Minutes of Meeting: 46th Installation Meeting and 2128th RCM held on July 10, 2024

Venue: The Lake Club Sports Complex Time: 7.00pm Attendance: 82

- Rtn. Paromita Das Dutta, President RY 23-24 called the meeting to order and requested Rtn. Shakhi Banerjee to lead the National Anthem.
- After the National Anthem was sung, Rtn. Paromita Das Dutta welcomed everyone and presented a summary of the services of RCCJ for the RY23-24. Then she introduced Rtn. (Dr.) Mainak Sengupta, installed him as the President RY 24-25 following due procedure and handed over the proceedings to him.
- The incoming President Dr. Mainak Sengupta welcomed the Chief Guest District Governor AKS Dr. Krishnendu Gupta and the First Lady Dr. Simran, the Guest of Honour District Governor Elect Dr. Ramendu Homchaudhuri, the special guest District Governor Nominee Mr. Tapas Bhattacharya, all other Past District Governors and other District officials present, the regular and honorary members of RCCJ and their family, The President and Secretary of the Inner Wheel Club of Jadavpur and other guests. The first lady was presented with a bouquet of flowers.
- The President presented his vision of work for RY 24-25 and introduced the Board members including the chairs of various service areas. Secretary Rtn. Soumya Chattopadhyay performed the club business.
- The President then requested the DG to induct 8 new members (7 regular and 1 honorary) to the club. The members were introduced by the President and the DG presented the Rotary Pin to the new members. All the new members were presented with framed drawings of the beneficiary students from Pathshala, Bolpur.
- The President then handed over cheques amounting to USD 2182 to District Governor AKS Dr. Krishnendu Gupta, and PDG and District Rotary Foundation Chair (DRFC) Sudip Mukherjee.
- On the request of the President, DGN Mr. Tapas Bhattacharya delivered his address, followed by DGE Dr. Ramendu Homchaudhuri. DGN made an appeal to everyone to donate to The District Polio Fund. IPP Rtn. Paromita Das Dutta and Rtn. Sikha Mukherjee committed to donate 100 USD each to the cause. DGE appealed to everyone to consider Thalassemia prevention as a major focus. Then the President requested the DG to address the august gathering. DG appreciated the service projects of RCCJ for the RY 23-24 and encouraged the plans presented by President Dr. Mainak. The DG, DGE and DGN were felicitated with the framed drawings of the beneficiary students at Pathshala, Bolpur.
- On behalf of the club, the President and IPP Paromita Das Dutta handed over a cheque of RS 11,000 to the Treasurer, Rammohun Library and Free Reading Room for the reprint of a commemoration volume on Acharya P.C. Roy.
- Secretary and the President-Elect Rtn. Soumya Chattopadhyay extended his vote of thanks on behalf of the Club, following which the meeting was called to an end.
- The meeting was followed by fellowship and dinner.

Minutes of the Meeting: 2129th RCM held on July 17, 2024

- Rtn. (Dr.) Mainak Sengupta, President RY 24-25 called the meeting to order and requested Rtn. Shakhi Banerjee to lead the National Anthem.
- After the National Anthem was sung, President did welcome everyone including the members of the Inner Wheel Club Jadavpur and the guest speaker Prof. Samir R Sikdar, retd. Faculty, Bose Institute Kolkata, and all other guests. He also got confirmed the minutes of the 2128th RCM that was previously distributed amongst the members via email.
- The President presented a summary of the services of RCCJ for the first half of July 2024 through a PowerPoint presentation mode. He announced the proposed upcoming services too, and also announced the names of the kind donors for different services. This was followed by Secretary Soumya Chattopadhyay conducting the club business announcing the birthdays and anniversaries of the members (and partners). - The official meeting was preceded by half an hour of fellowship meeting.

ROTARY AS I REMEMBER:-

(From my faded memory, I have tried to jot down some salient points on Rotary with a view to give some basic concept on Rotary to the new Rotarians only.)

Hierarchy:

Rotary was founded on 23rd. February, 1905 by eight American gentlemen headed by Paul Percy Harris at Unity Building, Chicago, Illinois, USA. Today's headquarter of Rotary International is Evanston, Illinois, USA.

Rotary International is headed by RI President supported by RI Board consisting of RIP as Chair Person, RIP elect., RI Vice President, RI Treasurer (All above are elected by RI Directors and tenure for them is one year) and 16 RI Directors (elected by District Governors and tenure is two years).

There are 529 District Governors elected by about 35,000 Rotary Club Presidents and tenure DG is one year. Club Presidents are elected by about 12, 00,000 club members and tenure is one year. The administrative head of Rotary is R.I. President which is a elected post while some senior secretarial posts are nominated or appointed. The tenures of R.I. President is one year, Board of Trustees is four years and Board of Directors is two years.

Club Presidents (tenure 1 yr.) elect District Governors (tenure 1 yr.), Dist. Governors elect RI Directors (tenure 2 yrs.) RI Directors elect RI President (tenure 1 yr.) & RI Trustees (tenure 4 years) and RI Trustees elect Chair Person RI Trustee (1 yr.). Club Presidents elect COL representative (tenure 3 yrs.)

The Council on Legislation is an important part of Rotary's governance process. While the Board of Directors sets policies for Rotary International, the Council is where Rotary clubs have their say in the governance of the association. The Council on Resolutions meets online every year to vote on proposed resolutions. Each Rotary district chooses а representative for a three-year term. These elected members represent their districts at all three meetings of the Council on Resolutions and at the Council on Legislation during their term. This COL functions like Indian Parliament and COL representatives like our MPs. All the rules & regulations adopted and approved are recorded in Manual of Procedure (MOP). (To be contd.)
