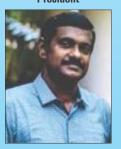

On August 21, 2024 there was a shocking revealation by PRID Rtn Ashok Mahajan that Polio virus has resurfaced in India as a polio case was reported from Tikrikilla in West Garo Ditsrict, Meghalaya. It is also reported that low vaccination rate in the North-Eastern States and Uttar Pradesh was found to be the cause. It is a matter of great concern for all of us. We have been beating the drums for more than 10 years that due to the concerted efforts of the Rotarians, India was declared Polio-free in the year 2014. Till recently only in the coutnries Pakistan and Afganistan polio cases were reported. Rotary in association with WHO has been working hard focussing in these two coutnries in our attempt to eradicate Polio from the face of earth. At this juncture, the polio case reported in India gives us great concern. Let us hope that this is only an isolated case and soon we will become polio free.

It was heartening to note that the President honoured all the Rotarian Teachers in the regular meeting held on 4th September, on the eve of Teacher's day.

When we look at the genesis of the Teacher's day, it is reported that when Dr S Radhakrishnan, the great teacher India has produced, was approached by his students who wanted to celebrate his birthday, he proposed that instead of a personal celebration, the day should be dedicated to honouring teachers across the coutnry. This idea was embraced, leading to the establishment of September 5 as Teachers' Day in India. Let us give back by our show of allegiance to our teachers by honouring them what ever way possible.

POLIO CASES RESURFACES IN INDIA

Reminds us of the vulnerability we still face despite our collective efforts to eradicate polio- says PRID Ashok Mahajan



Dear Rotary Leaders,

It is with deep concern that I write to you regarding the recent polio case reported in Meghalaya. On August 21, 2024, India woke up a shocking news about a polio case reported from Tikrikilla in West Garo District, Meghalaya. More alarming was the subsequent revelation published on August 29, 2024, of low vaccination levels of 75% and below in the States of Nagaland, Meghalaya, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Tripura and Uttar Pradesh.

The World Health Organisation, which certified India as Polio-free country in 2014, has said that, "Circulating vaccine-derived polio virus (CVDPV) occur in places where routine immunisation or supplementary immunisation activities are poorly conducted. Circulating VDPV can impact the entire community." This reminds us of the vulnerability we still face despite our collective efforts to eradicate polio. Based on this news, The International PolioPlus Committee of TRF has advised the members of the INPPC to collaborate with the District Leaders in India and health

authorities. The INPPC will need your assistance to intensify awareness campaigns and ensure that vaccination programs reach every corner of our nation. Our commitment to eradicating polio is not just about numbers but about safeguarding the health and future of our children.

As an organization that has played a pivotal role in the global fight against polio, you must urgently address these developments. As Rotary members, we have long championed the cause of a polio-free India. The resurgence of polio, even in isolated cases, underscores the critical need for sustained vigilance and enhanced efforts in immunisation. Together, let us reaffirm our dedication to ensuring that every child is protected against this preventable disease.
