LISTENING: THE KEY TO PARENTING - AN IMPORTANT LESSON

"Parenting is unique, because every parent is raising a unique child." Our Guest Speaker Smt Satabdi Bhattacharjee, Principal of South City International School started her session on topic "LISTENING-THE KEY TO THE PARENTING" on 14.12.2024, with a story of a complaint that came from a parent after their daughter studying in 2nd standard was given a chocolate by a senior student, a boy studying in 7th standard and blown out of proportion making it an issue of a good touch bad touch, blaming the school for the child not sharing this with the parent as they found it in her bag, forcing the management to take action against the boy. She shared her observations that in reactions like this parent are not teaching the child to receive unconditional love instead we are convincing the child that it is a vicious world where a 7-year-old cannot take a chocolate from a 12-year-old.

We are also depriving a child of social love, because it takes a village to raise a child. She shared one of the most important life skills a parent needs to help a child learn is to prepare the child to defend themselves as that makes them more capable when they move out into the world, where the parents would not have any control. In the situation shared above, the child was not given a listening to understand child's reason for her actions or given right guidance to handle such situations in future, possibly one of the reasons the child did not feel safe to share the incident with the parents.

She mentioned grandparents play a major role in defining the listening skills of a child, because grandparents give the child active listening, empathetic listening, listening to solve the problem compared to parents who listen to their child as a task amongst many other activities they are trying to complete simultaneously, missing out on the red flags. In some cases, parents think parenting is entitlement about imposing their views on the child and children learn to follow the same as they learn more by observing.

Parents can help more by giving them complete listening and being present to their actions. She gave the example where grandfather came to the school to express his concern. He felt the granddaughter was being bullied in

school just by observing her behaviour and actions. To the surprise of the teachers, they found that it was happening and they took corrective actions on same.

She cited another example of the sports day. For the primary classes, extra chairs need to be added. For classes 4, 5, 6 gallery is full, for classes 8, 9, 10, 11, the gallery is empty. The solution is in involving the grandparents in raising the child as they can be there, as they remain genuinely excited, filling the inner most need of the child for validation. She mentioned emotional abuse is the toughest of all the abuses and giving them lot of love in form of hugs, appreciation, goes a long way in making them emotionally strong. She said parents need to get into reflective practice. Parents cannot tell a child to not use mobile phone when they are using the same all the time.

Parents cannot expect children to say sorry when they do not say it when they make mistakes. She said another danger lies in letting a child believe they have their own space, rather than giving them a sense of responsibility helping them realise they are in shared space that belongs to the parents. This makes them aloof with no need to share their life leading the parents to miss the red flags, which become evident only when situation goes out of control. There is either zero percent parenting or hundred percent parenting and nothing in between.

We as adults are responsible for what the world has become, children are fine, they are great and we need to stop blaming them. Parents lose their children in their inability to listen to them. Need of the hour is reflective parenting with the required skills of learning to be silent, making efforts to be soft and giving undivided listening to help a child blossom into their best versions.

At the end of the session, many of us, including me were missing our grandparents but the bigger joy was seeing the smiles on the faces of the Metropolitans, especially who are grandparents, feeling the validation, they were doing something so right in shaping the lives of their dearly loved grandchildren.

Four enthusiastic batches named Orange, Navy Blue, Firoza Blue, and Golden Yellow embarked on a journey that would change their lives forever- the pursuit of self-awareness. Forty Rotary clubs marked the occasion, and combined goodwill made Unmesh happen. To showcase how extracurriculars along with imagination and vision can transform tomorrow into a better future, with goals primarily to inculcate leadership, inspiration, and of course joy.

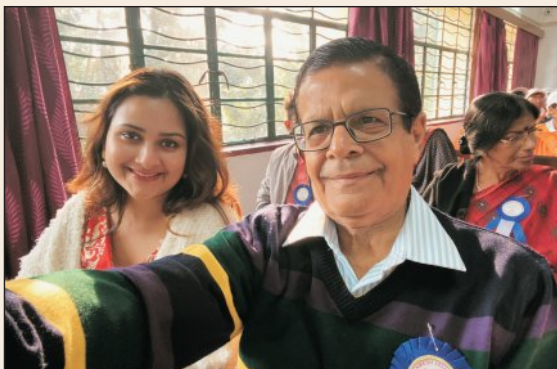
