




RI President Stephanie A Urchick – July's Message

The Unexpected Cancellation of the Rotary International Convention in the Philippines

The Rotary International Convention, an event eagerly anticipated by Rotarians worldwide, was scheduled to be held in the Philippines. The official Rotary International Convention website, https://convention.rotary.org/en-us/about/past-and-future-conventions, now lists the 2028 Convention Schedule as TBA (To Be Announced), leaving a gap in what was once a firmly set calendar.
