MINUTES OF THE 2109th MEETING OF ROTARY CLUB OF CALCUTTA JADAVPUR, HELD AT SHIVMANDIR COMMUNITY HALL, KOLKATA, ON 21ST SEPTEMBER, 2023 AT 7 PM

President Rtn Paromita called the 2109th meeting to order. This RCM was held on 21st September, 2023 from 7pm onwards at Shivmandir Community Hall, 25, Lake Temple road, Kolkata 29. She then requested IPP Rtn Pausali, to lead the National Anthem. She thanked IPP for leading the National anthem and welcomed all the Rotarians and Guests present. PDG Mukul Sinha, District Literacy Chair was present to address the members. President welcomed PDG Mukul Sinha formally by presenting an Uttoriyo. President Rtn Paromita briefed about the service projects held during the last fortnight. Various activities were arranged for the children of Pathshala from 8th to 11th September, 2023 as part of the EAZY SCHOOL 2 project:

Rtn Aditi Nag Chaudhuri and Rtn Pausali Paul were present at Dwaranda, Bolpur.

On 14.09.23, RCCJ supported the transport and logistics of 13 individuals from the glaucoma family who came for check up in the Vivekananda Mission Ashram Clinic. Of the 13, three were post op follow ups. One patient who was to be admitted today for trab surgery couldn't be admitted due to medical reasons. But he is doing okay with regards to intraocular pressure and

thus a delay in operation shouldn't be much to be worried about. All the patients were given free medicines, some of which are quite expensive and almost unaffordable by the poorer section of the society. Next clinic visit day is on 12th October, 2023. On 16th September, 2023 RCCJ donated a Taiwan made wheel chair to Rehabilitation Center for Children, a NGO working in rehab of children with orthopedic deformities since birth. The wheel chair was received from Indian Humanity Foundation. This whole project was possible only because of the support received from PDG Prabir Chatterjee. We thank him from the core of our heart. We thank PP Rtn Jaydeb Banerjee for planning and executing the event perfectly. Special mention of Hon member Samirendu Dutt for joining the event. On behalf of RCCJ IPP Pausali Paul, PP Rtn Jaydeb Banerjee, PP Rtn Swapan Chakraborty, PP Rtn Partha Pratim Roy and myself President Paromita were present. Rotary Club of Calcutta Jadavpur is going to observe Childhood Cancer Awareness Month in the Pediatric wards of ICH on 19.09.23, 10:00am to 11:00am. Goodie bags containing stationary items were distributed to 12 pediatric patients in the Pediatric Cancer ward of ICH. Life Beyond Cancer Team had been working at ICH since last few years. RCCJ had been instrumental in developing a play area at ICH in association with LBC. Ms. Shonali Chakraborty, a proposed new member was introduced to the club members. The next RCM would be held on 4th October at Shivmandir Community Hall, 25, Lake Temple road, Kolkata 29.

Announcements were made by president regarding future programmes on 22nd September, 23 Observance of World Leukemia Day at Netaji Subhas Bose Cancer Hospital for Psychological counseling for Parent groups by eminent Psychologists in association with Life Beyond Cancer as a joint

initiative of Rotary Club of Calcutta Avyanna, Rotary Club of Calcutta Jadavpur and Rotary Club of Calcutta Mahanagar. On 24th September, 23 a Blood Donation Camp is being organized in aid of cancer affected children in association with Netaji Subhas Bose Cancer Hospital and Atlanta Club in collaboration with Rotary Club of Calcutta Universe and Life Beyond Cancer.

DOWN THE MEMORY LANE! RCC CHOWBAGA

In Rotary, what we now call RCC (Rotary Community Corp) was called RVC (Rotary Village Corp) in yester years. Rotary Club of Jadavpur had a number of RVCs located at Basanti, Boichitala, Diamond Barbour, South Garia, Baruipur and Chowbaga. These RVCs were formed by different Presidents keeping in view their own professional interests in different fields. All RVCs other than Chowbaga existed for a short duration mainly because of inconvenient location, local leaders' vested interest, lack of cooperation from local leaders and RCCJ's subsequent leaders' interest in other areas. The RCC (RVC) Chowbaga has existed for more than 40 years now as it has fulfilled all the needed criteria for formation of a RCC. The story for the success is as below:

In the R.Y. 1983 – 84, Rtn. Jyotish Chandra Dutta (Jyotish da) was elected as President of Rotary Club of Jadavpur (RCJ). Jyotish da was a freedom fighter and a devoted social worker. His passion was to develop society in the field of education, vocation, agriculture, sanitation, drinking water etc. So, from the beginning of his Rotary Club President ship, he was in search of an underdeveloped village in a neighbouring area having a sincere local leader. Ultimately, with the help of a club member, Rtn. Dilip Mondal, advocate, detected the village Chowbaga which fully filled all the needed criteria. Chowbaga was then a totally under-developed village which was adopted by RCI with the consent of all club members including the club leadership. The program was taken over under R.I. Rural Development Program scheme. The village also had a devoted and honest leader, Sri Chandi Charan Biswas, a school teacher who was also a devoted social worker. As such, he was a great help to materialize the program. Thus, virtually two leaders -Rtn. Jyotish Ch. Dutta from RCJ and Chandi Babu from the Chowbaga village were the two persons totally involved in the project. The development program started during 1983 - 84 with the erection of Bus stand shelter and distribution of books & stationery. to the vocational training centre. In the R.Y. 1985 -86, RCJ purchased a plot of land to build Rotary Karma Shisha Bhawan in Chowbaga. During the said RY Rotary Village Corps (RCC) was formed at the Chowbaga village. at the said Rotary Karma Siksha Bhawan building. A welfare centre started. Gradually, Embroidery, tailoring and knitting, typing wing and Charitable Homeo Dispensary and Musical classes started in Chowbaga. All facilities for all these projects were provided by RCJ. Recently a number of toilet blocks have also been constructed there. All villagers of Chowbaga have been benefited and now the village Chowbaga can be considered as a Developed, model and Self Sufficient village. Many times GSE teams and even RIP Robert Barth also visited the village during RY 1993-94 during the governorship of our Amitava Bhattacharyya and appreciated the warmth and hospitality of the villagers.

Presidential Message October 2023

The World Health Organization designates 10 October as World Mental Health Day, and with Rotary placing a special focus on mental health this year, I would like to help answer the question posed to me most often when I travel to meet members: How can my club get started?

There are some wonderful examples of Rotary members taking action already. In the Philippines, the Rotary

Club of Tiaong-Hiyas held a 12-week health challenge for mothers in the community to promote some baseline health screenings and coaching on a healthier lifestyle.

By the end of the challenge, the mothers had a special bond and decided to form a Rotary Community Corps called Ilaw ng Tahanan ("one who lights up the home") with the goal of involving more mothers in health education and wellness support — and later youth services, teen pregnancy prevention, and help with unhealthy substance use. Almost a year later, the RCC is preparing to open its own health center where mothers can come for peer-to-peer support.

Another strong example is in Colorado. In the fall of 2021, a small group of stakeholders from the Rotary Club of Highlands Ranch formed the Rotary Clubs of Colorado Endowed Fellowship for Pediatric Mental Health, which enhances the ability of Children's Hospital Colorado to recruit and train pediatric psychiatry providers and allows the hospital network to make additional appointments. This increases access to mental health care for children and decreases provider shortages.

Since then, the project has brought on new supporters and is now fully funded with a \$500,000 endowment. Investment income from this endowment will support a fellow — a psychologist or psychiatrist — at Children's Hospital. A new fellow will be named every one to two years, beginning spring of 2024. Over time this will create a cohort to bolster the mental health workforce, treating kids from all 64 Colorado counties and neighboring states.

There are many more great mental health project stories on Rotary Showcase, and I invite you to share your experiences as you begin your own projects. Also, please reach out to mindhealth@rotary.org with any thoughts or ideas you would like to share about mental health in the Rotary world.

On 10 October, I will host a Facebook Live event when we will recognize World Mental Health Day and further explore how Rotary members can begin this journey. But I would like to leave you with one way every Rotary member can make a difference.

Right now, there is someone you know in the Rotary world — in your club, from a project you've worked on, in a Rotary Fellowship or Rotary Action Group — who could use a little more of your time and attention. Rotary is this great gift of global friendship, and that also means being there for each other.

Discovering the human connections that bind us is what we do through our membership every day. It's what Rotary has always been about, and we can build on it by helping each other find peace at home.

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We need to learn how to ask not just "How are you?" but also "How are you really?" By doing so, Rotary can continue to Create Hope in the World.
