VIZHINJAM PORT - HOPE FOR THE FUTURE

Vizhinjam is set to become India's largest transshipment port.

Currently, Indian export-import cargo is transshipped through major hubs like Colombo, Jebel Ali, Salalah, and Singapore. However, with Vizhinjam's commissioning, a significant portion of this transshipment traffic can be handled domestically. Even before its formal inauguration, already the port has 2.5 processed over lakh containers, generating substantial revenue for the state. All transshipment cargo arriving at Vizhinjam is brought in by feeder vessels and then transferred onto mother vessels for further international shipping.





While Vizhinjam has yet to commence its gateway operations, they are expected to begin in the coming months. Once operational, containers will move to the port via road and rail from across Kerala and Tamil Nadu.

Another key development planned for the later phases (third or fourth) is a dedicated cruise terminal. Cruise operations from Trivandrum are anticipated to create a ripple effect, boosting the local economy.

An outer industrial corridor is also being planned to accommodate major export oriented industrial units.

VIZHINJAM PORT – IMPACT ON KERALA'S ECONOMY




