CATARACT FREE BHANDUP CAMP

As a part of our ambitious project “Cataract Free Bhandup”, cataract screening and eye check up camps are organised on the first Saturday of every month. It is going on from August 2022 regularly. Presently it is being organised at Datta Mandir, S. G. Barve Marg, Near Hotel Gopalashram, Near Mulund Checknaka, Wagle Estate Starting Road, Thane-400604. So far we have screened more than 800 persons and carried out more than 250 cataract surgeries. This is in association with **Bhaktivedanta Hospital and Research Institute, Mira Road and Billawar Association, Bhandup.**

In the cataract screening and surgery camp held on 2nd September **2023**, 66 beneficiaries were screened out of whom 37 were detected to have cataract. They were sent to Bhaktivedanta Hospital at Mira Road on 3rd September 2023 and surgery was successfully carried out.

In the cataract screening and surgery camp held on 7th October **2023**, 83 beneficiaries were screened out of whom 36 were detected to have cataract. They were sent to Bhaktivedanta Hospital at Mira Road on 8th October 2023 and surgery was successfully carried out. Also at the camp on 7th October 2023, spectacles were donated to 21 needy patients.

Rtn. MANISH GYANI on “KNOW YOUR RCC”.

In our club meeting held on Tuesday 5th September 2023, Rtn. PP Manish Gyani, a senior member of Rotary Club of Borivali spoke on the topic “Know Your RCC”. Rtn. Manish is District Coordinator for RCC this year and also is Avenue Chair Rotary Foundation 2. He alongwith his wife Mona is a Level 4 Major Donor.

Our club has formed 7 RCCs during the Rotary year 2022-23. The charters of these RCCS were handed over to the respective Presidents of the RCCS in the hands of chief guest Rtn. Manish Gyani.

Rtn. Manish Gyani made an excellent presentation on Rotary Community Corps. He started by saying that the biggest challenge in Rotary is Public Image. What is the solution? We have to find a good way to connect with our community. The various Rotary programs available for this purpose are Interact, New Generations service exchange(NGSE), Rotary Youth Exchange(RYE), Rotary Youth Leadership Awards(RYLA), Rotary Friendship Exchange(RFE), Global Networking Groups – Rotary Fellowships(RF), Global Networking Groups – Rotary Action Groups (RAG) and Rotary Community Corps (RCC).

What are Rotary Community Corps?

* Rotary Community Corps(RCCs) are teams of non Rotarians who work in partnership with Rotary clubs to improve their communities.

* Membership in an RCC is open to any adult in the community who shares Rotary's commitment to service but is not a Rotary member.

* Each RCC is sponsored by a Rotary club. RCCS are active everywhere Rotary is present: in urban and rural areas.

* RCCs are formed to help address community needs through service, whether the needs are short term or ongoing.

* Conceived as Rotary Village Corps (RVCs) during the term of RI President A. T. Caparas in the late 1980s.

* There are more than 12,000 RCCS active in 107 countries, 264 Districts. India has the second highest number of active RCCS with 2,200 corps. Brazil is in the third place with 500 RCCs, followed by Egypt with 400, and Bangladesh with 300.

* RID 3141 has 208 active RCCs reported as of 30th June 2023.

Program Goals

* Promote sustainable solutions to community needs.

* Support community members in addressing community needs while recognizing their unique ability to identify pressing concerns and appropriate solutions.

* Develop partnerships between Rotarians and non-Rotarians in a joint effort to strengthen the community.

* Enhanced awareness about Rotary in the community.

* Deepened club's relationship with local community members.

* Gives club the ability to take on more service projects.

* 48% of RCCs are located in urban areas.

* 74% of RCCs meet at least once in a month.

* 42% RCCs mostly have female members, while 38% have male majority and 20% have members equally male and female.

* 46% of the RCC members are between the age group of 18 and 40.
