Unleash your full potential as a PHOTOGRAPHER - Part III

A few tips for mobile phone landscape photography

1. SHOOT FIRST, ZOOM IN POST

The problem with fixed camera lenses is that zooming in is exactly the same as cropping the image. This means that the further you zoom in, the less detailed the image is going to become. It's the same as 'digital zoom'. So, do NOT use your camera zoom feature. The best possible outcome will happen if you move closer, or "zoom with your feet". If that is not possible, crop it in post-production.

2. GET LOW, TURN YOUR PHONE UPSIDE DOWN

Include low level foreground element in your landscape photography. Flipping your phone upside-down is an ultimate game changer.



3. STRAIGHTEN THE HOROZON

Ensure your photo is straight by lining up your landscape using the grid-line feature on your phone. The camera grid is a feature that divides the frame of your photos using four lines that run horizontally and vertically across the screen.



4. SHOOT AT GOLDEN HOUR

Good lighting makes all the difference, and landscape photography is no different. Venture outside with your camera phone around thirty minutes before and after sunrise or sunset.
