Francesco Arezzo, a member of the Rotary Club of Ragusa, Italy, has been selected by the Board of Directors to become Rotary International's president for 2025-26.

The Board conducted a special session following the unexpected resignation of RI President-elect Mário César Martins de Camargo on 8 June. Guided by the RI code and policies, the Board selected the new president-elect from a pool of candidates who were considered by the Nominating Committee for President of Rotary International in August 2023.

The 2025-26 presidential message, announced at the 2025 Rotary International Assembly in February, will remain Unite for Good, which calls on Rotary members to be a force for unity in a world increasingly divided by politics, geography, and ideology. Through service projects, Rotary brings together people of every background — across races, religions, and professions — in a shared mission to do good in their communities.

Arezzo is an orthodontist in private practice. He is active internationally as a member of the Italian, European, and American orthodontics associations. He is vice president of the National Association of Italian Dentists for the province of Ragusa and was the founder and head for seven years of the delegation for Ragusa of the National Trust for Italy. He is a Knight of Honor and Devotion in Obedience within the Sovereign Order of Malta.

A Rotary member for more than 30 years, Arezzo has served as vice chair of the Joint Strategic Planning Committee and as RI director, learning facilitator, and as district conference presidential representative.

Arezzo is a Benefactor of The Rotary Foundation. He is married to Anna Maria Criscione, an entrepreneur in the tourism field. They have two children.

Pioneering the Transit Trauma Care Project

Dr. Homchaudhuri initiated the Transit Trauma Care Project in partnership with Kolkata Police and the Government of West Bengal. The deployment of 12 ambulances across accident-prone areas in Kolkata has saved countless lives by providing immediate emergency care during the Golden Hour.

A Visionary in Thalassemia Eradication

Recognized for his work in Thalassemia Awareness and Prevention, Dr. Homchaudhuri has conducted seminars, screening programs, and awareness campaigns across West Bengal, Assam, Odisha, and Bangladesh. His goal is to eradicate this 100% preventable genetic disorder through early screening and genetic counseling.

Transforming Lives in Rural Bengal

For the past three years, Dr. Homchaudhuri has been driving sustainable development in Dhaska, Purulia, alongside Hridham NGO. His contributions include:



Providing potable water through pond excavation and water conservation initiatives, Enhancing education for local children, Empowering villagers with income-generating activities to improve livelihoods.

In recognition of his service, Dr. Homchaudhuri was unanimously elected as District Governor Nominee and will assume office as District Governor of Rotary District 3291 in 2025-26. His vision includes expanding healthcare, strengthening education, and enhancing community welfare programs.

Dear President Sudipta,

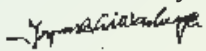

Contact other organizations or clubs that have a strong record of innovation or reinvention and look for ways to apply what they did to your own club. Set aside a small fund to try new ideas. Expand initiatives that succeed and document what you learn from those that don't. Review your club roles, processes, tasks and look for ways to be more efficient — whether it's by reducing, combining, or eliminating responsibilities or using different technology. Establish a continuity plan. Encourage club officers and other members to work with the incoming leaders chosen for the next few years so that their efforts will be cohesive and all will be invested in a joint success.

“ Nearly 6 million children under the age of five die each year because of malnutrition, poor health care, and inadequate sanitation. We expand access to quality care, so mothers and their children can live and grow stronger.

A tribute to Nitish C Laharry



*Lead, kindly Light,
amid the encircling gloom;
Lead thou me on!
The night is dark,
and I am far from home;
Lead thou me on!*

With these words of verse Nitish C Laharry concluded his final address to the international Convention in St Louis, Missouri in June, 1963. They were familiar words to those close to Nitish. He used them frequently.

The “home” he contemplated when he spoke these lines was not the place he called his abode at any time. Nitish was an intensely spiritual man. It was his nature and his instinct to identify the spiritual motivation which he conceived to be at the root of man’s activity and, in particular, those activities attributable to a man’s affiliation with Rotary.

This quality of the man who was the first President of Rotary International from Asia impelled him to challenge Rotarians of the world to “Kindle the Spark Within.” In his words, “By doing so we shall realise that the path to an ultimate destiny lies in the resignation of the fact that all humanity is one and that each one of us is a spark from the Divine Godhood.”

The 52nd RI President was born in Calcutta and educated there. He was well educated. He received a bachelor of arts with honors in English from the University of Calcutta, also a master’s degree in economics and political science and a law degree. After practising law for four years he turned to the rapidly growing motion-picture business, in which he spent the rest of his working life. In 1926 he became a member of RC Calcutta under the classification “Motion-Picture Distributing.” A history of the Calcutta club contains this note about Nitish: “He was appointed the first Indian Secretary of the club. Although at that time the writer knew him as a quiet, even shy, young man he was in the thick of it right from the start.”

Eighteen years later he became President of RC Calcutta, and 18 years after that he became RI President at Tokyo, Japan. Quiet, modest, sensitive and humble he has always been, throughout the 38 years he served Rotary. Yet he has always been “in the thick of it.” Space permits but one example: his part in the 1958 Asia Regional Conference held in New Delhi.

Nitish served as Chairman of that Conference described by informed men of India as the largest non-political, non-religious gathering of Indians ever held. I accompanied Nitish on a visit to the late Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru prior to the opening of the conference, and we invited him to join the Rotarians at a garden party closing the conference. It was a gesture of courtesy. We scarcely expected Mr Nehru would find it possible to attend a social function devoted to Rotary fellowship. However, when the garden party was its peak with 2,000 Rotarians and members of their families in attendance, Prime Minister Nehru walked into the garden, alone and unescorted, greeted the Rotarians, and joined in the conversation. It was a dramatic event and many interpretations could be placed upon it. I had my own interpretation. I felt quite certain that Nitish had indeed kindled the spark on his fellow countryman Mr Nehru, and that the Prime Minister, with equal sensitivity, was giving personal recognition to Nitish for his service, devotion and diligence.

At a time, in the evolution of Rotary, when the age-old distinctions between East and West were coming into ever sharper focus, Nitish Laharry came and walked among us as our leader. He was the living example of the fact that in truth East and West can meet. He was an inspiring symbol of his own deep belief in “the essential oneness of mankind.” And now has gone to walk with the Master. Let us all give thanks for what he was and what he gave to us. Let us reverently rejoice that the kindly Light has led our Nitish home.

Minutes of the Virtual 2154th Regular Club Meeting of RC Calcutta Jadavpur held on July 16, 2025, Wednesday at 7.00 PM.

- President Rtn. Sudipta Kundu called the meeting to order and welcomed all the members and guests.
- National Anthem was led by Rtn. (Dr.) Jharna Ray and joined by all.
- President Rtn. Sudipta welcomed Ms. Jayatee Biswas, a prospective member, who introduced herself.
- President Rtn. Sudipta requested Rtn. (Dr.) Kunal Ray to share his experience about the RMBF Business Summit Kolkata 2025 where he had delivered a speech on the activities of LBC. He informed that it was quite a nice experience talking about LBC work, success stories, future plans and goals in front of the audience. Some relevant flyer was distributed among the attendees after the presentation together with playing an audio record of Ms. Rituparna Sengupta, the cause ambassador of LBC. This event was attended by PP Rtn. (Dr.) Kunal Ray, Rtn. (Dr.) Jharna Ray, Rtn. Manas Kr. Ghosh, President Rtn. Sudipta Kundu representing RC Calcutta Jadavpur. - Rtn. Sikha Mukherjee informed that she was contacted by the new School-In-Charge of Bowbazar Rainbow Homes and was requested to provide exercise books and other study materials for the kids. She had also informed that there was a proposal from RC Calcutta, Youth Section to become a Co-Host in one of their projects that would be held on July 30, 2025, with a contribution of around Rs.8,000/- to Rs.10,000/-. PP Rtn. Pausali Paul opined that it needs the approval of the board for fund availability.
- PP Rtn. Paushali Paul also requested Rtn. Sikha Mukherjee if she could get updates on the progress of work of the sewing machines already installed at the Rainbow Homes.
- PP Rtn. (Dr.) Chitra Mandal informed that one of the sewing machines, donated to Santoshpur Rishi Aurobindo Balika Vidyapith was not working since installation and proposed that if we could get in touch with RC Calcutta for necessary action to repair the same. 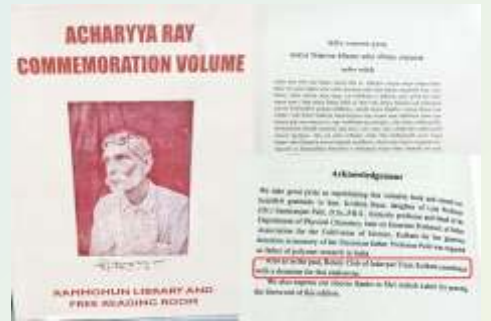
