

### Attendance is not an end in Rotary, but non-attendance is the end of a Rotarian



In the seventies, attendance rules were very strict and most of the clubs were religiously following them. If a member was absent for four consecutive meetings, his membership termination was automatic. There was a saying "attendance is not an end in Rotary, but nonattendance is the end of a Rotarian". Of course there was a provision for make-ups, i.e. to get attendance credits by attending another club's regular meeting or some other specified meeting held on either side of the missed meeting. (Later this was relaxed to 14 days either side and now makeup need only be done in the same Rotary year). Even now, the Standard Rotary Club Constitution (SRCC) provides for termination for four consecutive absences, but with the consent of the club's board only. The SRCC also states that failure to attend or makeup atleast 50% of the regular meetings in each half of the Rotary year (of which atleast 30% of regular meetings in each half of the year at the home club or satellite club), can attract termination. Attendance requirements can also be met by engaging in Club's Service activities for 12 hours in each half year.

Rotarians can get attendance credit by attending regular meetings of any Rotaract Club, Interact Club, Rotary Community Corps, a Rotary Fellowship, RI Convention, Rotary Institute, Multi-Zonal Conference, District Conference, District Training Assembly, Intercity meetings, meetings of District Committee, Club's Board and Satellite Club. Participation in Club's service projects and spending atleast 30 minutes at a club's interactive website is also eligible for attendance credit.

If a Rotarian's age plus years of Rotary service crosses 85 or has 20 years of Rotary service in one or more clubs, the club board can exempt the member from attendance requirements. Board can also give leave of absence to a member for one year for any reason and for extended period on medical grounds.

Clubs may, however, add to or amend these makeup provisions in their bylaws or even do away with the need for any makeup for retaining the membership. In other words, in the matter of attendance, it is now laissez faire for clubs.
