Our Club maintained its commitment to community service and impactful projects throughout November and December. We continued to focus on our ongoing initiatives, and as we blinked, the year seemed to vanish before our eyes! We are now in 2025 and I am overwhelmed to note that 6 months of the Rotary year are already over.

Service Projects undertaken in November & December:

- In the second phase of the club foot project with M/s Cure (India), we sponsored the foot abduction braces for another 50 children.
- A survey was conducted at Salpukuria, Nepalgunge where work has commenced in the construction of two submersible tubewells and two Community baths. The entire project is being very generously supported by the "Dil se Foundation".
- Camps related to Cervical Cancer Vaccination and Breast Cancer Awareness were conducted at Joynagar. This was followed up with the 1st dose vaccination for 130 girls.
- Our club donated IT equipment at the Indian Institute of Cerebral Palsy. Members interacted with their students who show remarkable resilience and fortitude despite their challenges.
- Free distribution of the reusable "Stree" sanitary pads was undertaken at Joynagar.
- The regular schemes of Anjali & Annapurna Yojana, for economic upliftment were continued at Amoragori Vriddhashram.

Regular meetings were held with some very interesting speakers like PDG Rajendra Khandelwal who spoke on Karma, Babar Ali of Anand Shiksha Niketan, recognised as the younger headmaster by BBC, and Dr. Shruti Nada Poddar who spoke on Nada Vibronics and sound therapy. In December we had the very engaging speaker Shri Ritesh Bawri, entrepreneur and health wizard. The last regular meeting was a heritage walk named "Chowrenghee Chase" with Ms. Navpreet Arora ending with breakfast at the iconic Flurys.

The club embarked on its annual retreat, "Awadh Se Ayodhya Tak," a journey to Lucknow and Ayodhya. This three-night excursion was met with resounding success and provided members with a deeply enriching and enjoyable experience. The retreat likely included cultural immersion, historical exploration, and opportunities for bonding and fellowship.

DISEASE PREVENTION

Cervical Cancer Vaccination Camp - Amoragori

On November 8, 2024, a cervical cancer vaccination camp was successfully organized at Amoragori. A total of 45 girls were vaccinated during this session, adding to the 322 girls previously vaccinated under the project. The initiative aims to vaccinate 1,200 girls aged between 9 to 14 years to combat cervical cancer and promote disease prevention in the community this Rotary year.



Cervical Cancer Awareness Camp with Stree Sanitary Napkins - Joynagar



On December 4, 2024, Rotary Club of Calcutta Chowrenghee and Narayana Health collaborated to organize a series of health awareness programs in Joynagar. The cervical cancer awareness camp was conducted at Joynagar Institution for Girls, focusing on educating women and girls about cervical cancer prevention. Additionally, 460 reusable sanitary napkins were distributed to underprivileged women and girls to promote menstrual hygiene and reduce the environmental impact of disposable products.

Cervical Cancer Vaccination Camp - Joynagar

A cervical cancer vaccination camp was held on December 19, 2024, at Joynagar, with active support from the Rotary Joynagar Eye Hospital RCC members. Out of the 400 attendees, 140 girls were successfully vaccinated within a span of 2.5 hours. The camp witnessed the presence and efforts of PP Manisha Srivastava and PP Vikram Tantia, who contributed to its seamless execution.





Monthly visit to Kolkata Swasthya Sankalp
