

Gavaskar's Third Innings - Saving Children's lives

Once the former cricketer Sunil Gavaskar got the chance to visit the famous Sai Sanjeevani Hospital at Visakhapatnam where the doctors used to operate the children suffering from congenital heart disease. The surgeries done at this hospital have a success rate almost 99.9% . at this hospital, Gavaskar watched the joy of the parents when they had been told by the doctors after surgery that their children would now be fully cured. Mr. Gavaskar was further struck by the fact that in these type of hospitals – there is no billing counter, no insurance claim – what is existing there – only love and compassion

Hence Rotary has decided to be partner with these hospitals under its caption, "Gift of Life Programme".

Now Gavaskar signed an MOU with Rotary and donated 5 crores for conducting paediatric heart surgeries.

Gavaskar had been confirmed Rotary's lifetime Achivement Award from RI Director Mahesh Kotbag in the presence of RI PresidentJennifer Jones and PRIP Shekhar Mehta. He had been further honoured for "being a sporting legend of our times who epitomised the elegance of the game of cricket on and off the field."

Gavaskar further added – "in my life, I have had my first innings as a cricketer, my second innings – which is being – part administrator, part media, doing commentary, writing about the game.

My third innings – is to stand beside the poor children suffering from congenital heart disease which has been the most fulfilling, most rewarding."

"in my life, there are so many partners – but my partnership with Rotary is something which is going to last and last – together we can save thousands and thousands of children's lives . he has further added "Our motto is simple – Only Dil and no Bill."

Rtn. Nitish Lahiri

Rtn. Nitish Lahiri had been a lawyer, social worker and a cinematographer. He studied at New York Film Academy for the past four years of his career and specialized in creating incredible images – No matter what had been the camera.

He started his career as a Rotarian from the Rotary Club of Calcutta and had been the First Asian to be elected as the President of the Rotary International from 1962-63 for his commendable service to the community. The Government of India awarded him the third Civilian Award of the Padma Bhushan in 1963 for his remarkable service to the society.

Once he had asked – "What did Rotary teach you?" he answered – "Rotary has taught me how to tackle any critical or unpleasant situation with patience, sympathy and understanding."

Much sought, much admired Rtn. Nitish had been an inspiration to the Junior Rotarians for his unique philosophy – "Give yourselves away to maximize your efforts for a commendable service."

Helen Keller




Helen Keller had been an eminent author, disability rights advocate and a lecturer. In her 19 years of age she had suffered from a severe unknown fever which made her deaf, dumb and blind, but fortunately nature helped her to get an expert and kind teacher – Anne Massfield Sullivan.

She helped Helen Keller a lot to communicate with the outer world by motivating Miss Helen Keller to touch her lips and throat to perceive the pronounciation of each letter and word. Gradually she learnt sign by touch and Braille. language Unfortunately her pronunciation had not been perfect. But she struggled a lot throughout her life to vocalize her words. Sometimes she had become a victim of acute depression, but at the same time she knew how to come out from the depression and to lead a positive life.

Helen Keller had a deep connection with plants, birds and animals. One day Madam Sullivan took Miss Helen to a nearest water pump and placed her hands on sprouts where very cold water had been flowing. She felt very soothed to get the cold touch of water – at the spur of the moment unknowingly she uttered the word – w -a-t-e-r, first slowly and then rapidly. She had the feeling that cool something and peaceful substance had been flowing over her head and mind, this incident had pushed Helen Keller to pronounce words - though those had not been very audible to others. Sometimes she suffered from depression, but at the same time she knew how to come out from depression and used to lead a positive life.

The famous message of Helen Keller – "Never bend your head and mind, hold them high, keep your face to the sunshine, then you can not see the shadows."
