





WORKSHOP ON TECHNOLOGICAL SOLUTIONS TO DISASTERS USING STEM KITS

A hands-on workshop titled "Technological Solutions to Disasters Using STEM Kits" was conducted by Dr. Mousiki Kar, Associate Professor of Electronics and Communication Engineering from Heritage Institute of Technology for the students of Classes VIII to XI of PACE Learning Centre (PLC) on May 14, 2025 at our school campus. The session focused on the importance of disaster preparedness and demonstrated how STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) can be effectively used to develop low-cost technological solutions for real-world problems.

The workshop began with an interactive introduction to natural and man-made disasters, emphasizing their impact and the urgent need for early detection and rapid response systems. Students learned about various types of disasters including earthquakes, floods, gas leaks, and cyclones, and how technological interventions can minimize the risks.

The core of the workshop centered around hands-on activities, where students explored and built simple yet functional alert systems using STEM kits assisted by the volunteers.

These included:

- Gas Leak Alarm System using MQ-2 gas sensors
- Earthquake Alert System using vibration sensors
- Flood Alert System with moisture sensors
- Automatic Street Light using light-dependent resistors (LDR)

Participants were introduced to basic circuit-building skills and the concept of sensors-devices that detect physical changes in the environment and trigger alarms or responses accordingly. Students actively engaged in building circuits, adjusting sensitivity through potentiometers, and understanding the practical applications of each system.

After the hands-on session, an assessment was conducted to evaluate students' understanding and application of the concepts introduced during the workshop. Volunteers assisted the students in comprehending the Chat GPT prompts provided as part of the questionnaire. This ensured that the students could engage meaningfully with the AI-based questions and apply their learning effectively. The questionnaire was thoughtfully designed with relevant and insightful questions, allowing students to demonstrate their grasp of the workshop content. Their enthusiastic participation and thoughtful responses reflected their genuine interest and growing confidence in using technological tools for academic and real-world applications

The workshop not only helped develop technical skills but also fostered problem-solving, collaboration, and innovation among students. It concluded with a discussion on the future scope of using advanced sensors and microcontrollers to improve the efficiency of these systems.

This initiative by the Heritage team provided students with valuable insights into how science and technology

can be harnessed for community safety and resilience. It was an enriching experience that encouraged young minds to think critically and creatively about solutions to global challenges. Thanks a lot to Dr. Mousiki Kar and her team of volunteers from Heritage Institute and of course our president Rtn. Jayanta Chatterji Sir who was present throughout the session and expressed a keen interest in conducting such training and activities systematically, emphasizing the importance of continuity and sustainability in skill development. This enthusiastic support highlights a shared vision to empower students with practical knowledge and ensure long-term impact through regular engagement.
