This was no easy task, but our dedicated members made it look like a walk in the park.


Attached are some images from the event, just look at the smile and happiness on the faces of these students. These are the most priceless moments of life.


Proud to be a part of this wonderful club. The only thing on our minds is to give to the lesser privileged.










HENTREPRENEUR


