Sarkar, Dance performance by hospital staff and Thalassemia affected child, Moumita Das, Gymnastics by a young Thalassemia affected boy, Puppet show and last but not the least Magic show. Food and goodie bags for the kids were arranged by RCC Presidency. RCC Charnock City arranged the Puppet Show. Gifts for the resident pediatric patients (approx 300) of SSKM were arranged by RCCJ and RCC Mahanagar. RCC Aabahoman donated a 56" flat screen TV for the Pediatric Ward. The programme was a grand success. It cheered up the brave children confronting daunting challenges from the early phase of life. 

Only in 1989, Council on Legislation (COL) voted to admit women into Rotary clubs So prior to this time, the question of the existence of Lady Rotarian did not arise. Even almost up to 1950, ladies were

denied to join in any Rotary program. Until 1989, the wives of Rotarians were addressed as Rotary Anns or only Annes. From 1990 Rotary had both male & female members and the husbands / wives of Rotarians were initially addressed as spouses of Rotarians. Of late, spouses are renamed as partners which is very common in western countries but not common in India till now. Anyway, the spouse or partner being dictionary words are understandable to all, However, even many Rotarians do not know the source of words Anns or Annes as they were addressed to the wives of Rotarians prior to 1990. The story behind this term is as below:

As stated above - earlier it was not customary for the wives of Rotarians to accompany their husbands to

any Rotary program. In 1914, the California Rotarians chartered a train to the RI convention in Houston. One lady, the wife of a San Francisco Club President, Rtn. Henry Brunnier (Bru) insisted and joined the team. As the train left the station, as usual, the Rotarians greet each other by calling their first names. One of the Rotarians wanted to greet the said single lady and said her "I do not want to call you as Mrs. Brunner. What is your first name?" The lady replied, "Ann". The festive group immediately nicknamed her "Rotary Ann". She became so popular during the long train journey that Bru joked he never had to buy her a meal because she was always a guest at some group's table. Thus, the word 'Ann' was adopted in subsequent COL.

on the floor. I courageously took it as some big rats must have shaken it. I again tried to sleep and suddenly, I felt someone was shaking me. I was really frightened at that time and was certain that a ghost had come and was doing all these mischievous activities.

Immediately, I remembered the advice of my grandmother and started chanting Gayatri mantra which I learnt at the time of my sacred thread ceremony which may be 50 years back and not chanted thereafter.
