PROJECT HPV VACCINE AT ST.XAVIER'S COLLEGE

DATE: 29th July 2025

TIME: 10:30 A.M to 12:30 P.M

VENUE: Room-15, St.Xavier's College, Park Street.

BENEFICIARIES: Girl students of the College (between the age group of 19 to 23 years)

An Awareness Programme on "Cervical Cancer, its chances of occurrence and prevention" was conducted at St.Xavier's College, Park Street, by Rotary Club of Calcutta South West in June 2025, the main speaker being Rtn Dr.Susmita Mitra Banerjee, Director Community Service (Medical). Convinced by the programme, 29 girls from the College agreed to take the vaccine. Representatives of Serum Institute of India Pvt. Ltd and President Rtn Ruma Mitra, Hony. Secretary Rtn Samir Sur, Rtn Dr.Susmita Mitra Banerjee and Rtn Prosenjit Sarker monitored and conducted the procedure and vaccinated the girls with the 1st dose. Dates for the 2nd and 3rd doses were written in their vaccine cards for which we will have to go back to St.Xavier's College again.



MADARTALA MEGA HEALTH CAMP

Our 1st Half Yearly Mega Health Camp was organized today (3rd August 2025) at the Madartala Bazar Boys' Club from 11:00 A.M to 1:30 P.M. The beneficiaries were the slum dwellers of the locality. 3 doctors—GP Rtn Dr.Jaydev Sengupta, Dermatologist Rtn Dr.Siddhartha S Das and Gynecologist Rtn Dr.Susmita Mitra, checked the people who attended. 12 students from the Microbiology Department of St.Xavier's College along with their HOD, PP Rtn Dr.Arup Kr Mitra, did Blood Group testing, random Blood Sugar and Blood Pressure tests on the attendees. Dr.Siddhartha distributed relevant medicines to all those who came to him with skin problem. Some were referred to Bangur Hospital for medical tests. In all over 90 people registered and attended today's Health Camp.

1st to 7th August is observed as Mother and Child Health Week and World Breastfeeding Week. We also observed this occasion in association with Bengal Obstetrics and Gynecological Society (BOGS). Pediatrician Dr. Amit Vikram Das and Gynecologist Rtn Dr.Susmita were in charge. In all, 9 children came with their mothers to the doctors. We were honoured to have with us today, President of BOGS Dr. MMS Zoha, at the Project sight. This year the entire Madartala Health Camp Project was a joint venture of Rotary Club of Calcutta South West and Bengal Obstetrics and Gynecological Society.

Both the Projects went off smoothly and were successful.

Our special thanks go out to Rtn Mohua Das, for organizing both the Projects so well, to Rtn Dr.Jaydev Sengupta, PP Rtn Dr.Arup Kr. Mitra (along with his students), Rtn Dr.Siddhartha S Das, Rtn Dr.Susmita Mitra and Dr.Amit Vikram Das for being the main heroes of today's Health Camp.

KNOW YOUR INDIA- the Chenchu Tribe of Andhra Pradesh.

Dear Friend's- I had the opportunity to carry out field work in parts of NALLAMALAI Hills with Dense forests of Andhra Pradesh

I came across the Tribe called CHENCHU's-- what surprised at first was the women wearing almost the same ornament's- as I saw the Bhil's n Garasia's of Rajasthan. My first impression was- whether they are the tribes migrated as gypsies from Rajasthan- but my thought was wrong.

The Chenchus are Adivasi, a designated Scheduled Tribe in the Indian states of Andhra Pradesh, Telengana, Karnataka and Odisha. They are an aboriginal tribe whose traditional way of life is based on hunting and gathering. The Chenchus speak the Chenchu language, a member of the Dravidian language family. In general, the Chenchu relationship to non-tribal people has been largely symbiotic. Some Chenchus have continued to specialize in collecting forest products for sale to non-tribal people. Many Chenchus live in the dense Nallamalai forest of Andhra Pradesh.

The Chenchus are referred to as one of the Primitive Tribal Groups that are still dependent on forests and do not cultivate land but hunt for a living. Non-tribe people living among them rent land from the Chenchus and pay a portion of the harvest. Other people also settled among them with the help of the Chenchus and learned agriculture from them, and the nomadic Banjara herders who graze their cattle in the forest also have been allotted land there. The Chenchus have responded unenthusiastically to government efforts to induce them to take up agriculture themselves

Chenchus are a Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Group whose hamlets or Pentas dot the Nallamala forest range spread across four to five districts in Telengana and Andhra Pradesh states. They are inveterate forest dwellers, who have, over centuries, steadfastly refused to move out of their woods regardless of the perils of such life. If patriotism be defined as love for the land, Chenchus are patriots in true spirit. The non-resident war cries on social media over imagined boundaries are no match for their raw affinity to forests where they live without basic facilities.
