The unemployed rural women may not have access or awareness on the opportunities and organisations like Rotary has a greater role to play.

Our club is launching a novel project "UYARE- KAYARILOODE", a training programme for 2 months in the manufacture of value-added products out of coir by the Coir Board in association with the Alappuzha Coir Cluster Development Society. This is a stipendiary programme with potential for self-employment opportunities on successful completion of the training. Rtn Dr Sethu Ravi, Co-Chair, Uyare and Prez Kurian are striving hard to identify the trainees and commence the training on 3rd October. Wishing good luck to the team.











THE ROTARY FOUNDATION (INDIA) BAGS CSR AWARD

GIFT OF WATER – KUTTANAD WATER SUPPLY PROJECT UNDER GLOBAL GRANT



As the Assistant Governor of Zone 26 (2023-24), I was on the lookout for a common project involving all the four Clubs in the Zone. It was then that the present DGE Tina Antony offered to help. PDG Scaria Jose Kattoor, the limb man of Rotary, who is having wide connections with International Clubs introduced us to Rtn. Jeff of Rotary Club of Crabtree, USA. Also RC

Changanacherry, PDG Scaria's Club assured their participation to the project. DGE Tina Antony's RC Aroor Satellite Ctiy also offered their support. Our Club was given the status of host club with me as the Primary Contact and Rtn. Jose Arathumapally and Rtn. John V George were assigned the role of secondary contact. The strong support of DGE Tina Antony and PDG Scaria Jose Kattoor helped to make the dream come true.

Water Sanitation and Hygiene is one of the focus areas of Rotary. The project aims to provide clean drinking water to the Kuttanad region



in Alleppey district, which, despite being surrounded by vast stretches of water, faces severe scarctiy of potable water. Kuttanad, renowned for its picturesque backwaters, has the lowest altitude in India, where farming

is conducted 1 to 2 meters below sea level. However, groundwater remains the only viable source of drinking water, as surface water in canals, ponds, and wells is heavily contaminated. The contamination stems from pesticide and fertilizer runoff from farms, as well as raw sewage from houses and houseboats being dumped into the waterways.

Currently, residents rely on private suppliers for drinking water, which is transported by tanker trucks. This water is sold at exorbitant rates, placing a significant financial burden on low-income families, who are forced to spend a large portion of their income on this basic necesstiy. This project aims to alleviate this crisis by providing safe drinking water in the most affected areas of Kuttanad. The plan involves sourcing water by drilling tubewells, pumping the groundwater, and treating it to meet standards for human consumption. The initiative will benefit around 9,000 households, including schoolchildren, offering them a

reliable and affordable supply of clean water. We have identified four locations in Kuttanad namely Neelamperoor, Kandankary and two in Champakulam for the project. In Neelamperoor and Kandankary we will be drilling tubewells and in Champakulam openwell



source is available. Drilling of tubewell at Neelamperoor was inaugurated by DGE Tina Antony on Chingam 1st (17th August) 2024. Rev. Fr. Jiji Punnoose, Vicar of Neelamperoor Knanaya Church blessed the function. PDG Scaria Jose Kattoor felicitated. Rtns. President John Kurian, PAG K. Cherian, Past Zonal Secretary Kumaraswamy Pillai, John V George and Jijo Chacko attended the function from our Club and representatives from other partner clubs including president of E Club, Dubai Rtn. Roy Sebastian attended. Rev.Fr. John Pathalil, Vicar, St. Joseph's Church, Kandankery inaugurated the drilling of tubewell at Kandankary on 26th September. President Rtn. John Kurian, Secretary Rtn. T.S. Sujith, Rtns. John V George, Lakshmi Gopakumar and Sethu Ravi along with me attended the function at Kandankary. We propose to complete the project by end



November 2024. Major Donor Rtn. Prof. S Gopinathan Nair and Rtn. Princy Sebastian made

contribution

s of USD 1000 each for our share of Global Grant and I am grateful to them for the same. E Club of Kerala Global and RC Changanacherry Greater also made their contributions to become a partner to the project. The total cost of the project is USD41244/- equivalent to INR 34.24 lakhs.

This project will bring immense relief to the people of Kuttanad, ensuring access to a fundamental resource that is currently scarce and costly. Rtn.PAG K. Cherian
