




DISTRIBUTION OF RATION


DISTRIBUTION OF BLANKETS AND GAU SEVA AT ADVAPITH

IMPLEMENTATION MEETING FOR UPGRADING JADAUPUR UNIVERSITY'S ACCESSIBLE LIBRARY

The Rotary Global Grant project to upgrade the Accessible Library at Jadavpur University is a collaborative initiative between the Rotary Club of Belur (District 3291), Kolkata, and the Rotary Club of Danville San Ramon (District 5160), USA, with support from several Kolkata-based and US based Rotary Clubs and the Global Jadavpur University Alumni Foundation (GJUAF) along with Georgia Chapter of Alumni. This project, approved by The Rotary Foundation on January 14, 2025, aims to benefit 125 visually impaired students and research scholars at Jadavpur University while extending accessibility to similar students from other institutions.

The project includes renovating facilities, installing high-end equipment and tactile pathways, soundproofing audiobook cubicles, and training staff and students to maximize the new resources.

On January 21, 2025, a pivotal implementation meeting was held at Jadavpur University, attended by prominent Rotarians, including Rtn Anand Agarwal, President; Rtn Vishnu Dhandhania, Project Chair and PP Rtn Amitabh Mohan, from Rotary Club of Belur. Rtn Subashis Haldar, President, Rtn Srikanta Basu Mallick, Rtn Shubadip Roy, Rtn Ram Prasad Chattopadhyay from Rotary Club of Calcutta North East, Rtn Biren Mallick, Rtn. Syamal Bhattacharya, from Rotary Club of Calcutta South City Towers. The meeting was also attended by Ms. Alokeparna Ghosh, the Project Manager.

From the university, Dr Amitava Datta, Pro Vice Chancellor, Prof Rajyaeshwar Sinha, Accessible Library in-Charge, Dr. Indrajit Banerjee, Registrar and several other notable officials were present. The meeting highlighted Rotary's commitment and unity in supporting inclusive education.

Discussions covered the project's scope and timeline, with actionable points identified. Attendees visited the library, inspected the existing facilities, and engaged with students to understand their needs. Notably, Rtn Anand Agarwal, President of RC Belur, committed to providing additional air conditioners requested by the university.

This productive session reaffirmed Rotary's dedication to fostering accessibility in education for all.
