Magic of Miyawaki.



Dear Rotarians, Anns & Annets Be A Part of MAGIC of MIYAWAKI. Greetings for the New Rotary year 24-25.

Amongst all the issues bothering the mankind such as health, education, hunger, wars etc; climate change may be the most paramount which adds to all other issues.

As a responsible habitat of the Mother Earth and also a True Rotarian, let us do our bit to contribute for a better tomorrow in a small way.

I propose a very doable project with the help of each of our members, families and their communities.

Let each of us identify a 300 sq ft/ 30 sq m (e.g. 15*20 ft or 10*30 ft) piece of land in our backyard of residence, colony, neighbourhood, commercial or industrial business facility, public utility places, educational institutes etc which are not planned to be used in the longest future for any purpose.

In such a piece of land, we can plant 100 trees of different varieties to create a micro forest (called Miyawaki Urban Forest) to promote habitat for species, butterflies, birds, microorganisms etc; reduce temperatures in the surroundings, lower the external noise, create fresh environment.

The cost of creating such a micro forest may be about Rs. 40,000 including plants, land and soil preparations.

Arranging water resource and protection boundary etc to be provided by the owner of the land.

Our club would volunteer to provide all the process and resources information and involve our members and families to plant the trees by their own hands.

I am sure everyone of you would come forward to accept this noble opportunity for a sense of community work in your own backyard, make your family proud of their contribution, give opportunity to your children to learn and participate. An investment whose returns are uncountable.

The project not only honors the memory of Shree Shridhar Babasaheb Pawar but also sets a precedent for future environmental initiatives in Pimpalgaon Kauda.

Rotary Club of Ahmednagar Midtown collaborated with Dr. Rahul Pawar, Senior Medical Officer of Anand Rishi Ji Hospital and a native of Pimpalgaon Kauda, undertook the creation of a Miyawaki Forest in the school premises of Shri Kaudeshwar Vidyalaya, Pimpalgaon Kauda, Taluka - Nagar, District - Ahmednagar 414005. This initiative was in memory of his late father, Shree Shridhar Babasaheb Pawar, on the occasion of his 5th death anniversary.

420 trees were planted, covering an area of approximately 1600 square feet in the school premises. The students and the residents along with the Rotary Club of Ahmednagar Midtown members were informed about the concept of Miyawaki and the plantation process in detail. The school management agreed to maintain the forest with the help of its students. Village residents and students actively participated in the project, learning about the Miyawaki method and the importance of afforestation.

A heartfelt thank you to all participants for their dedication and hard work in making this plantation drive a memorable and impactful event.
