He also honored Rtn.Ranjit Suseelan and Dr.S.Bijulal for becoming Major Donors and MPHF. He felicitated the outgoing Asst. Governor - Rtn. Major Donor. Ranjit Suseelan. Then the Secretary presented the report of activities of the club for the year 2025 - 26. Rtn.Dr.D.Mohanlal officially introduced our incoming President Rtn.Col:Dr.K.E.Rajan.

As an important part of the Installation Program, President Rtn. Kartha was disarmed by the Sergeant at arms. He then installed the new President Rtn. Col.Dr.K.E.Rajan by handing over the Club Charter, Collar, Gavel and gong along with the Presidential Pin. BRIEF REPORT ON INSTALLATION CEREMONY - CONTD

As part of the installation day celebration, RCTC proudly unveiled several service projects totaling about Rs ten lakhs with the help of many of our members. They include

- 1] Donating Wheel Chair and medicines to Ananthakripa Charitable organisation
- 2] Distribution of Umbrellas, Rain Coat, School Bags and other study materials to the school children at Kottoor tribal village.
- 3] A wheel Chair was donated to Sri R.Jyothikumar, a differently abled individualfrom Karakulam Grama Panchayath.
- 4] An electric pumb was provided for installing in a well at Kottoor tribal area providing clean water for the residence.
- 5] Proposal was initiated under District OPPOL project for an E-Auto to empower women drivers with an estimated amount of Rs.5 Lakhs.
- 6] Another proposal to install a Solar Power plant worth Rs.3 Lakhs for a financially backward family, in partnership with V Gaurd.

Continuing the programme our Chief Guest T.P.Sreenivasan was introduced by our member Rtn.S.K.Menon. This was followed by an informative talk by the Chief Guest. Rtn.V.Balagopal presented the memento.

Felicitation was done by Rtn.Suresh Mathew, Rtn.PAG.Ranjit Suseelan and the present AG.Dr.Baiju Balakrishnan.

The MCs for the evening, Rytn. Lakshmi Shasikumar and Rtn.Manju Thampi handled the event flow smoothly. The program was well attended by 40 members of RCTC and their families and a good number of visiting Rotarians and guests.

Before the meeting came to a close vote of thanks was done by the Secretary Rtn.Prem Kumar Thampi, followed by national anthem jointly sung. Finally the President Rtn.Col.Dr. Rajan adjourned the meeting and requested all to joint for the fellowship and dinner.
