Meeting called to order: President Rtn. Ankush Raman Khanna called the 2130th continuous and 8th meeting of 2023-2024 to order.

National Anthem: The National Anthem was rendered by all.

Confirmation of previous meeting minutes: The 2129th

continuous and 7th meeting minutes for the year 2023-2024 were passed and seconded by Rtn. Yugal Sikri and Rtn. Narinder Gulati respectively.

President's Address: President Khanna welcomed all members for the meeting and shared that the members of the Rotary Club of Victoria thanked us for our hospitality and expressed interest in collaborating on joint projects with our club in December.

Puja Parikrama with the Visually Impaired: President

Ankush Khanna, along with Rotarians Rakesh Khanna and Chetna Khanna, were present at Sealdah station to see off the bus carrying the boys from RKBBA and their families on a tour of the Durga Puja Pandals. The boys graciously expressed their gratitude for enabling them to experience the camaraderie and splendor of the pandals.

Tejaswini with Rotary Club of Calcutta Avyanna: President

Khanna provided an update on the collaborative project with RC Avyanna, organizing the Tejaswini Samman event during Durga Puja. This event, supported by the Supportact and Crafts Council of West Bengal, aims to honor and encourage the empowerment of women. The evaluation criteria for this project encompasses critical societal issues such as respecting women and supporting the girl child and the environment.

RCC Clinic: President Khanna informed the club about the operations and oversight of the clinic. He mentioned that Dr. Mittal had requested the revival of the Basic Medicine Bank at the clinic. 
