RI President Stephanie Urchick:



Stephanie Urchick is a member of the Rotary Club of McMurray, Pennsylvania, USA. She will serve RI as president in 2024-25. She has been an RI director and Rotary Foundation trustee. She has served RI in numerous capacities, including as training leader, regional Rotary Foundation coordinator, and RI president's re presentative. In addition, Stephanie was a representative and member-at-large to three sessions of the Council on Legislation.

Stephanie has also served as chair of the Rotary Strategic Planning Committee and The Rotary Foundation's Centennial Celebration Committee, as well as a member of various Rotary committees, including the Election Review Committee and Operational Review Committee.

A Rotary member since 1991, Stephanie has participated in a variety of international service projects, including National Immunization Days in India and Nigeria. In Vietnam, she worked with clubs to help build a primary school

and traveled to the Dominican Republic to install water filters. A student of several Slavic languages, she has mentored new Rotary members in Ukraine and coordinated a Rotary Foundation grant for a mammography equipment and a biopsy unit for a hospital in Poland. In its commemorative book, the Rotary Club of Krakow, Poland, noted Stephanie as a key figure for helping the re-birth of Rotary in post-Communist Poland.

Currently, Stephanie is helping to partner clubs and districts in the U.S. with Rotary clubs in Albania, Kosovo, and Ukraine for humanitarian and educational services.

Stephanie's professional background is in the higher education, consulting, and entertainment industries. She received her doctorate degree in Leadership Studies from Indiana University of Pennsylvania and has been recognized and awarded by The Rotary Foundation and numerous community and international organizations.

Timeline of Women in Rotary:



- 1) 1950 An enactment to delete the word "male" from the Standard Rotary Club Constitution is proposed by a Rotary club in India (Ahmedabad) for the Council on Legislation meeting at the 1950 Rotary Convention.
- **2) 1964** The Council on Legislation agenda contains an enactment proposed by a Rotary

club in Ceylon (now Sri Lanka) to permit the admission of women into Rotary clubs. Delegates vote that it be withdrawn. Two other proposals to allow women to be eligible for honorary membership are also withdrawn.

- **3) 1972** As more women begin reaching higher positions in their professions, more clubs begin lobbying for female members. A U.S. Rotary club proposes admitting women into Rotary at the 1972 Council on Legislation.
- **4) 1977** Three separate proposals to admit women into membership are submitted to the Council on Legislation for consideration at the 1977 Rotary Convention. A Brazilian club makes a different proposal to admit women as honorary members. The Rotary Club of Duarte, California, USA, admits women as members in violation of the RI Constitution and Standard Rotary Club Constitution. Because of this violation, the club's membership in Rotary International is terminated in March 1978. (The club was reinstated in September 1986.)
- **5) 1980** The RI Board of Directors and Rotary clubs in India, Sweden, Switzerland, and the United States propose an enactment to remove from the RI and club constitutions and bylaws all references to members as "male persons."
- **6) 1983 86** In a lawsuit filed by the Duarte club, the California Superior Court in 1983 rules in favor of Rotary International, upholding gender-based qualification for membership in California Rotary clubs. In 1986, the California Court of Appeals reverses the lower court & is decision, preventing the enforcement of the provision in California. The California Supreme Court refuses to hear the case, and it is appealed to the U.S. Supreme Court
- 7) 1987 On 4 May, the U.S. Supreme Court rules that Rotary clubs may not exclude women from membership on the basis of gender. Rotary issues a policy statement that any Rotary club in the United States can admit qualified women into membership. The Rotary Club of Marin Sunrise, California (formerly Larkspur Landing), is chartered on 28 May. It becomes the first club after the U.S.

Supreme Court ruling to have women as charter members. Sylvia Whitlock, of the Rotary Club of Duarte, California, becomes the first female Rotary club president.

- **8) 1988** In November, the RI Board of Directors issues a policy statement recognizing the right of Rotary clubs in Canada to admit female members based on a Canadian law similar to that upheld by the U.S. Supreme Court.
- **9) 1989** At its first meeting after the 1987 U.S. Supreme Court decision, the Council on Legislation votes to eliminate the requirement in the RI Constitution that membership in Rotary clubs be limited to men. Women are welcomed into Rotary clubs around the world.
- **10) 1990** As of June, there are about 20,200 female Rotarians worldwide. The Rotarian runs a feature on women in Rotary.
- **11) 1995** In July, eight women become district governors, the first elected to this role: Mimi Altman, Gilda Chirafisi, Janet W. Holland, Reba F. Lovrien, Virginia B. Nordby, Donna J. Rapp, Anne Robertson, and Olive P. Scott.
- **12) 1998** India &I s first female District Governor, Madhura Chatrapathy (Bengaluru) takes over
- **13) 2005** Carolyn E. Jones (Anchorage, Alaska) begins her term as the first woman appointed as trustee of The Rotary Foundation.
- **14) 2008** Catherine Noyer-Riveau (Paris, France) begins her term as the first woman elected to the RI Board of Directors.
- **15) 2012** Elizabeth S. Demaray (Michigan, USA) begins her term as RI treasurer, the first woman to serve in this position.
- **16) 2013** First female Governor of our district (then 3140) Lata Subraidu begins her term.
- **17) 2013** Anne L. Matthews (South Carolina, USA) begins her term as the first woman to serve as RI vice president.
- **18) 2019** Brenda Marie Cressey (Maine, USA but served as DG of a district in California) begins her term as the first woman to serve as vice-chair of The Rotary Foundation. In April-June 2019 she serves as chair of the Foundation, the first woman appointed to this role.
- **19) 2022** Jennifer Jones (Ontario, Canada) begins her term as the first female president of Rotary International.
- **20) 2024** Stephanie Urchick (Pennsylvania, USA) begins her term as the second female president of Rotary International.
- **21) 2024** Seema Joshi begins her term as the first female President of RC of Mulund.

The RMB award receipient Harakchand Savla was introduced by PP Ashwin Malde. This truly noble soul received the Rotary Mulund Bhushan Award from the Chief Guest, Justice Ajay Khanwilkar, amidst resounding applause from the audience.

Shri. Harakchand Savla, Founder and Trustee Jeevan Jyot Cancer Relief Trust comes from humble beginnings. The ideals of selfless service were ingrained in him from a young age, exemplified by his decision to walk to school to save bus fare and contribute to his friend & stuition fees. His renowned free food services for the families of cancer patients gained widespread recognition, highlighted by Shri. Amitabh Bachchan on an episode of KBC. In his address he said, his works also include medical attention for injured animals and birds, funeral services for abandoned bodies, free treatment at old age home and many others.

The Rotary Mulund Youth Icon award recipient, Keval Kakka, is the epitome of grit, perseverance and adventure. He was introduced by PP Dollar Shah. Where others fear to tread, Keval created records. Keval has not only scaled Mount Everest but seven peaks

above 8000 meters. He received the award at the hands of our chief sponsor, Rtn. Hanskumar Shah. In his response, he expressed heartfelt gratitude to his parents and Shri Chandrakant Gogri for their unwavering moral and financial support throughout his adventurous career, despite the considerable skepticism that surrounded his endeavors.

The Chief Guest, Chairperson Lokpal – Justice Ajay Khanwilkar was introduced by Rtn. Nitin Kabbin and felicitated by PRID Ashok Mahajan. Justice Khanwilkar is still strongly rooted in Mulund and studied here till his graduation. On the office of the Lokpal, he commented on the genesis of his office which was first mooted in 1963 and also mentioned the UN had a mandate that all member countries should have an ombudsman. The event also gave Justice Khanwilkar the joyous opportunity to reconnect with his old neighbors, as well as his school and college friends.

Solar Roof Top Project



Rotary Club of Mulund has provided 8 KW Rooftop On-Grid PV Solar Power Plant at Mrs Nalini Yashwant Rao Dode Vidyalaya, Mulund East, Mumbai with funding under District RID 3141 Grant No. DG 2448495.

It was inaugurated on 15 May 2024 at the hands of District Governor Rtn. Arun Bhargava. The funding structure for project funding of USD 5500 under the District Grant

demonstrates a collaborative effort, combining district support of USD 2000, accumulated spendable earnings of USD 1500 of the endowment fund of RCM founding member late Ramnikbhai Z Shah and club member matching contributions of USD 2000. This reflects the Rotary Club's commitment to community service and environmental conservation.

Rotary International's recognition of environmental protection as a crucial area of focus underscores the importance of projects like this one. By reducing operational costs and providing educational resources on sustainable practices, the project will have a lasting impact on the community. It will not only save the beneficiary institution around Rs 1.2 Lakhs per year and around Rs.32 Lakhs over 27 years of PV Solar Panel performance warranty period, but would also serve as an educational tool for students, fostering environmental awareness and responsibility.

Grid-tied PV Solar Power systems are known for their negligible O & M costs and simplicity, making them an ideal choice for schools and educational institutions. They can significantly reduce electricity bills and utilize vacant roof space efficiently without the need for additional land or transmission lines. Moreover, they contribute to reducing transmission and distribution losses as power consumption and generation are collocated.

The Rotary Club of Mulund's dedication to environmental projects is evident in their various initiatives, which aim to strengthen conservation efforts and promote ecological sustainability. Such projects not only benefit the immediate community but also contribute to global efforts to combat environmental challenges like air and water pollution, depletion of natural resources, and global warming.

Overall, the solar power plant project at Dode Vidyalaya is a step towards a greener future, embodying the Rotary Club's mission to create positive change and inspire the next generation.

Ahilyabai Holkar: One of the finest female rulers spread the message of dharma and promoted industrialisation in the 18th century. After the death of her husband and father in law, she ruled Malwa in a wise and sagacious manner. With her polite attitude and humble nature, she fought for women rights throughout her life. She made them pillars of the family and the community.

Women came into social work to overcome life's most difficult challenges namely poverty, discrimination, abuse and addiction.

Savitribai Phule: Today we are qualified with higher education, which is because of Savitribai Phule. Her whole life, she fought for women education.

Born in a dalit family, she got married at the early age of 9 years, to Jyotiba Phule. Both had a Adbhut Jeevan Yatra. A schedule caste girl learning and becoming a teacher and teaching girls was unheard of in those days. People used to throw rotten tomatoes on her and abuse her for this teaching work. She adopted a widow and her child and educated him to be a doctor. During the plague she treated hunderes of people.

Sudha Murthy: A mechanical engineer, was the only girl student in the faculty. For her philanthropy did not mean only charity or donations, it is compassion for the mankind. Sudha ji joined her husband's infosys and did CSR for many years. She has given her help in many natural calamities, done construction of schools, and toilets for girls. Donated for libraries and laboratories. Worked in leprosy colonies, with street children and in old age homes and so on. Her motto is **Bahujan Hitay**, **Bahujan Sukhay**.

Sindhu Tai Sakpal: was an indian social worker. She nurtured over 1500 orphaned children which was like a grand family to her. Honoured with more than 700 awards for her work, compassion empathy, altruism and social concern.

Padma Shri Dr. Sindhutai Sapkal **(maai)** founded an organisation called Bahu Uddeshya Mandal.

We have hundreds of women doing social work with corporate social responsibilities...Rajshree birla, Nita ambani, Awati piramal and many women are doing great work.

Universities have proper degrees in post graduation in the field of social work for women and girls are willingly opting for this subject.

We can overcome problems like, gender disparities in education, violence against women, dowry harassment, healthcare disparities, political under representation, cyber security, on line harassment, human trafficking and so on.
