many of these children, once limited by poor health, are now leading active and healthy lives, able to return to school, play, and pursue their dreams.

This year marked a pivotal shift for Vocational Services (VS) at the Rotary Club of Madras—toward greater professionalism, strategic partnerships, and sustainable impact. Our initiatives responded to changing times: rising skill demands, discerning learners, and the need for dignity over charity.

A core transformation was the move to fee-based vocational training, signaling commitment, accountability, and quality. Programs now feature upgraded infrastructure, certified faculty, and recognized credentials—delivered in partnership with reputed organizations like NIIT Foundation, Apparel Council, and Vidya Vidhai Foundation.

The Selaiyur campus has been revitalized into a growing Centre of Excellence, with zero dropouts across computer skills, tailoring, and spoken English courses—350 graduates this year, 500+ expected next. Inclusive training was strengthened through partnerships with Worth Trust and Swabodhini.

Strategic partnerships powered wider impact: ANEW enabled women to become nurse aides and electric auto drivers. We also piloted AI training and teacher-friendly digital literacy. A new community centre was completed and inaugurated at our long-standing Rotary Nagar centre.



From scholarships for tribal students to Partnerships in DEI, we remained anchored in inclusion—yet always with a lens of professionalization, dignity, and future-readiness.

The Vocational Service elephant continues its confident march—evolving with clarity, charging ahead with courage!

Starting October 2024, the center introduced NIIT Foundation-accredited computer training programs, focused on equipping youth with essential digital skills.

- Tally Accounting: Practical training in computerized accounting, improving job readiness for entry-level finance roles.
- NIIT Certification: Students who successfully complete the program receive certification from the NIIT Foundation, enhancing their credibility in the job market.

#### **Spoken English Training**

- Prepares students for interviews and workplace conversations

With an ageing population and rising demand for in-home support, participants are trained in managing geriatric care—assisting with daily routines, preventing bedsores, and ensuring nutritional and hygiene needs are met.

#### Home-Based Health Assistance:

Trainees learn to provide support in home environments, including assisting bedridden patients, managing medication schedules, maintaining sanitary conditions, and responding appropriately to emergencies.

# Empowering Women as AutoRickshaw Drivers

In an effort to promote women's empowerment through skill-building and income generation, the Rotary Club of Madras, in partnership with ANEW (Association for Non-traditional Employment for Women), launched a transformative initiative to train women as licensed auto-rickshaw drivers. This pioneering program supports 20 women from economically disadvantaged backgrounds, equipping them with the skills and confidence to enter traditionally male-dominated sectors such as public transport and last-mile delivery services.

The comprehensive training covered:

- Driving Skills and Traffic Rules: Practical driving lessons combined with classroom instruction on road safety regulations, licensing procedures, and urban navigation.
- **Vehicle Maintenance Basics**: Essential knowledge on auto-rickshaw upkeep, minor repairs, fuel efficiency, and preventive maintenance—crucial for long-term self-reliance.
- Customer Service and Communication: Training in interpersonal communication, professional behavior, and handling different passenger needs—particularly important in urban mobility services.
- Safety and Self-Defense Awareness: Empowerment-focused sessions to help women travel and work with
  confidence, including basic self-defense techniques and situational awareness.

#### **Outcomes and Impact**

This initiative is more than a vocational training program—it is a step toward economic freedom, gender inclusion, and social change. By entering the transportation sector, these women gain:

- Financial Independence: The ability to earn a stable income while supporting their families.
- Enhanced Mobility: Both literal and metaphorical—breaking free from limited roles and expectations.
- Community Impact: Serving as safe and reliable drivers for the public, especially for women, children, and the
  elderly.
- Last-Mile Delivery Potential: Creating new avenues for participation in growing sectors like logistics and e-commerce.

With a dedicated budget exceeding Rs. 40 lakhs, these initiatives addressed a wide spectrum of social, environmental, educational, and health-related challenges. From tree plantations and food drives to awareness campaigns and creative advocacy, our Interactors and Rotaractors translated ideas into impactful action—touching countless lives across communities.

This journey of service has not only strengthened Rotary's outreach but also nurtured the next generation of ethical leaders, problem-solvers, and changemakers. Their commitment and creativity reaffirm our belief that when youth are empowered, communities thrive.



## Unify 2025: A Grand Beginning

## Streetscape by the Little Lords

### A Cleaner, Greener Tomorrow

The Rotary Club of Madras spearheaded a vibrant Streetscape Initiative aimed at promoting environmental preservation and civic responsibility among school students, with an active and enthusiastic response from 20 Interact Clubs.

This dynamic project engaged students in activities such as cleanliness drives, street beautification through mural art, garbage segregation awareness, tree plantation, and road safety education, all focused on revitalizing the neighbourhoods around their schools. The initiative not only aimed to create cleaner, greener public spaces but also to nurture a sense of ownership and accountability among the youth toward their local environments.

The initiative was strongly supported by 10 Rotaract Clubs, all operating under the umbrella of the Rotary Club of Madras. To facilitate the execution of activities, RCM supplied key resources such as clean-up kits, wall paints, informative signages, garbage segregation bins, and tree saplings, empowering the youth to take ownership of their surroundings and lead impactful change.

What made this initiative truly impactful was the way students extended their efforts beyond the school premises. From planting saplings in their own neighbourhoods to transforming public walls into vibrant canvases of environmental art, the youth displayed creativity, responsibility, and leadership.

This project stands as a testament to the belief that when youth lead, communities transform. By fostering environmental consciousness at an early age, the Streetscape Initiative not only beautified urban spaces but also empowered the next generation to become proactive agents of change.

#### **Highlights of Interact Projects**

#### **Environmental Awareness & Sustainability**

- Shri Shankara Vidyashramam, Thiruvanmiyur led a mission toward a greener future through tree plantation drives, ozone awareness sessions, and fundraising for environmental initiatives.
- Chandrodaya Interact Club took environmental advocacy to the next level with their One Million Tree Fundraiser, and their impactful Scrapped Smiles Project converted recycled paper into resources for those in need. Their tree plantation at Agaramthen Lake contributed to ecosystem restoration.
- AMJ School engaged in tree plantation and beautification drives, while also reaching out to the elderly through care home visits.
- Sri Sankara Senior Secondary School, Adyar brightened public spaces with mural painting and participated in extensive green initiatives.

#### **Food Security and No-Waste Advocacy**

- MCTM Interact Club championed a No Food Waste Drive, ensuring surplus meals were redirected to those in need.
- Children's Garden School, Mylapore hosted a food feast, serving parents and teachers with warmth and gratitude, reinforcing the value of sharing.
- Sooryodaya Interact Club carried out food donation drives, including the successful Daan Utsav initiative, which collected 270 kg of rice for underprivileged families.

#### Creative Expression & Media for Social Impact

RCM Youth and Vocational Services organized a Media Competition on the Rotary Four-Way Test, inviting Interactors to explore ethics, empathy, and service through short films.

- The compelling short film "Vidhai" emerged as the winner, powerfully depicted the issue of food waste and hunger.
- A media workshop was conducted by Mr. Ravishankar of Wide-Angle Creations and Rtn. PP Mohan Raman, enriching participants with insights into visual storytelling and ethical messaging in media.

#### Health, Hygiene & Awareness Campaigns

- Sooryodaya Interact Club led a Breast Cancer Awareness campaign, educating communities on early detection and support.
- Vidyamandir, Estancia organized a cancer awareness rally from VME to Zoho Campus, supported by a successful blood donation camp in collaboration with Hindu Mission Hospital.
- Vidyamandir, Mylapore hosted a blood donation camp that saw an impressive 120 donors step forward.

#### **Waste Management & Social Responsibility**

The Sherwood Interact Club launched a newspaper fundraising drive, collecting 26 kg of newspaper to support a charitable cause. They also conducted community cleanups and awareness sessions on waste management.

#### **Exposure & Learning**

Students from Interact Clubs participated in an industrial visit to Kwality Milk Foods Limited, gaining hands-on exposure to manufacturing processes and industry standards.

Their works served as a creative reflection of Rotary values, reaching audiences beyond the classroom!

## **Service in Action**

### The Rotaract Impact

The Rotaract Clubs under the Rotary Club of Madras have consistently demonstrated the power of youth-led service through thoughtful, impactful, and compassionate community engagement. This year, their projects spanned a wide spectrum—ranging from environmental initiatives and cultural empowerment to health access, disaster relief, and social equity. With leadership, creativity, and collaboration at their core, these projects are a true embodiment of Rotary's ideals in action

#### **Highlights of Rotaract Projects**

#### **Environment, Education & Empowerment**

- Rotaract Club of Chennai brought 200 children into nature through Kidz Payanam 2024, organizing immersive learning visits to Guindy National Park and Chetpet Eco Park.
- Their flagship cultural fundraiser, Glitzz'24, not only reached 2,200 beneficiaries but also helped fund girls' sports empowerment programs and set up a library for an underprivileged school.
- Rotaract Club of New College focused on sustainability and learning. Their Green Campus Initiative promoted eco-friendly practices, while Project Shiksha provided educational materials to underserved children.
- Rotaract Club of AVIT launched with ignition, a graphic design workshop that benefited 120 students, including 20 from underprivileged backgrounds.

#### Health, Hunger & Dignity

- In the wake of the Chennai floods, Glitzz Payanam by the Rotaract Club of Chennai distributed 450 food packets to affected areas.
- Rotaract Club of Madras launched CaneAble, gifting 137 walking sticks to individuals with mobility challenges, restoring both independence and dignity. They also raised awareness on autism through community outreach.
- Rotaract Club of GSS Jain College for Women organized Porvai 3.0, distributing 45 blankets to the homeless, and Plastic to Penny, a unique drive that converted waste collection into food aid.
- Rotaract Club of AVIT launched Community Vision, delivering warm, nutritious meals to roadside workers, and ReuseHub, which repurposed surplus materials for families in need.
- Rotaract Club of Jeppiar Engineering College created Nenje Ezhu, giving 30 children with cancer a joyful, laughter-filled day, while Carols of Joy brought music and happiness to children in orphanages.

#### **Health Awareness & Substance Abuse Prevention**

- Rotaract Club of SDNB Vaishnay College for Women launched The Power of No, educating 200 students on drug abuse prevention, while their Breaking the Silence campaign raised critical awareness about sexual abuse and consent.
- Rotaract Club of Loyola College organized Inaivom, a human chain campaign to amplify antimessaging and encourage accountability.
- Rotaract Club of AVIT delivered Detox, an engaging campaign using creative media to highlight the dangers of substance abuse.
- Health for All by the Rotaract Club of New College delivered essential medical camps to marginalized communities, ensuring access to preventive healthcare.

#### **Festive Cheer & Inclusion**

- Diwali Utsav, led by the Rotaract Club of Jeppiar Engineering College, lit up Chennai Central Station with festive lights and joy.
- Shalom by Rotaract Club of Loyola College supported transgender entrepreneurship, promoting inclusion through economic empowerment.
- Pagirvom Amirtham saw the Loyola team serving breakfast to railway workers, recognizing their often-overlooked contributions.
- Rotaract Club of Jeppiar University celebrated Christmas with a Cause, bringing warmth and joy to 80 children in shelter homes.
- Their project Her Rise empowered 30 women through entrepreneurship training, helping them gain confidence and livelihood skills.
- Rotaract Club of AVIT also launched Vision for the Visionless, spreading awareness about eye donation to promote organ donation advocacy.
- Rotaract Club of SDNB Vaishnav College initiated Oru Kai Pidi, a heartfelt program that served warm meals to 30 orphaned children.
