




DOWN THE MEMORY LANE! Adaptation of a School

We started our journey together, so I will try to incorporate both of our experience. During 2001, one fine Monday morning, the then director of Indian Institute of Chemical Biology (IICB), late Rotarian IPP Dr Satish Pakrashi (1988-89), called both me and Chhabinath together in his office. We

were wondered at the same time nervous why Director is calling us? Anyway he informed us that in the evening, we had to go with him and Rotarian IPP Dr Anita Pakrashi (Anitadi, 2001-02). He did not tell us why or where? By looking at our puzzled face, he laughed and said do not worry you will be treated with singara and tea. We were at a complete loss. Anyway, we arrived at Chaikra Baithak, besides the lake, in very nice surroundings. \sim 15 gentlemen and two ladies entered into that room in a very informal way at ~ 6.30 PM. They were chatting laughing seemed to us they were thoroughly enjoying each other companionship. Whole atmosphere was very friendly and full of positive energy. Within a very short time, we did not know how, we also became part of them. Possibly this is Rotary magic! Our dear Rotarian IPP late Jyotishda with white dhoti and Panjabi, in a very soft voice used to guide us regarding new activities of our club. Nobody questioned him; all of us seriously took that as our sole responsibility. During Chhabinath's presidency year (2008-09), myself and Jyotishda went in search of schools around Jadavpur area. Being a computer person, Dr. IPP Rotarian Chhabinath was dreaming about computer education to the school children. Unfortunately, we could not find any schools without computer. Almost all the schools had computers and also a dedicated room but without computer teacher. During this search, we end up entering at Santoshpur Rishi Aurobindo Balika Vidyapith and met great headmistress Mrs Srimati, a doctorate from Bose Institute. Observing her dedication for building next generation and will power to improve the infrastructure of a state Government school where most of the students were first generation student from low income family, we decided to adopt this school. Now they become an integral part of our club. Since then we did many projects. In fact, first project during Chhabinath's Presidency was to install two drinking water facilities for these children. From very beginning, with the initiative from Jyotishda, we regularly arranged a two days eye camp in the school premises. As a follow up, needy children were taken to the eye specialist for further treatment. We were invited in many of the school program. We used to distribute books, awards to the successful students. Subsequently, we became part of their 15th August celebration. I during my presidency time (2012-2013) delivered quite a few inspiring lectures in Bengali and continued our service to the school through varieties of activities. In fact, one of our Ex Rotarian Dr. Prem started an ambitious vocational project by providing choices for their future career. Unfortunately, most of girls could not respond in a proper way. We had to stop that project. In front of our eyes, with untiring effort, dedication, hard work, preparing both teachers and students in participating in many national level competitions, Srimati, slowly, steadily and successfully could improve the health of this school through different innovative projects and gave an impressive shape of today's school. Now the school has big hall with stage, many rooms, laboratories, more importantly, a dedicated group of teachers. Our club was always with them. In fact, we have one interact club also. Joytishda always used to tell that do not involve so much with District projects. Our club is a small club with small budget; we will do whatever we could by ourselves. District Prizes should not matter to us. Our journey continued with various family gathering, picnic, outing etc. In this journey, we lost many big hearts like Rotarians Probirda, Joytishda, Dr. Anitadi, Dr Pakrashi, Nitharda, Nireshda, Dipankarda and recently Krishna. A few left for their personal reasons. But our club is unique as it never splits its originality. Many times, we felt to leave the club for very personal reasons, but I do not know why we still continuing our voyage with this 45 years old club. I do not know when Joydeb and Partha becomes our family guide. Goutamda, Shambhuda, Samirenduda, Swapan, Chandan, Shaki, Partha, Sanjib become close friend of us. Now, our club is really on different wheel with lots of young minds. These new generation members with their brilliant ideas also become part of us. I think, we, Rotarians, are bonded with an invisible rope and possibly that is the magic of Rotary club of Calcutta Jadavpur.

• **Class VI, VII and VIII** got the information about the constituents of air and the hands-on experiment to find the volume of oxygen in a

certain volume of air by burning a candle on a basin of water covered with a glass. After the candle was put off one fifth of the total volume of glass was filled with water showing one fifth of a certain volume of air contains oxygen. When oxygen is consumed no burning is possible ie., oxygen only helps in burning even in a living system, where mainly haemoglobin carries oxygen during respiration. After such burning carbon dioxide is formed which can be consumed by Chlorophylls of plants to produce glucose

which we get from plants. The maximum portion of air almost four f i f t h b y volume is Nitrogen, and very small volume of c a r b o n dioxide, water vapour and inert gases are there




• Then they were informed about the three phases of matters - solid, liquid and gases and they have seen ice was melting to water and water vapour was coming out from hot water. They got the idea of latent heat of melting of ice as 80cal /gm and that of water boiling to vapour was 536cal/gm. The made model of solid ice, liquid water and water vapour.

- They were made aware of the true solution, colloidal solution and suspension.
- Those students were taught about the Atomic structure and they drew the structures according to Periodic table and describe the model of those atomic structures with number of protons, neutrons and electrons.







• Lastly on the fourth day, **Class VII and VIII** have done experiments on Light path, Pinhole Camera, Reflection from plane mirror, lateral inversion, and infinite number of images between two parallel plane mirrors. They also described what is called refraction.

Presidential Message November 2023



R. Gordon R. McInally R I President 2023-24 Next year, Rotary takes a step toward supporting peacebuilding in the Middle East and North Africa region when recruitment begins for our newest peace center in partnership with Bahçeşehir University (BAU) in Istanbul.

A series of events in the coming year will recognize the new center at BAU and Rotary's work to promote peace. The 2024 Rotary International Convention in May

will mark 25 years since the first Rotary Peace Centers were announced — coincidentally at the Rotary Convention in Singapore in 1999. Recruitment for the first cohort of Rotary Peace Fellows at BAU also starts in 2024, and selected candidates will begin their program in early 2025.

Since its beginning, the peace centers program has prepared more than 1,700 peace fellows working in more than 140 countries to create a more peaceful world. That is certainly worth celebrating, but Rotary Peace Fellows are more than statistics on a page. Their actions have helped Create Hope in the World and will continue to do so.

For example, Jennifer Montgomery and Gorett Komurembe peace fellows from the program at Makerere University in Uganda — are co-founders of Magenta Girls Initiative. The international nongovernmental organization equips Ugandan girls and young women with the support and tools to overcome harmful gender norms, generational poverty, gender-based violence, trafficking, and trauma.

Ndzi Divine Njamsi, another peace fellow who studied at Makerere, has taken lessons learned about Positive Peace and is sharing them with students of his own in Cameroon. He became interested in the Rotary Positive Peace Activator training program after witnessing extremism, online hate speech, and violence in Cameroon. Since completing the program, he has brought his lessons on peace to students at the Yaoundé International Business School and other organizations in the Central Africa country.

The world needs more people like the graduates of the program at Makerere and our other peace fellows. To that end, we can all advance peace by encouraging our local peacebuilders to learn more about Rotary and apply for this impactful fellowship. Rotary members can also mentor candidates for the fellowship. Or you can work with peace fellows who have already graduated. They probably have an initiative or two that would benefit from your help.

Our peace centers in North America, Europe, Africa, Australia, and Asia depend on financial support as well. The program at BAU was made possible thanks to a generous gift of \$15.5 million to The Rotary Foundation from the Otto and Fran Walter Foundation.

This new Rotary Peace Center will offer a one-year professional development certificate in peace and development studies for fellows focusing on peacebuilding within the Middle East and North Africa region.

Peace must be waged persistently; it is the soil where hope takes root. But as with any journey, we take one step at a time. Let's take those steps together.
