



Eye Checkup Camp and Polyclinic for 700 beneficiaries. This camp was conducted along with RCC Manan and 77 BSF base. In the Camp we provided for; General Health Checkups and distribution of medicine according to their health requirements. **Eye checkups:** spectacles were prescribed, 48 were delivered on the spot, while 57 were scheduled for a later delivery, 21 patients received eye care medication, 27 patients were identified for eye surgeries.
