FROMTHE EDITOR'S DESK

Last Thursday, I had been to the National Library Central Archives to gather some information on Kadambini Ganguly, Sister Nivedita, Kaji Nazrul Islam and Pandit Nehru. While returning as I stopped at the old Tram Depot Office at Esplanade for a cup of tea, a TV journalist from "Ei Samay" approached me for a bite on my views about the Bengali idiom "বার খেয়ে ক্ষুদিরাম হওয়া" (to act like Shahid Khudiram Bose sheerly being influenced by others and not assessing the pros and cons of the action). As I shared my opinion, they asked me if I know the birth date of Khudiram, for which, to my luck I had the answer i.e. 3rd December. Unfortunately very few people of the younger generation are aware of the brave youth of yesteryears who turned to become the armed revolutionaries to fight against the British Raj and never feared to sacrifice their life for the cause of our country's independence. Often times they were driven by sheer passion and lacked the basic amenities to even stand a chance against the well-oiled armed machinery of the British force, but they were not deterred. In course of time, we have seen the youth of different parts of the world take resort to armed revolution for various causes, some movements ended in glory while some led to the social ostracization of that section of the youth being tagged as 'terrorists'. The revolution that is happening at the moment in Bangladesh raises a lot of questions about the intent, implementation and implications. Surely, the sacrifices of Khudiram Bose, Preetilata Waddedar, Masterda Surva Sen during the fight for independence from the British Raj or that of the 3 million Bengalis (Muktiyodhya) killed by the then West-Pakistani Establishment in their fight for the very existence of Bangladesh didn't mean to see the death of democracy in a country still at its teen. As a Rotarian, I hope, Rotary International will lead from the front in establishing peace in Bangladesh, as also in Ukraine and in Palestine. I wish our club, together with other clubs in our district 3291, seriously consider meaningful peace projects with respect to this burning issue.

Mission Life Beyond Cancer



As a part of an ongoing service, from Nov 1st to Nov 30th, **RCCJ donated Rs** 1,45,000/- towards treatment of 13 pediatric cancer patients aged between 1-12 years, admitted in 5 different hospitals in Kolkata.

On 23rd November, **RCCJ donated a** wheel-chair to the Institute of Child Health (ICH), Kolkata. ICH had previously sent a list of immediate requirements to Life Beyond Cancer, based on which RCCJ chose to donate a wheel chair.

On 20th November, as a part of EAZY School 3 endeavour, **RCCJ in collaboration with Fire & Security Association** of India (FSAI) conducted a training and demonstration workshop on fire safety at Santoshpur **Rishi Aurobindo Balika Vidyapith.** Around 100 students and teachers participated in the workshop. After audiovisual presentations on fire –safety, the resource persons from FSAI conducted hands-on demonstration of firefighting and also organised a mock fire-evacuation drill.



On 16th November, 2024, RCCJ organized the second dance therapy session for the residents of Sanlaap's SNEHA HOME, a shelter for rescued women and young girls, mostly from sex trade. The session was conducted by Ms. Sangeeta Chatterjee, a dance therapist, who works with autistic children.



ROTARY AS I REMEMBER:-

FATHER OF ROTARY

Schiele was the first Rotary Club President and Harris was elected to the post in 1907. The second Rotary Club was formed in San Francisco in 1908. In 1909 Rotary Club of New York was formed. By now Rotary turned to national movement and Rotary's focus had turned towards good deeds in the community.

In 1910, Harris met his Scottish bride, Jean Thomson in Chicago Prairie Club while hiking. Three months later they got married. They named their home as Comely Bank, after the name of a street in Edinburgh where Jean grew up. They had no children. Paul & Jean helped Rotary grow. He confessed, "having no children of our own, Jean and I adopted Rotary".

In 1910, the National Association (later known as Rotary International) of the Rotary Clubs was formed and Harris became the first President. In 1912, Harris retreated from the public eye for nearly 15 years owing to his serious physical breakdown followed by heart attack. When he recovered Harris returned to his legal work. He avoided Rotary conventions instead he used to send messages to be read on his behalf. In 1926, Harris reemerged "The Rotarians" which had been launched in 1911 to publish a treatise by Harris on Rotary, printed his autobiography.

In May, 1928, the rotary members first sailed another country to from Montreal to Great Britain and established Rotary Clubs there. Harris channeled his mischief in a more constructive manner than before by uniting Rotarians the world over. Harris had a heart attack in 1929 but surprised everyone when he showed up at the 1930 RI Convention for his first convention appearance since 1912. That year, as Nazi party was gaining power in Germany, Harris planted his first tree of friendship on European soil in Berlin.

After a long illness, Harris died on 27th. January, 1947 and was buried beside his great friend Silvester Schiel, as per his will. An outpouring of donations to The Rotary Foundation inspired the creation of the Paul Harris Memorial Fund to fortify the Foundation. That year, the Foundation the forerunner launched to the Ambassadorial Scholarship program, calling the students "Paul Harris Fellows". In 1957, the Foundation Trustees created the Paul Harris Fellow recognition to honour donors of USD 1,000.
