

The crowning moment, however, was further delayed as the Charter certificate embarked on a 51-day journey before finding its way to the shores of Calcutta, where it was warmly received by the founder president and members with a profound sense of accomplishment and pride. In an unanimous decision, the founders chose the 5th of August as the day of celebration for the Charter, a poignant tribute to the enduring spirit, remarkable journey, and remarkable accomplishments of the Rotary Club of Belur that continues to inspire generations of Rotarians and community members alike.

# Minutes of meeting no 2530<sup>th</sup> Regular Club Meeting held on Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> July 2024, 5.00 pm at Hotel Hindustan International

President Anand Agarwal started the meeting with overview of Club Projects, District Projects and Global Grant Projects.

# 1. Club Projects:

Under Club projects updates were given about

- i) Upcoming Hospital Project at Uluberia
- ii) Belur Seva Kendra project which is situated on Basanti Highway
- iii) Wash Project in Kulgamini School at Liluah
- iv) Fund Raising Projects through organizing events
- v) Restarting of RCC at Uluberia
- vi) Starting a new Interact at Kulgamini School at Liluah
- vii) Blood donation camps to be organized at our RCC
- viii) Eye camps through RCC

### 2. District Projects:

- i) Mosquito Net Project
  - Past President Kunal Ved suggested on distributing mosquito net which would be chemically treated.
- ii) Suggestion came from members to involve partner clubs to do joint projects. It would achieve in doing projects of larger scale.

### 3. Existing Foundation and Global Grant Projects

- i) Past President Vishnu dl Dhandania gave an overview of what Global Grant was for the benefit of the new members joined recently. He spoke about Future Vision Program of Big Sustainable Projects. He highlighted that the project should be of a minimum of US Dollars 35000 which is the requirement to apply for Global Grant. He also added that a club can have ten Global Grant Projects at a time.
- ii) Our Club has two exiting Global Grant Project which are
  - a) Cervical Cancer Vaccination
  - b) Nigerian Chil Cardiac Surgery
  - c) Past President Ajay Agarwal informed that the Global Grant project on Wash 3 is also on application stage and should be approved in the next 4 – 6 weeks.

### 4. Future projects Projects planned under Global Grant


- i) Upgradation of library situated in Jadavpur University Past President Vishnu JI Dhandania spoke about the library project that has been taken up by our club in association with the Jadavpur Global Alumni association and our project partner Ranjit Chakravarti from USA who is also part of the association and informed the members about the progress of it.
- ii) President Anand Agarwal said a Safe Drinking Water Project should be taken up with Non-Rotarians.
- iii) Rain Water Harvesting and Fruit Tree Plantation in Villages was discussed by Director Environment Rtn Santosh ji Mohta
- iv) Avoidable Blindness Project with Susrut Hospital should be continued was said by few members. This time the project would be focused at a district or a block with a target of complete eradication of avoidable blindness in the district or block.

# 5. Projects to be Taken up in the coming months:

- i) Blood Donation Project One camp every month starting from September 2024
- ii) Organ Donation Awareness program to be started collaborating with Charnok Hospital
- iii) Bharat Vikas Parishad (Home for under privileged children) President Anand Expressed his eagerness to Past President Amarnath ji who runs this Special Home to help in this project whenever needed.
- iv) Immediate Past President Amar Malhotra gave his views on visiting 10 15 schools and identify children in need of the Cervical Vaccination. Bhanu babu also gave an idea of going to the schools where we have done Wash Projects and to identify children for cervical vaccination.
- v) Solar Project Installing of Solar Energy in Villages was discussed where a committee should be made to do a reccee.
- 6. The CSR grant system of the foundation was discussed at length. Projects was discussed where a company has to contribute US Dollars 21000 to the foundation in a pre-specified project for which the club would get back US Dollars 20000 dollars within 15 days for implementation of the project. Rtn Rashmi Patwari and Rtn B.D.Agarwal showed their interest in contributing in the CSR based Project.
