An unique initiative, "Project Muskaan" was organised for our children of Rotary Chowrenghee Vidyalaya to get them new clothes before the ensuing festive season. The children's excitement and joyful smiles created a truly magical atmosphere.

The Rotary Charity Bowl 2024, held on September 29th at "That Place" arena, was a successful fundraising event that also fostered a strong sense of camaraderie and excitement among participants. The event's unique format effectively combined the goals of raising funds for charitable causes with creating a fun and engaging experience for everyone involved.
