### CATARACT FREE BHANDUP CAMP

As a part of our ambitious project "Cataract Free Bhandup", cataract screening and eye check up camps are organised on the first Saturday of every month. It is organised at Datta Mandir, S. G. Barve Marg, Near Hotel Gopalashram, Near Mulund Checknaka, Wagle Estate Starting Road, Thane-400604. This is in association with **Billavar Association, Bhandup and Bhaktivedanta Hospital and Research Institute, Mira Road.** 



In the camp held on 6<sup>th</sup> May 2023, **42** beneficiaries were screened, out of whom 18 were selected for operation. They were sent to Bhaktivedanta Hospital at Mira Road on 7<sup>th</sup> May 2023 and were successfully operated.



In the camp held on 3<sup>rd</sup> June 2023, a total of 41 beneficiaries were screened out of which 18 were detected for cataract. They were sent to the Hospital at Mira Road on 4<sup>th</sup> June and were successfully operated.

# Dr. Manjit Singh Arora on "My Role at the Time of Heart Attack"

In our regular club meeting held on Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> May 2023, renowned Doctor from Fortis Hospital Mulund, Dr. Manjit Singh Arora spoke on the topic "My Role at the Time of Heart Attack".

President Uday Shetty called the meeting to order and after the national anthem, welcomed the chief guest and others. PP Narayana shagrithaya gave the Rotary information. President Uday shetty then gave an account of the projects and programs carried out since the last meeting.



Rtn. Rashmin Shah introduced the chief quest Dr. Manjit Singh Arora. Dr. Manjit Singh in his talk illustrated with demonstration as to what to do when a person gets heart attack. He told that time is very important and explained the importance of the "Golden Hour". He also explained the difference between the heart attack and cardiac arrest. In the case of the cardiac arrest the action needs to be immediate whereas in the case of heart attack you get some time to act. A heart attack is when one of the coronary arteries becomes blocked. The heart muscle is robbed of its vital blood supply and, if left untreated, will begin to die because of its not getting enough oxygen. A cardiac arrest is when a person's heart stops pumping blood around their body and they stop breathing normally. Many cardiac arrests in adults happen because of a heart attack. This is because a person who ishaving heart attack may develop a dangerous heart rhythm, which can cause a cardiac arrest.

Dr. Manjit Singh Arora explained as to what is CPR and how to do it effectively.

CPR stands for cardiopulmonary resuscitation. It's when someone gives chestcompressions to a person in cardiac arrest to keep them alive.

When a person is in cardiac arrest their heart stops pumping blood, which means their brain gets no oxygen.

Without PCR the person will die in minutes. CPR keeps the heart pumping bloodaround the body until emergency help arrives.

How to do CPR on an adult?

1. Check for a response. Firmly shake the person's shoulders and ask if they are ok.

2. Call the emergency help number. If the person is umconscious and not breathing, or not breathing normally, start CPR.

3. Start chest compressions. With the heel of your hand in the centre of their chest, press down smoothly and firmly at the rate of 2 per second.

4. It is your choce to give rescue breaths. Hands only CPR is very effective and is the recommended way to give CPR since the covid 9 pandemic. However, you may wish to give rescue breaths to a family member. If you want to give rescue breaths, follow thaese instructions:

\* Give rescue breaths after every thirty chest compressions.

\* Tilt the person's head back gently and lift their chin. \* Pinch their nose.

\* Seal your mouth over theirs and blow hard for a second. Do this twice.

Keep giving CPR until the emergency services arrive, the person regains consciousness or until you are too exhausted to cintinue. If there is somebody else with you, ask them to take turns giving CPR.

Sometimes minor injusries can occur, such as a cracked rib, but you should continue to give CPR to help save their life. A broken rib or other injury can be treated.

Usually it is better to press harder than softer. You are aiming to press down one third of the chest depth( 5 or 6 centimetres). If you press too softly then your compressions won't be efecctive.

Dr. Manjit singh explained the whole process very effectively with live demonstation. Dr. Sharaddha Nate, Rtn. C. R. Ramakrishnan and Rtn. Asha Narang volunteered to help in the demonstration.

Overall it was a very interesting and effective session. **Secretary Jennifer Isaac** made the secretarial announcements and **Rtn. Dr. ShraddhaNate** proposed the formal vote of thanks.
