INAUGURATION OF SCIENCE AND SKILL LAB EQUIPMENT - 14.12.2025

Under Helping Grant No. 0500 from the East India Rotary Welfare Trust (EIRWT), the Rotary Club provided Science and Skill Lab equipment at Adhigam Bhoomi School under the Help Us Help Them initiative. This equipment will be of immense value to junior students, helping them learn the basics of science through practical exposure. It will encourage hands-on learning, foster curiosity, collaboration and problem-solving, and help develop essential life skills that empower students well beyond the classroom.

Founded in 2006, HELP US HELP THEM has been providing free education to marginalized children for nearly two decades. The organisation runs the Rural Mallickpur School and the School-on-Wheels programme, which brings learning opportunities directly to street children from some of the most remote and underrepresented communities. In addition, the organisation operates a free residential learning centre, "Adhigam Bhoomi," which empowers over 1,000 children by providing them with opportunities to learn, grow and transform their lives through education. This

inspiring initiative was founded by Ms. Mukta Gupta, Founder President of Help Us Help Them.

The students of Adhigam Bhoomi showed great enthusiasm on seeing the newly installed equipment and eagerly began working with it. The project was also supported by the Inner Wheel Club of Calcutta Metropolitan and funded through a grant from EIRWT, for which we express our sincere gratitude.

INAUGURATION OF "SOLAR-ON-WHEELS" PROJECT - 14.12.2025

The much-awaited project "Solar-on-Wheels", conceived by HELP US HELP THEM, is a visionary initiative that brings mobile classrooms to street children across Kolkata, ensuring access to education regardless of location or circumstance. With quarterly examinations conducted to monitor academic progress, the project currently benefits more than 280 street children. The organisation is now focusing on ensuring the long-term sustainability of one of these buses.

In the initial phase of the programme, every time the bus halted, it had to be recharged using conventional electricity. This resulted in high recurring costs and a significant dependence on external power sources, making operations expensive and energy-intensive. With the installation of the solar power system, this dependency has been drastically reduced. The buses can now generate their own power, substantially lowering electricity expenses while making the project financially viable and environmentally sustainable.

Under Helping Grant No. 0500 from the East India Rotary Welfare Trust (EIRWT), the Rotary Club provided solar panels on school buses serving children in Rajabazar, Park Circus, Mullick Bazar, Sovabazar, Bagbazar, Belghacia and Hastings, under the Help Us Help Them initiative.

The School-on-Wheels programme is a powerful step towards addressing the educational gap faced by street children who otherwise have no means to access formal education and often grow up uneducated and unskilled. The uninterrupted solar-powered energy supply ensures proper lighting, fans and computers, enabling quality education for longer hours. The solar equipment installed

on the buses provides seamless and sustainable energy, significantly enhancing the learning environment.

Founded in 2006, HELP US HELP THEM has been providing free education to marginalized children for nearly two decades. This noble project involves the installation of a 1.80 kW renewable energy solar power plant on the rooftop of a school bus, along with ancillary equipment including a lithium-ion solar battery. The project received generous support from the Inner Wheel Club of Calcutta Metropolitan and was funded through a grant from EIRWT, for which we express our sincere gratitude.

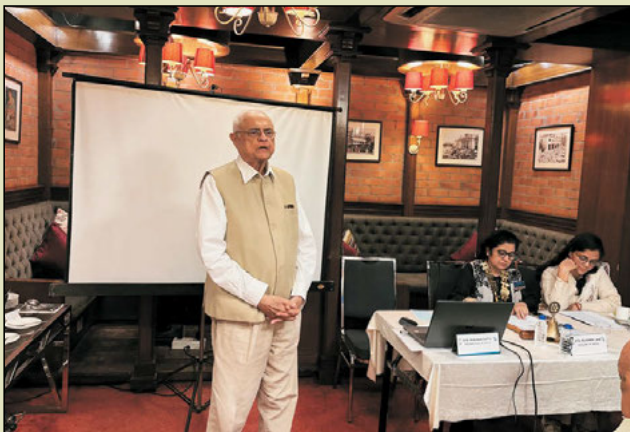

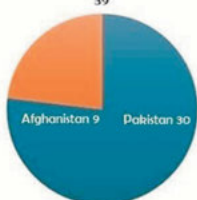

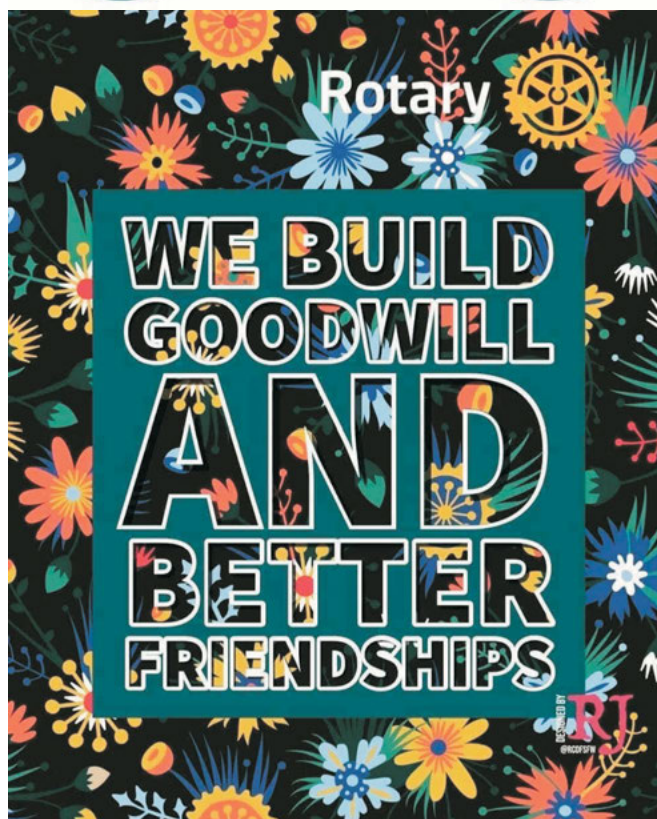

DISTRIBUTION OF DRY RATION AT NABADIGANTA LEPROSY COLONY ON 25.12.2025



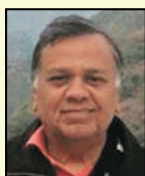
