Malala Yousafzai – The Power of One Voice, The Light of Education

In a remote valley of Swat, Pakistan, where fear once silenced hope, a young girl dared to speak. Malala Yousafzai was born in 1997 into a world where extremist forces sought to suppress the most basic of human rights — the right to education, especially for girls.

At the tender age of 11, Malala began writing a courageous blog for the BBC, shedding light on the struggles faced by girls under the Taliban regime. Her words were more than just stories; they were acts of defiance against injustice. In a place where many were too afraid to speak, Malala's voice stood out — clear, strong, and unwavering.

In 2012, her activism nearly cost her life when extremists targeted her in an attempt to silence her. But instead of succumbing to fear, Malala rose stronger. Her recovery was not just physical but deeply symbolic — proof that the spirit of determination and hope cannot be broken. She co-founded the Malala Fund, tirelessly advocating for every child's right to quality education, particularly in regions where such a dream remains distant.

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Her unwavering efforts earned her global recognition in 2014, when she became the youngest-ever Nobel Peace Prize laureate at just 17 years of age.

Malala's story is far more than personal success. It is a testament to the profound truth that one voice, one choice, and one act of courage can ripple across the world and inspire change. She reminds us that education is not a privilege but a fundamental right, capable of dismantling ignorance, poverty, and extremism.

For us as Rotarians — committed to the ideals of service, peace, and community, Malala's journey is a beacon. It calls us to believe in the power of individual action, to invest in the education of the next generation, and to stand firm for justice even when the world turns a blind eye.

As we move forward in our mission to unite for good, may her story inspire us to take bold steps, however small, that leave an indelible impact on the world around us.

4. Fundraiser Update

President Hitesh Dani gave everyone the good news that the Mayor has agreed to inaugurate our Mega Fund Raiser along with our main Sponsor Mr Ajay Dattani from Mumbai and that he is also trying to get Leander Paes for the same. R.C.G.C. has agreed to provide the Golf Course free of cost for the Fund Raiser Golf Tournament and in return our club has to vaccinate the Caddies and Staff Children free of charge. Even Tolly club is charging only 60% for the Golf Course. As of now 35 registrations for the Tournament are already confirmed and paid and another 35 expected after which people who register will be on waitlist. Planning to have our Regular meeting also on same day after the Inauguration. We have already Raised 65 lacs and the expense for the Tournament is approximately 30/35 lacs so we can easily manage to get 1000 vaccinations.

6. Puja Parikrama for the Blind People

President Hitesh spoke about the Puja Parikrama which is organised by Midtown every year for 50 Blind People. We provide the Air-condition Bus and some Food Packets and the Blind People along with Volunteers are taken to some main Pandals. The programme starts at 9.30am and ends by 5pm.

7. Cleft Lip Awareness Camp at Maheshtala

Rtn Preeti informed everyone present about this Project where 10,000 pamphlets are distributed before the Camp Date and 21 Babies were identified for the Cleft Lip Surgery which Midtown Funds. The Health Camp costs Rs 25,000 and the surgery costs 40,000/-
