# Rotary Institute Kochi 2024- a curtain raiser



Each year, past, present, and incoming district and senior leaders attend Rotary institutes to share information, build connections, and exchange ideas about Rotary International and The Rotary Foundation. The institutes usually meet for three to five days, and the program includes:

- An update on The Rotary Foundation and its programs
- A report on our polio eradication efforts
- A five-year forecast presented by a director or other Board representative
- An open forum where participants can make recommendations to the Board
- Local and international speakers sharing information on relevant topics
- A chance to network, reconnect with friends, and find inspiration for continuing your service and leadership in your community
- Entertainment and social outings

During Council on Legislation years, Rotary institutes also include a session for Council representatives and alternates and a general session for discussing Council proposals.

The RI president designates one or more conveners to organize each institute and serve as his or her representative there. Past Rotary officers often participate as speakers, panelists, discussion leaders, and institute committee members.



# Women in Rotary -Rtn R Krishnan

Tracing back, it is understood that Mrs. Sumitra Raghuvaran of Rotary club of Thuckalay was the First Lady Rotarian of Dist 321/3210. She was one of the prominent lady Rotarians in the Dist. then, with aspirations to become DG. In those times, when lady Rotarians were far and few, she was an active Rotarian who came to the forefront in Rotary activities. Probably the male dominance and her professional commitment was further compounded by the system of rotation for DG.

professional commitment was further compounded by the system of rotation for DG post(alternating between TN and Kerala)that was then prevalent and it robbed away her chance of making it to the top in the District. RC TVM Midcity, (sponsored by RC of TVM Central) was chartered with a lady president, Dr. T Santhakumari Amma. She was a doctor by profession and perhaps this is the first club that got chartered with a woman Rotarian at the helm of affairs, while the







Dist. was undivided. Yet another prominent club in those times where ladies were ushered in as Rotarians was our own sponsored club,RC of Shertallai.It was a sight and treat to watch the trio Rosy John, Tina Antoney and Dr.Sreedevi Rajan walk together in Rotary meetings and Dist functions. They were very active and supported the club well.Little did we realise then that one will go on to be the First Lady of the District and another to lead the District. By the time Dist 3211 was carved out, there were a few lady Rotarians already in various clubs, even though the numbers were insignificant. It must be said to the credit of the ladies of our District that they were so active in Innerwheel, probably they did not care to join Rotary. They were lending support to the Rotarians from within. It was not as if they were not active. They participated in family meetings and even exhibited their organisational skills as Rotary Anns. Yet another feature of yesteryears was that the ladies participated in events like Dist Conferences and Dist Assemblies. A large turn out of families could be seen in those days. For our ladies then, the priority was family and supporting the Rotarians. They probably took a back seat in coming forward to accept the role of a Rotarian and to go out and render service the way men used to do. It would be out of place at this juncture if I do not mention the name of Mrs. Betty Karan, who probably as the wife of PDG Ravi had thorough knowledge of Rotary and all the Rotary luminaries of not only our District, but world over. She would play perfect host along with PDG. Ravi for the ever so many Rotary dignitaries who used to visit them constantly. Her support as a Rotary Ann to Ravi and our club is phenomenal. Even today the legacy is maintained and despite her extraordinary capabilities, she did not join Rotary, until RC Alleppey made her a Hon. member considering her contributions to RI. Hats off to this wonderful lady.
