### Importance of attendance in Rotary meetings

"Attendance percentage is the health indicator of the club. Attendance is the bulwark of Rotary"



"On the foundation of attendance, rest all things in the attainment of Rotary's objectives. The chronic absentee doesn't give to Rotary. He receives nothing from Rotary. He is a burden to the club, a faulty cog on the wheel. He is neither fair to his club nor to himself." strong words from RI President (1919-20) Albert S Adams. These quotes give an idea of the importance Rotary used to attach to attendance in club meetings in yesteryears. But to the millennial members of Rotary clubs the importance of attendance is not that serious.

A cross section of the society meeting regularly with a definite purpose or cause is definitely to the advantage of each member. The acquaintance gradually grows to friendships and friendships brings in a one family feeling in Rotarians and their families. And once this is achieved, the Rotarians start attending all the meetings religiously and participate in all club projects.

#### Club's Duty

When a new member joins the club, he/she accepts the responsibility of attending the meetings of the club regularly and engage in the club's service projects and other events and projects. That does not and should not mean that the club's responsibility ends there. The new member should be groomed to become a true Rotarian, by immediately allocating some responsibility to him/her so as to ensure his/her participation and by showing keen interest on the new inductee by other Rotarians. On the contrary, if no

body is bothered when the new member is missing in the meetings due to some reason or other, he/she will get a feeling that his/her attendance is not important to others and this will prompt the member to give lesser priority to rotary. If the nonchalant attitude of President and other fellow Rotarians continue, the new member's interest and priority for Rotary will slowly erode and culminate in the abandonment of the Club.

For good attendance in the club, the President/Rotarians/Committee concerned with fellowship and attendance should be alert and active always. If there is good programmes and fellowship half the job is done. Club bulletin also can stimulate interest in Rotarians to attend the meetings.

#### **Meetings- Most Important**

The manner in which meeting is conducted is another factor. From invocation to vote of thanks, the meeting should be lively without any drag. Meetings should result in value addition also. As far as possible, everything should be over in an hour's time. Guest speaker may be asked to stick to the maximum time stipulation (usually twenty minutes).

Another important thing is that meetings should start on time. Clubs which are not strict in timings may find it difficult to change all on a sudden. But if a few meetings are started on time, the initial inertia could be overcome. Even those members who may criticise the strict timings will in due course start appreciating the punctuality.

Rotary used to hail 100% attendance (perfect attendance) records. The number of years of perfect attendance used to be a permanent item in the resumes of dedicated Rotarians. For eg., the RI publication Paul Harris and his Successors, you can see RI President (1960-61) Edd McLaughlin holding fifty years of perfect attendance. But one thing is to be remembered. Attendance is not for attendance's sake. Attendance without participation is un Rotary. 100% attendance with 100% participation in club activities was not uncommon thing in Rotary.



Personal calls from the President of the club or attendance committee Chairman for persuading a member for make up of the missed meeting is always better than the impersonal written reminders or warnings or WhatsApp messages.

Family get together is important from the club's attendance point of view also. Regularly monthly get together is preferable to crowding the same in certain months and skipping it in certain other months. If the first lady of the club can personally invite all ladies for such meetings, there is nothing like that. It is a good practice to recognise Rotarians and their family members who have reaped one or the other achievements, at these meetings. Some clubs select the lucky partner, lucky children and the lucky couple through lots and present them with gifts. In any case the invisible role played by the partners in the club's good attendance should not be underestimated. Recognise their contribution whenever there is an occasion for doing so.

The meaning of attendance in Rotary is not confined to attending club meetings alone. The Club Administration should encourage and ensure members' attendance in district functions and club projects. Special emphasis should be laid on district conference, an ideal place for widening the friendship and for updating Rotary information. International Convention should also be targeted.

# Rotary Project to provide 6,600 solar eclipse glasses to students in Ohio.

In anticipation of the total solar eclipse on April 8, 2024, the Rotary Club of Bucyrus, Ohio, undertook a project to provide 6,600 solar eclipse glasses to students across Crawford County.

The initiative began in late 2022 when Rotarian and high school science teacher Julie Rexroad proposed supplying every student in the county with protective eyewear for the event. The club approved a budget of \$4,300 for the purchase. Members then designed, ordered, stored, and eventually delivered the glasses, which were sourced from a company recommended by a local astronomy club.

In the fall of 2023, school districts were contacted to determine the number of glasses needed for their students. Upon receiving the glasses, Rexroad's Science Club and Interact Club members sorted them for each school. On January 31, 2024, Rotary members, including Rexroad and Tami Tima-Burk, delivered the glasses to schools in Bucyrus, Buckeye Central, Colonel Crawford, Crestline, Galion, Galion St. Joe's,

Wayside Christian, and Wynford.

This effort ensured that students could safely experience the rare celestial event, as Crawford County was located in the path of totality. Rexroad emphasized the significance of the occasion, stating, "This is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for most of us in our area. Rotary is so

glad that we were able to give all Crawford County schools the solar eclipse glasses for their students."

While specific photos of the distribution process are not available in the provided sources, the Bucyrus Telegraph-Forum featured an article on February 5, 2024, highlighting the project and its impact on local schools.

This initiative is an example of Rotary's commitment to supporting education and community engagement, providing students with the tools to safely observe and learn from astronomical events.

The project of providing 6,600 solar eclipse glasses to students in Ohio was sanctioned under Rotary's Education and Community Service initiatives. Specific details about its alignment with Rotary's global projects were not mentioned in the sources, but it likely falls under Rotary's "Basic Education and Literacy" area of focus, as it supports learning and student engagement through a scientific event.

**Financial Implications**: The total financial implications of the project was \$4,300, which covered the cost of designing, purchasing, storing, and distributing the solar eclipse glasses.

Thanks to the foresight of the Rotary Club of Bucyrus, Ohio, students were outfitted with 6,600 pairs of glasses for the 8 April total solar eclipse. In late 2022, with the eclipse still nearly two years away, "we talked about how neat it would be to get solar eclipse glasses for every school in our county for their students for the big event," says Julie Rexroad, a club member, Interact club adviser, and science teacher at Wynford Local Schools. Once the club approved the \$4,300 purchase, members designed, ordered, stored, and eventually delivered the glasses, purchased online from a company recommended by a local astronomy club. "Our location in Ohio is in the totality zone, and it is a once-in-a-lifetime event for most," Rexroad says. For those missing out, northern Ohio can always look forward to 2099.


