Toilet Project at The Refuge: President informed that our club had applied for the District Grant for making the toilets at Refuge as their conditions are not too favorable. After careful consideration it was decided that our club will not proceed with the district grant for toilet construction. We have secured sponsorship for the project, which allows us greater flexibility without the constraints of the district's terms. Now we'll be able to execute the project efficiently.
