



Raising \$550,000 through the Zoo of love stuffed annimals to fight polio in Colombia



Sonia Uribe and her husband, Alberto Londoño, created a stuffed animal collection called El Zoo del Amor, or the Zoo of Love, to comfort seriously ill children and raise money for polio eradication. Sales of Anna the giraffe, Lucas the tiger, and other animals — each wearing a shirt with Rotary and End Polio Now logos — have raised about \$550,000 since their introduction in 2018. In addition to giving the animals to sick children, Rotarians carry them on their travels and snap photos of them at iconic

landmarks. "All these animals have travelled, being ambassadors of the Rotary brand," says Uribe, a member of the Rotary Club of Nuevo Medellín and, like Londoño, a past governor of District 4271. Londoño is a member of the Rotary Club of Medellín Nutibara. The couple also manage the Fundación Monica Uribe Por Amor, which assists children with spina bifida. Activity in the fight against polio, stuffed animals from the zoo of love were delivered, each doll is equivalent to 5 vaccines and also the doll provides emotional support to sick children. Very innovative project and no wonder



that the Rotary International identified the project as one of the significant projects of 2024.



The need for maintaing fitness was inculcated in me from the school days itself. I studied upto IXth standard at the reputed Kotagiri Public School where Physical Education was compulsory for all children. Every morning we have to undergo physical training before the commencement of the day's activities. Each evening, various skills in playing all major games are taught. The school has a number of play grounds for all major games, including Cricket, Hockey, Football, Basketball, Volleyball, Kho-kho and Tennis. Besides these, indoor games like Shuttle Badminton, Table-Tennis, Carroms and Chess were also available. I chose Table Tennis which I continued during my studies in the S D College too. While in College, a couple of years I served as Table Tennis Team Caption also. After my college, I started playing Shuttle Badminton which lasted for about 25 years. I used to practice every day morning and this helped me to increase the proficiency in Shuttle Badminton and started winning competitions. I became the Alleppey District Shuttle Badminton Champion in doubles pairing with Prathipal of Pulimoottil. Again partnering with Rtn Ayyappan, now in e-Club Dubai, won the title in Rotary competitions held at Rotary District level and Runner up in the succeeding year. I had opportunity to serve as Vice-President of Alleppey District Ball and Shuttle Badminton Association for 5 years and presently holding the post of Sr.Vice President. Around 8 years back, I had had a fall while playing and fractured my knee ligament which kept me away from the Badminton court for nearly one year period. Even though I restarted playing shuttle Badminton I could not play my natural game due to sustained aching. I decided to shift my fitness activities to cycling, jogging and exercises in gymnasium etc. I must confess here that I was not very regular as I used to be in the like preinjury days. However I used to do something or the other atleast for 4/5 days in a week. I go for cycling continuously for a few days and then change over to walking or Gym depending upon the mood of the day. Of late I started swimming practice also as alternate sport. I wish to continue the lifestyle like this if not better it to maintain my fitness level.
