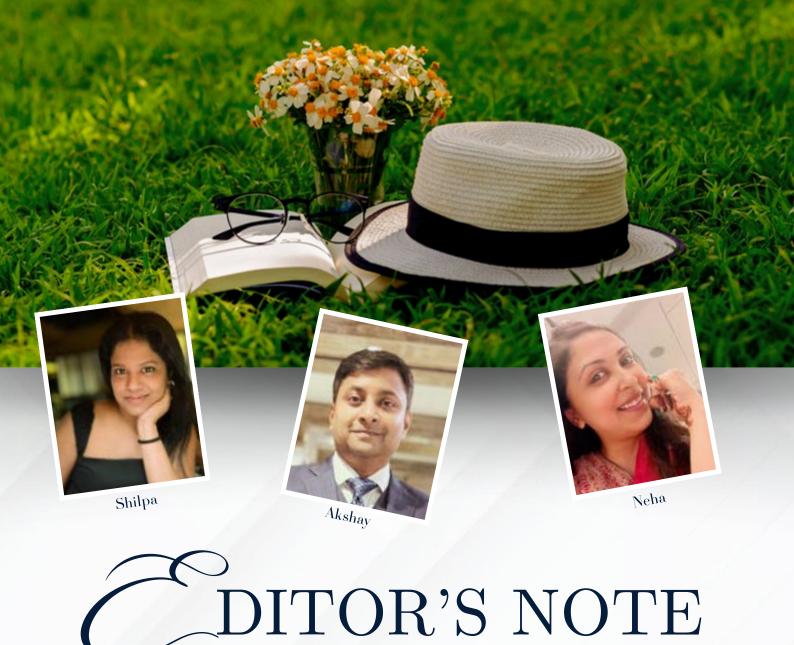

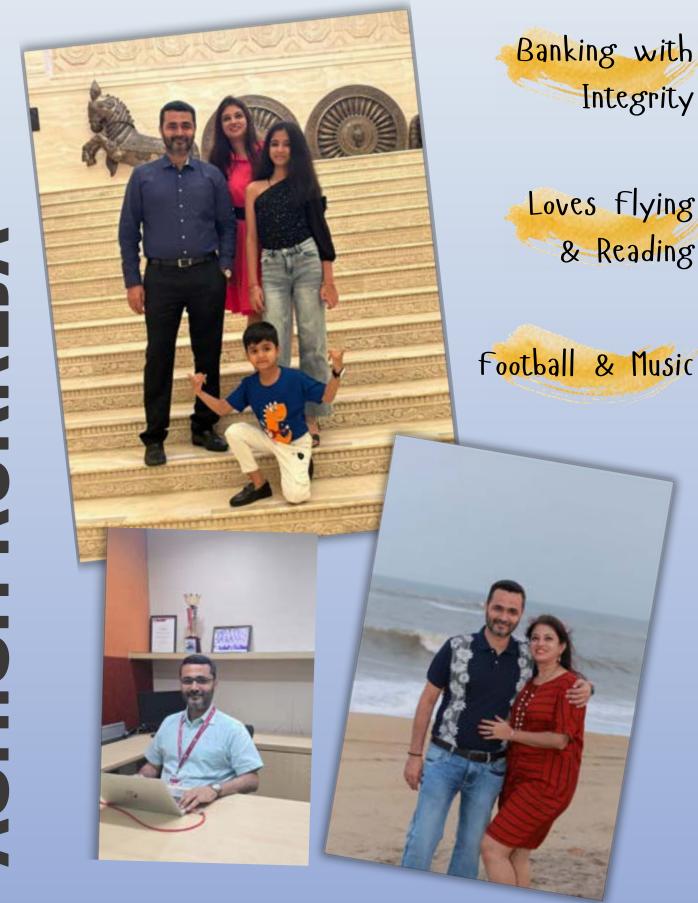
"August whispers of change..."

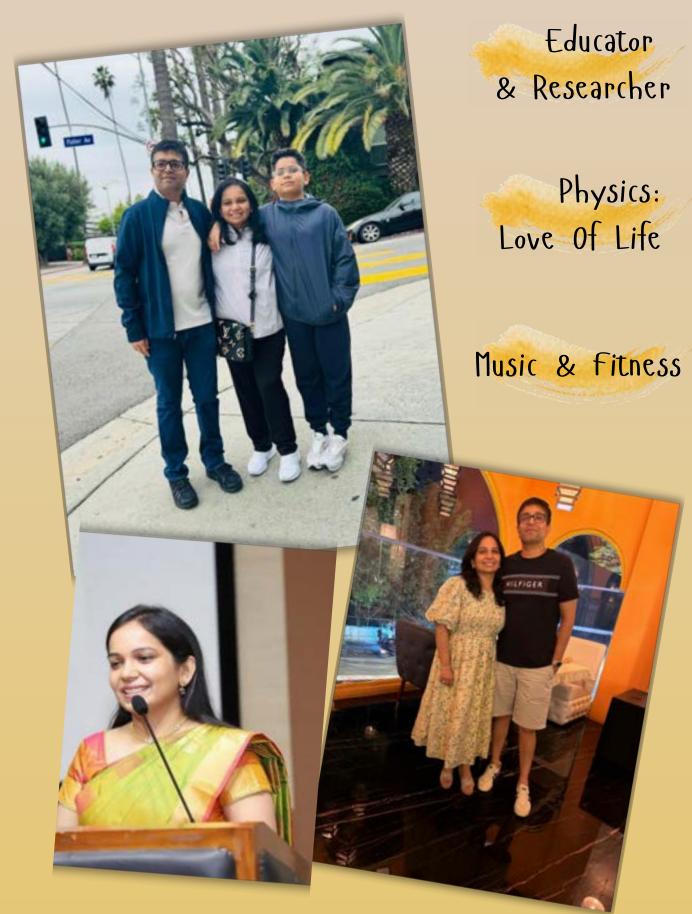

I went on to pursue my **Postgraduate degree at the University of Manchester**, UK, an experience that broadened both my academic and personal horizons. Driven by a passion for meaningful research, I completed my PhD in Physics, working on gold nanoparticles for water purification—a project that combined advanced science with environmental impact. Along the way, I presented papers at several national and international conferences and published research in peer-reviewed journals.

I spent eight enriching years teaching Undergraduate Physics at Stella Maris College—an experience that shaped my core teaching philosophy. I had the opportunity to teach a wide range of subjects, including Nuclear Physics, Classical Mechanics, Thermodynamics, Optics, Electromagnetism, and Quantum Physics.

**Continued Commitment to Women's Health: Free Cancer Screening Camp at** Sringeri Sharada Equitas Hospital





The Rotary Club of Madras Magnum in association with Sringeri Sharada Equitas Hospital continued its free cancer screening initiative into July, organizing more camps which aim to expand access to early detection of oral, breast, and cervical cancers, especially among women of the underprivileged communities.

In July alone, over **60 residents of Egmore** availed the services, which included **free 10 mammograms**, **24 HPV DNA tests**, and vital health consultations. The medical team ensured thorough screenings and provided personalized health guidance to participants, with a special focus on women's wellness and preventive care.

This life-saving outreach was made possible through strong collaborations with service-driven organizations like the Rotary Club of Madras Magnum, the Raj Charitable Foundation, the Indian Cancer Society, and The Rotary Cancer and Research Foundation.

This initiative helps bridging the healthcare gaps and promoting awareness towards various health issues.
