- The President announced a few projects/fellowships and events for the coming month.



- Visit to S C SEN old age home for the official hand over of two wardrobes donated by Rtn. Bhaskar Guha and Rtn. Rahela Jaiswal on 23rd Aug'25
- Tree plantation project at Rtn. Prantik Roy Choudhury's property was decided on 30th Aug'25
- A day trip to MASAGRAM COUNTRY RESORT has been arranged for all members and spouses on 7th Sep'25.
- Members were requested to attend the first CLUB BOARD MEETING online on 29th Aug'25 at 7.30 pm.
- On 20th Sep'25 mosquito nets will be distributed to beneficiaries near Sodepur in association with UTTARA. Rtn. Tapas Bhattacharya is coordinating with Uttara for this event
- Rtn Ujjayini Das Sharma handed over the flag received from Singapore club BUGIS JUNCTION to The President.
- Rtn. Kumar's birthday was celebrated with great joy and fun
- Next date of the meeting has been fixed on 22nd Aug'25

Minutes of the BOARD MEETING held on 29th Aug'25

- President & Members of our club met through Google Online meeting and discussed about the prospective future projects of our club:
- President informed that we have to complete the formalities of 'Goal Setting' on My Rotary. These are
 the future plans and projects of the club which have to be set on My Rotary. If we fulfill the same then
 Rotary International President's citation will be received by the club.
- President emphasized on sustainable projects and requested members to share their opinion on the same.
- President also emphasized on participation in some of the District projects which fulfill our club standards and requirements. This was appreciated by all since this joint participation in projects with other clubs has all benefits ie. Cost effective; less planning and ground work by members of the club; friendship/familiarity with members of other clubs and public; sharing new ideas and future projects with members of other clubs; etc.
- President shared that he is very much interested to do a project on Thalassemia. Rahela Jaiswal was requested to identify a college or a school (Classes XI-XII) wherein we can do the "Awareness Camp" on Thalassemia. Other members were also requested to identify a suitable place/area for doing an Awareness camp on Thalassemia.
- President also informed that he is willing to have an Eye Camp in this Rotary Year. He requested members to identify a suitable place/village/area/school/college where we can organize an Eye camp. President also requested members to get in touch with the concerned doctors/ophthalmologists for doing the required job. Tapas Bhattacharyya requested the President to hold the Eye Camp and Thalassemia Camp separately which he readily agreed.
- Rahela Jaiswal informed that she will get in touch with the Principal, Haryana Vidyamandir, Salt Lake, for discussions/formation of an Interact club of RCSLDT.
- Deepak Mitra informed that Ex-Rotarian Ajay Majumdar has published a book written by him "Jibanpurer Pathik" about his personal experiences in life. He wants to share it with the members of our club and, as such, would like to give a presentation in our club in this regard. President and members agreed and it has been decided to invite him and his wife and request him to give a presentation in one of our future family get-togethers parties.
- Mala Chakraborty informed the members that Ajay Majumdar has requested to help a person who writes
 very interesting books as he is very poor. As such, members of our club can help the person by buying



a few of the books written by him and thus give him encouragement. It was decided to get further clarification in this regard from Ajay Majumdar before taking a decision/further action.

- President requested Deepak Mitra to find out the present position of the Blind School at Salt Lake to explore further possibilities of future projects with them.
- Mala Chakraborty requested the President to explore the idea of taking the senior citizens of Natun Ghar to Maayer Bari at Bagbazar for spending a few hours and having lunch at that place. President agreed to the idea but requested to ensure that the authorities of JAGORANI NGO agree to it. Also we need to ensure that a few of their persons/members should positively accompany the senior citizens.
- Mala Chakraborty requested members to sincerely try to find possible advertisers for MONER TAANEY MELA, 2025. She specifically thanked Gautam Mukherjee and Sarbani Mukherjee for finding out new Stall owners who have agreed to give their stalls in the mela. She also thanked all others who are already working and trying to find advertisers or stall owners for the mela. Detailed discussions would be carried out in our next online MONER TAANEY MELA meeting.
- President requested members and spouses to whole-heartedly participate in the tree plantation project to be held on 30th August at Prantick Roychowdhury's residence.

From Editor's Desk




September is month of "BASIC EDUCATION & LITERACY"

 - a) National Literacy Mission (NLM) started on 1988
 - b) Total Literacy Campaign (TLC) Used the slogan "Each One, Teach One"
 - c) Saakshar Bharat Mission (2009) Targeted 70 million non-literate adults, especially women
- 3. Literacy Mission in the World
 - a) UNESCO & Global Campaigns Inclusive and equitable quality education
 - b) Country-Specific Missions
