### MEGA VACCINATION CAMP AT SWAIKA SCHOOL ON 3<sup>RD</sup> SEPTEMBER 2024 WHERE 154 GIRLS WERE VACCINATED

On 3rd September 2024, a mega HPV vaccination camp was successfully conducted at Swaika Girls High School in Liluah, Howrah. The event was organized by the Rotary Club of Belur as part of the "Cervical Cancer Prevention Project," under the Rotary Global Grant initiative. This camp marked the largest event in the series since the project began in June 2024.

The vaccination drive followed an awareness camp held at the school on 10th August 2024, which saw a significant turnout of over 300 parents, students, and teachers. Despite being organized on short notice and without a dedicated professional team, the awareness camp was a success, as evidenced by the positive response from attendees. Key contributors to the awareness camp included President Rtn Anand Agarwal, Project Chair Vishnu Dhandhania, Bhanu Babu, Co-Chair Tarun Pal, and Anju Mitra, who engaged the audience with insightful discussions. Headmistress Sumana Sarkar played a vital role in coordinating the event, sharing technical insights based on her research.

At the vaccination camp, 154 girl students aged 9-14 were vaccinated by the medical team from Narayana Hospital, led by Supervisor Bandana Mahanti. The team consisted of three nurses, one administrative staff member, and a doctor. Project Manager Alokeparna Ghosh was present throughout the event to oversee operations and ensure efficiency and safety.

The camp was well-attended by Rotarians, including President Anand Agarwal, First Lady Chhaya Agarwal, Project Chair Vishnu Dhandhania, IPP Amar Malhotra, Rtn Swati Malhotra, Co-chair Tarun Kr Pal, Rtn Divisha, Rtn Anju Maitra, Rtn Pratima, Rtn Kunal, Rtn Prashant, Rtn Manish, Rtn Kailash T, and Rtn Sanjay B. The presence of Past District Governor (PDG) Mukul Sinha provided additional inspiration and support to all attendees.





This vaccination camp marked the completion of vaccinations for 266 girls across three schools, contributing significantly to the project's overall target of vaccinating 1,200 girls. With a 12-month duration for the project, progress is on track, with more awareness camps scheduled in two additional schools and further vaccination camps planned.



The camp exemplifies the collaborative efforts of Rotary clubs and partners to make a meaningful impact in the fight against cervical cancer. The initiative aims to vaccinate over 1,200 girls across nine schools in the neighboring districts of Kolkata, including Howrah, Hooghly, and South 24 Parganas, to protect them from cervical cancer and promote a healthier future.

# **Sanitary Napkins Distribution**

On 1st September sanitary pads were distributed by Rotary Club of Belur at Soumyaloke Biswaseva Niketan (Rajpur Area) - an orphanage for girls in Kolkata.

Sanitary pad distribution refers to the effort to provide menstrual hygiene products, primarily sanitary pads, to ladies / girls who need them, focusing on those in low-income communities. The aim is to address menstrual health management, reduce period poverty, and improve access to these essential products, ensuring that menstruation ( periods) does not become a barrier to education, work, or daily life.
