PRESIDENT'S THOUGHTS

I read an article in the Rotary News, September 2024 written by Rtn Aniruddha RoyChowdhury RI Director 2023-2025, which I would like to share. In his article he mentions that September 2024 is the Basic Education and Literacy month of Rotary International and that there is a need to address educational disparities, particularly those based on gender.

As one would agree that even today the literacy rates are substantially lower for women than for men. This lopsided means of education ignores the fact that women are generally responsible for the education of their children. It is the literate women who will be able transfer the skills to their children ensuring that the next generation will achieve higher rate of literacy. Education will also enable and empower the women to identify their own skills, knowledge and abilities to make their own decisions. It will give them self-esteem, confidence to face society and participate in community development.

Women's equality and empowerment (SDG 5) is also one of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals of the United Nations.

FROM THE SECRETARY'S DESK

Today, I would like to speak about my Alumnus, La Martiniere Kolkata. It is considered to be among the best day schools in India. La Martiniere Schools have a rich history that began in 1836 with the generous bequest of a French soldier and philanthropist, Major General Claude Martin. He was born and brought up in Lyon, France. In 1752 the 17 year old Frenchman came to India as a humble private in the armies of the East India Company. Claude Martin was no ordinary soldier, he rose rapidly to the rank of Major General and also spent many years in the service of Shuja-ud-Daulah, the Nawab of Oudh. He died in September 1800 leaving behind a property worth over half a million pounds sterling to start schools in Lucknow, Calcutta and Lyon, his native land of France.



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Claude Martin's will. Finally as a result of a Supreme Court decision, La Martiniere Schools opened in Calcutta on 1st March 1836. **Initially only Europeans and Armenian** Christians were permitted into the schools. In 1935, Indian students of any religious denomination were allowed in. The schools are controlled by the Anglican Church of North India and are independent from the Government. English is the primary language of instruction. La Martiniere Kolkata has a very wide spectrum of co curricular activities which receive as much importance as the academic disciplines. Among the best Girls' schools in India, the Subdivision has ranked La Martiniere for Girls Kolkata 2nd followed by JB Petit Mumbai (3rd), Carmel Convent Chandigarh (4th) and Loreto House Middleton Row Kolkata (5th).
