ROTARY SERVICE WEEK

Eye Care Camp – Utility Centre, **Cuffe Parade | 2nd November**

The Rotary Service Week commenced on 2nd November 2025 with a community-centric Eye Care Camp executed from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM at the Utility Centre, Cuffe Parade, under the leadership of the Rotary Club of Mumbai Downtown Sealand as Host Club, guided by President Rtn. Chandra Prabha Khona and RSW Chairperson Rtn. Dr. Bimal

Malhotra, with strong co-hosting support from Rotary Club of Bombay North. The initiative embodied Rotary's public health mandate by ensuring access to ophthalmic screening for underserved citizens. A committed team of Rotarians, including President Rtn. Chandra Khona, Rtn. Dr. Bimal Malhotra, Rtn. Asgar Lala, Rtn. Shailendra Sharma, Rtn. Nirmala Mittal, and Rtn. Amul Desai, facilitated structured beneficiary and supervised clinical flow while administration. District representation through Rtn. Kaajal Thadani reinforced the involvement of Rotary leadership. A qualified fourmember technical unit, including two ophthalmic technicians, conducted the screenings efficiently, resulting in 87 beneficiaries receiving complete and 81 beneficiaries examinations spectacles immediately, receiving reflecting the tangible corrective impact of the project.

The Rotaract involvement was anchored by Rtr. Krishna Dhakal, Rtr. Arina Pagar, Rtr. Oliana Sen, Rtr. Vedansh Pandey, and Rtr. Jeson Dsouza, whose systematic operational support in registration management, documentation assistance, and beneficiary guidance ensured disciplined service delivery and adherence to medical workflows. The provision of refreshments, including tea, coffee, beverages, and snacks, contributed to patient comfort throughout the session.



Cybercrime Awareness | November 2025

On 3rd November 2025, the Rotary Club of Mumbai Downtown Sealand led a comprehensive Cybercrime Awareness Initiative across three prominent educational venues— Wilson College, Wilson School, and St. Joseph School Dongri—under Host President Rtn. Chandra Prabha Khona and RSW Chairperson Rtn. Dr. Bimal Malhotra, with multi-club collaborations including Rotary Club of Pioneers, Rotary Club of Bombay Central, and Rotary Club of Bombay Harbour. The program strategically addressed the rising vulnerability of youth to digital exploitation and emphasized cyber safety literacy. At Wilson College, distinguished **AFFCONS** cvber-experts Sandeep Desai and Mr. Prashad Kamat delivered detailed guidance on secure online behaviour and cyberlaw compliance to 130+ students, in the presence of District representative Rtn. Sunil Mehta and Rotarians Rtn. Chandra Khona, Rtn. PP Dr. Bimal Malhotra, Rtn. PP Preeti Shah, Rtn. Shailendra Sharma, and Rtn. Dr. Amul Desai and Rtns Nirupama, Sinde, Rupal, Sahil, Pachisiaji, Shefali, Divya from other Co-host Rotary Clubs namely RC of Pioneers, RC of Bombay Central and RC of Bombay Harbour also attended. Operational support was executed by Rtr. Revathi Ramesh and Rtr. Arina Pagar, who handled audience coordination and logistical facilitation.At Wilson School. Rotaractor IPP Hejel Nyaynit,

trained in cyber psychology and safety under Rotary's District programs, disseminated practical knowledge to 200 students of Standards X and XII, in the presence of Rotarians Rtn. Priyana, Rtn. Nirmala Mittal, and Rtn. Tejal, while Rtr. Krishna Dhakal and Rtr. Vedansh Pandey contributed to content distribution and student oversight.

At St. Joseph School Dongri, the awareness drive was strengthened by law-enforcement presence, with DCP Zone 1 Mr. Pravin Munde, ACP Tanvir Shaikh, Mr. Bangar, and PSI Govind Fad, who equipped 200 beneficiaries with essential civic cyber-responsibility protocols, emphasizing preventive vigilance in a rapidly evolving digital environment.

By facilitating cross-institutional knowledge transfer through authoritative sources, the project systematically elevated digital safety preparedness and reinforced Rotary's service role in youth empowerment.

Blood Donation Drive | 4 November 2025

The Blood Donation Drive on 4th November 2025, conducted under Rotary Service Week leadership of President Rtn. Chandra Prabha Khona and Chairperson Rtn. Dr. Bimal Malhotra. emphasized lifesaving contribution and community health resilience through dual-venue hosted operations, collaboratively supported by Rotary Club of Mumbai 25, Rotary Club of Bombay Central, Rotary Club of Bombay Harbour, and partnered Rotaract Clubs including Rotaract Club of Medicrew, Rotaract Club of Wilson College, and Rotaract Club of Navneet College (proposed). collected 30 units of blood with the support and coordination with the Rotoractors of the Rotaract Club of Medicrew. 30 units of blood was collected with Beneficiaries 90.

At the Sea Flama venue in Dosti Flamingoes, Sewri, Our club members, Rtn. Rajesh Shah and Rtn. Tejal Shah, arranged the banquet hall at no cost and ensured the availability of essential infrastructure ,exclusive Rotaractor deployment ensured operational excellence, where Rtr. Krishna Dhakal. Rtr. Revathi Ramesh. and Rtr. Arina Pagar facilitated donor registration, eligibility medical coordination. emergency support preparedness. and motivation participants, demonstrating practical

service discipline aligned with clinical requirements. The venue received structural support from Mr. Rajen Ghag and Manager Mr. Ganesh, complemented by oversight Rotarians President Rtn. Chandra Khona, Rtn. Dr. Amul Desai, and Rtn. Rajesh Shah, and Rtn. Asit Mehta from Rotary Club of Mumbai central who ensured infrastructure adequacy and dignified donor engagement. our club 9 Rotarians from co host clubs, rotractors 10 staff members Breach Candy Hospital's medical managed the procedural aspects of blood collection with compliance to safety parameters, reflecting Rotary's commitment to medical integrity while volunteers facilitated post-donation care. Although some participants were deferred due to medical limitations such as low hemoglobin levels, active mobilization led to a successful donation outcome, demonstrating the alignment with project's national health needs and emergency medical reserves. 14 units of blood was collected Beneficiaries 42. Refreshments were offered to all donors and medical staff, reinforcing appreciation towards humanitarian contribution.

This initiative strengthened the spirit of voluntary service among youth partners while establishing Rotary's continued role as a reliable contributor to lifesaving blood resources in the city.

Breast & Cervical Cancer Screening | 5 November 2025

On 5th November 2025, the Rotary Club of Mumbai Downtown Sealand organized a vital Breast, Cervical and Oral Cavity Cancer Screening Camp at Palsai Village, Wada, under the leadership of IPP Dr. Arun Sawant and President Rtn. Chandra Prabha Khona, with co-hosting support from the Rotary Club of Wada. The initiative focused on early detection among rural women with limited access to preventive healthcare services. A highly skilled team of doctors and social workers from Tata Memorial Hospital, Parel, led by Vasundhara Kulkarni, conducted thorough medical screenings from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM, examining around 100 women for early signs of cancer.

Rotarians ensured systematic coordination, documentation and support beneficiaries, maintaining complete dignity and privacy. Local media Lokmat covered initiative, recognizing Rotary's commitment to impactful community health service. To ease logistics, IPP Dr. Arun Sawant arranged overnight stay for the medical team. The project strengthened Rotary's mission to advance women's health awareness and promote timely cancer screening in underserved communities.

Specially-Abled Support Initiative | 8 November 2025

The Specially-Abled **Support** Initiative on 8th November 2025 served asa multidimensional empowerment project, led by the Rotary Club of Mumbai Downtown under Sealand President Rtn. Chandra Prabha Khona and RSW Chairperson Rtn. Dr. Bimal Malhotra, conducted across two venues—ADAPT Foundation, Colaba and St. Stephen's School for Deaf Children. and **Aphasic** Prabhadevi, with collaboration from Rotary Club of Bombay North at the latter, aligning with Rotary's mission of equitable access and mobility for children inclusion with disabilities. At ADAPT. Rotarians President Rtn. Chandra Khona, Rtn. PP Preeti Shah, Rtn. PP Dr. Bimal Malhotra, and Rtn. Viraf Dalal 10 *mobility-support* donated wheelchairs to children with physical limitations while also distributing thereby refreshments, fostering independence, caregiver relief, and enhanced functional mobility in daily life.

At St. Stephen's School, a structured educational support activity was implemented wherein drawing competitions and cognitive engagement exercises were conducted for 110 specially-abled children, with Rotaractors — Rtr. Krishna Dhakal, Rtr. Vedansh Pandey, Rtr. Rutuja Salvi, Rtr. Kaushkee Soni, and Rtr.Shamika managing participation distributing drawing protocols, sheets, crayons, geometry kits, chikki, chocolates, and assisting in coordinated prize distribution,

Disaster Management Presentation by Mr. Rajendra Lokhande

On 5th November, our club had the privilege of hosting Mr. Rajendra Lokhande, a renowned expert in disaster management, who delivered a captivating presentation on the subject. Mr. Lokhande's talk was enriched by his personal experiences in disaster management, making it an engaging and informative session. Following are the Key Takeaways from his talk:

- 1. Importance of Preparedness: He emphasized the significance of preparedness in mitigating the impact of disasters. He stressed that preparedness is key to saving lives and reducing damage to infrastructure.
- 2. Challenges in Disaster Management: He discussed the various challenges faced during disaster

- management, including lack of infrastructure, inadequate resources, and communication breakdowns. He emphasized the need for a well-coordinated response effort to overcome these challenges.
- 3. Role of Technology: He highlighted the crucial role of technology in disaster management, including early warning systems, GIS mapping, and mobile applications. He emphasized the potential of technology to enhance disaster preparedness and response.

At the end he recommended to develop a Disaster Management Plan that includes preparedness, response, and recovery strategies. He emphasized the need to build capacity among disaster management teams, including training and capacity-building programs and highlighted the importance of community engagement and participation in disaster management. He stressed that communities are best placed to identify their needs and develop effective response strategies.

Mr. Lokhande's presentation was a valuable learning experience for all attendees. His personal experiences and insights provided a unique perspective on disaster management, highlighting the importance of preparedness, effective planning, and community engagement. The presentation served as a reminder of the need for continued efforts to build

resilience. Overall, his presentation was a resounding success, and we are grateful for the opportunity to host him.
