

From Editor's Desk

Celebrating **55 Years of the Internet**: The Historic First Message

On **October 29, 1969**, a groundbreaking moment in technology unfolded that would forever change the way we connect, communicate, and share information. Two engineers, **Charley Kline and Bill Duvall**, sat at their computers—350 miles apart—ready to **send a message over what would become the internet**. Do you know the first message that they sent? It was "LO".

Kline, a bright-eyed 21-year-old graduate student at UCLA, sat nervously preparing to connect with Duvall, a 29-year-old systems programmer at Stanford Research Institute (SRI). Their mission? To test **Arpanet**, the Advanced Research Projects **Agency Network**, funded by the U.S. Department of Defense. This ambitious project aimed to create a network capable of sharing data without relying on traditional telephone lines, using a revolutionary method known as "packet switching."

As Kline typed the word "L-O-G-I-N," excitement filled the air. But just as he reached the halfway point, disaster struck—the system crashed! The first message sent over the internet was merely the letters "L-O." Yet, this seemingly trivial moment was just the beginning of a monumental achievement.

After an hour of troubleshooting, the connection was reestablished, and the duo successfully logged in, unaware of the significance of their accomplishment.

So, let's raise a toast to Charley Kline, Bill Duvall, and the birth of the internet! Their journey reminds us that every great innovation starts with a simple idea and a willingness to experiment.



Remembrance of scientific minds of India

Sir Jagadish Chandra Bose (born on 30 November 1858) was a polymath with interests in biology, physics, botany and writing science fiction. He was a pioneer in the investigation of radio microwave optics, made significant contributions to botany, and was a major force behind the expansion of experimental science on the Indian subcontinent. Bose is considered the father of Bengali science fiction. A crater on the Moon was named in his honour. He founded the Bose Institute, a premier research institute in India and also one of its oldest. Established in 1917, the institute was the first interdisciplinary research centre in Asia. He served as the Director of Bose Institute from its inception until his death.
