4th July - Dental Camp at Wilson School

A team of 8 doctors led by Dr. Seema Kadam and 2 staff from Nair Hospital conducted oral check-ups for children. The team demonstrated oral hygiene and brushing techniques according to class. Rotaractors Himanshu, Jyoti, and Sameer managed registration, and Santosh offered consistent support.



7th July — Handwriting Competition at Hume High School

A handwriting competition was held at Hume High School, Mumbai, under the Community Service (Non-Medical) avenue. Organized by Dr. Bimal Malhotra, the project aimed to improve student writing skills.



8th July — Good Touch Bad Touch Awareness at Wilson High School

Experts Jagruti Nagda and Pooja Kothari conducted a personal safety session for 300 students at Wilson High School, Mumbai. Sponsored by the Khonas, it was attended by President Chandra Khona and Dr. Bimal Malhotra.



10th July – Driving Training for Tribal Youth in Wada

11th & 12th July – Cancer Screening at Byculla Women's Jail

A two-day cancer screening camp for 100 inmates was held at Byculla Jail for women in collaboration with Tata Cancer Hospital.

This project especially benefited students who may not have access to private tuitions or coaching classes. The orientation and distribution programme was held at the school, where 100 students received the app. The project was efficiently coordinated by Dr. Bimal Malhotra and was attended by President Rtn. Chandra Khona and Dr. Malhotra.



18th July - Self Defence

A Self-Defence Workshop for girls was organised at the Bombay Institute for the Deaf and Mute, Mazagaon to create awareness. Ms. Smita Dave, an expert, spoke on the crimes faced by women and demonstrated practical techniques for personal safety and building confidence in real-world situations. Chocolates were distributed to the children at the end of the program.



18th July - Poetry Recitation

A poetry recitation was organised on 18th July at HUME High School by Rtn. Dr. Bankim Malhotra. The 50 students who participated recited in the languages of English, Marathi and Hindi.

24th July - Breast Cancer Project for Senior Citizens at Residence BDD Chawl.

A Breast Cancer and Oral Cavity Screening
Camp was held for senior residents of BDD
Chawl with support of Ms. Alpa Desai of
Family Welfare Agency. A dedicated team of
doctors and social workers from Tata
Memorial Hospital conducted the screenings
at the Family Welfare Agency, Lower Parel.
The initiative aimed to promote early detection
and was met with active participation from the
community. Follow ups will be conducted for
the eight suspects that were detected.



24th July - Deaddiction of digital and cyberspace

A session on Digital and Cyber De-addiction was conducted at Hume High School for students of Grades 8, 9, and 10. Renowned psychologist Dr. Milan Balkrishnan addressed the students, highlighting the mental health impact of excessive screen use and internet habits.



25th July - Magician Show for Marathi Medium Students at HUME High School.

A magic show was organised for the students of the Marathi medium section of Hume High School. The event was initiated by Dr. Bimal Malhotra, and brought joy to 160 young beneficiaries. Chocolates were distributed to all the children. Members present were Dr. Bimal Malhotra and Rukaiya ji.

- 10. Construction of a Rural School near Silvasa/Vapi to improve educational access
