
## A Night To Remember!!!

An award earned by clubs that accomplish a number of goals set by the RI president.

## Rotary International Convention

The annual gathering held in a different world city each year to celebrate Rotary's accomplishments, hear updates and inspiring stories, and learn more about Rotary.

A leadership development program for students or young adults that is organized by a club, a district, or multiple districts.

## The Rotary Foundation (TRF)

Rotarians and friends of Rotary support the Foundation's work through voluntary contributions. The Foundation works to end polio, funds projects through grants, and takes on other global initiatives.

# EXPERT TALK



**“You will always be your child’s favourite toy”**

**Yes, Children may not say it. But their parents are always going to be the one they want to go to for anything and everything. All they want is your time. So when they come to you, asking for 10 minutes of your time, keep that phone away and be with them. Think of the endless hours that you have spend scrolling on social media. \*Your children deserve more of your time.\***

**In today’s world, technology has replaced everything. Instead of playing outdoors and also playing with board games indoors, children play only with their mobile phone and other gadgets. That’s because they don’t have anything else to do. As a parent, if you could give your child importance, spend time talking to him and most importantly, \*understanding their view point.\***

**It’s very easy as parents to think that we are adults, we know better and our child is wrong, but they also have their view point. When parents don’t believe in their child, the child loses his own sense of belief and then finds it hard to be confident in anything he does. Growing up, my mom always praised me in everything I did, even if I did it badly. She used to praise me in front of others even when I had not done something great. I used to get embarrassed then wondering why my mom is praising me in front of so many people, but today when I look back, it’s my mother’s belief in me that has made me who I am and hence I’m a very strong believer of our belief in our children. Stand up for them and support them in anything that they do. That day won’t be far enough when they will be so big that they may not need you anymore.**

**One of the most important elements of Conscious Parenting is \*Pause\* which means taking a pause each time you feel the need to react to your child. Children do test your patience level, but if you can choose to take a pause and respond to certain situations instead of instantly reacting, things automatically change. That’s why I call it the \*MAGICAL PAUSE\*. When we are able to practise this, we evolve to a whole new level..**

**Our children are here to teach us how to live the best version of ourselves, how not to be triggered by anything for which they test us and eventually evolve.**

**But the question is- are you willing to look at them as teachers and learn from them or are you amongst those that you need to teach your kids ?**




