4. President's Address

President Rtn. Anand Agarwal welcomed all present, with special mention of the JCI dignitaries:

It was a delightful surprise to discover that nine Belurians, including the undersigned, were associated with Jaycees during their younger days. A wonderful reminder of shared journeys and lasting connections!

President Reports:

The President reported that two additional cervical cancer vaccination camps were conducted post the DG visit:

- * Camp 1: 79 girls vaccinated
- * Camp 2: 137 girls vaccinated

He appreciated the commitment of club members and affirmed the continuation of these camps post summer vacations.

Upgradation of Accessible Library at Jadavpur University

The Accessible Library at Jadavpur University, established in 2018 within the Centre of Disability, faced major challenges including outdated equipment and long delays in Braille conversion. A turning point came when JU Pro Vice Chancellor Prof. Amitava Datta connected with Dr. Ranjit Chakravorti (President, Global JU Alumni Foundation USA), who involved the Rotary Club of Danville San Ramon and Rotary Club of Belur. The initiative soon evolved into a Rotary Global Grant project, with support from several other Rotary Clubs and JU alumni groups.

Led by Rotarian Vishnu Dhandhania and managed by Co-Chair PP Rtn Amitabh Mohan, the project secured Rs 38 lakh funding and was implemented in just three months. Inaugurated on 2nd May 2025, the upgraded library now features advanced assistive technologies including Braille E-Motion devices, DAISY players, video magnifiers, high-speed Braille embossers, and transliteration software, significantly enhancing accessibility for visually impaired students.

5. Guest Introduction & Felicitation

Past President Rtn. Shankar Ramalingam introduced the environmentalist Mr. Sanjay Jaisingh, applauding his notable work in urban afforestation and green activism in Kolkata, particularly his collaboration with government departments and swift interventions.

Mr. Jaisingh was honoured with a Rotary lapel pin (Mother Teresa Badge) and a token of appreciation, presented by seniormost member Rtn. Bubna ji .

Guest Speaker Highlight – Mr. Sanjay Jaisingh

Mr. Sanjay Jaisingh, founder of Mithri Mitti — meaning "Sweet Soil" in Sindhi — shared his inspiring journey towards environmental sustainability and community development. The organisation has set an ambitious goal of planting 10 million trees, with a unique emphasis on education and community empowerment.

Key initiatives include:

- * Public education on the benefits of plantation.
- * Empowering children to become environmental stewards, especially in Surjyapur.
- * Plant distribution drives to encourage greenery.
- * Environmental Warriors Programme, training children on:
 - * The importance of trees and sustainability,
 - * The legacy of the Chipko Movement,
 - * Celebrating the Mango Eating Festival,
 - * Understanding seed value and sapling transformation.

Notable achievements:

- * Development of two free fruit forests in Surjyapur.
- * Replantation of trees across Kolkata with a success rate exceeding 95%.

His presentation received enthusiastic appreciation from members for its impact-driven model and practical grassroots approach.

6. Guest Remarks - Mr. Sanjay Ji Singh

Mr. Singh delivered a brief yet powerful message on the interdependence between humans and nature. He emphasised that:

"We breathe in what trees breathe out – we are all connected." He urged the audience to act locally for global environmental well-being.

7. Introduction of Chief Speaker - Sandeep Sengupta

Rtn.PP SHANKAR RAMALINGAM introduced the keynote speaker Mr. Sandeep Sengupta, School of Anti-Hacking (ISOAH) and a highly respected figure in the field of

cybersecurity. He is a Certified Ethical Hacker and CISA, and holds lead auditor certifications in Information Security (ISO 27001), Data Protection & Privacy/GDPR (ISO 27701), and Business Continuity (ISO 22301).

With over 26 years of experience in the information security industry across New Zealand, Singapore, and India, Mr. Sengupta has audited major organisations including PwC, KPMG, Tata Steel, SAIL, Capgemini, Genpact, ITC, Airtel, Vodafone, ONGC, National Power Grid, Bandhan Bank, PayU, Vedanta, and Accenture.

He collaborates closely with the CID and Lalbazar Police and has actively participated in cyber cell raids. His industry affiliations include:

- * Secretary ISACA Kolkata Chapter
- * Committee Member PRSI Kolkata Chapter
- * Committee Member Indian Chamber of Commerce

8. Keynote Speech: Cybersecurity Awareness – Mr. Sandeep Sengupta

Mr. Sengupta delivered a deeply insightful talk on digital safety. Key highlights:

a. Real-Life Examples of Data Breaches:


- * Domino's: Over 1 million users' data hacked
- * Zomato: 17 million records leaked
- * Air India: 45 lakh passengers' data exposed
- * Truecaller: 273 million records sold on the dark web

b. Live Demo:

Using a volunteer's phone number and email ID, Mr. Sandeep Sengupta demonstrated how quickly sensitive personal details

c. Key Takeaways:

- 1. Do not reuse passwords.
- 2. Enable Two-Factor Authentication (2FA).
- 3. Store backup codes securely.
- 4. Use strong, unique passwords for Wi-Fi.
- 5. Regularly check for data leaks.
- 6. Be cautious with CCTV access and mobile sync.
- 7. Avoid using mobile numbers as passwords.

8. Use password managers or secure offline storage.

The speaker conducted a powerful live demo, even revealing passwords to illustrate real-world vulnerabilities. He shared several useful hints on how to connect or raise complaints regarding cyber threats, and strongly advised members to be extremely cautious with their Aadhaar cards.

The session ended with a reminder:

"If a product or service is free, you are the product."

9. Reflections & Vote of Thanks

President Anand reflected on the relevance of cybersecurity in daily life. He acknowledged the startling nature of the revelations and thanked Mr. Sandeep Sengupta for the eye-opening presentation. He also reminded members of the ever-present risks in today's geopolitical and social climate.

A light-hearted closing remark noted that the meeting had started 5 minutes early and ended 45 minutes late—both rare milestones.

10. Formal Closure

The President officially declared the 2551st Regular Meeting closed and invited members and guests to join for high tea and fellowship.
