VOCATIONAL EXCELLENCE AWARDS CEREMONY ON 11.1.2025

The 1691st Regular Meeting of RCCM, headed by President Rtn Sashi Dhacholia and Secretary Rtn Rajiv Tibrewal, celebrated 'Vocational Service month' by honouring individuals from various fields for their contributions through an award ceremony conducted by PP Rtn Subir Dutta.



DR VK NEVATIA

Year 2025's award winners felicitation for Vocational awards began with Rtn Dr VK Nevatia nominated for his lifetime service as consultant orthopaedic surgeon. His introduction and journey was shared by PP

Rtn Raju Poddar, from being born in Bhatinda, Punjab, to completing his medical education in Patiala, working in Delhi, Iran, Kolkata.

Chairman Emeritus, Mahavir Seva Sadan, Shri JS Mehta, spoke about their 40 years association and shared how Dr VK Nevatia, was invited by MSS, agreed to serve as medical director. He helped with polio corrective surgeries and played a key role in 4 lakh artificial limbs donated till date. He has been recognised by President of India for his contribution. The service provided by him is worth crores which he makes it priceless with his attitude to serve with a smile. His service extended beyond humans and the beneficiaries of his service have been horse and dogs too.

Dr Nevatia shared how the core value of giving and doing good was imbibed in him in his childhood which subconsciously guided him through various decisions in life. It was destiny that brought him to Kolkata and it is the company of good friends in Rotary and MSS that led him to contribute. It was persuasion by his wife, Mrs Lata Nevatia that made him continue his visits to various hospitals and serve free of cost, including taking leadership at Rotary.

He is pride of Rotary Club of Calcutta Metropolitan and we are privileged as Metropolitans to have his association as our extended family.



DR NARESH GOYAL

Next recipient of vocational award, Dr Naresh Goyal nominated for his lifetime service as consultant physician. President Rtn Sashi Dhacholia, shared Dr Goyal's journey of serving for four decades with a

reputation of not advising unnecessary medicines or tests and example of his great diagnosis was recommending a test just by looking at Rtn Sashi Dhacholia's wife and treating her for thyroid, something their family doctor missed, or recommending Rtn Sashi Dhacholia, to get discharged from a hospital when doctors advised him into ICU, and even helping him battle depression.

President mentioned his personal views of how loves the commitment of Dr Goyal, something he has seen from their younger years as they are childhood friends. His passion for PACE matching grants, global grants, becoming international cadre in district 3291 and various other roles at club and district level.

Dr Goyal shared the life lessons that he got by becoming a doctor. First one, never break the trust of the patient because he comes to you with all their faith. Second being helpful all the time. Third, as we grow older, the goal needs to be health. Fitness becomes a necessity to do good in the world. He shared about the influence of Dr Neerja Rateria, on whose persuasion he joined Rotary and starting enjoying doing projects. Rtn Jayanta Chatterji,

Rtn Deepa Willingham and Rtn James Lewis who continue to be his inspiration of serving above self. Rtn Madan Mohan Mohanka demonstrating the way philanthropic work needs to be the focus and Dr Goyal intends to continue making a difference and serving the community. PARTHO SAROTHY CHOWDHURY

Our next recipient of vocational award Pandit Partho Sarothy Chowdhury, a maestro of Sarod, carrying forward the rich legacy of Hindustani classical music. PP Rtn Jayanta Chatterji shared deep insights about the journey of Pandit Partho Sarothy,

highlighting key milestones of him being trained by two legendary icons, Ustad Dhyanesh Khan, and Bharat Ratna Pt. Ravi Shankar, performing all over the world for more than 50 years, including places like Carnegie Hall, Albert Hall, music festivals, concerts with great gurus and icons like Ustad Zakir Hussian and Ustad Vilayat Khan.

His mastery in sarod is unparalleled and beyond his role as a performer, he is a teacher, nurturing a new generation of musicians and safe guarding rich heritage of sarod. He has stood as a rock not allowing fusion or digital mixing to creep into his music to maintain the purity of Indian classical music. As he said, "I am a humble student of music. I started as an 8-year-old boy and performed at age of 9 years. Grateful to convert my passion into my profession.

Music is a universal language and sarod is not merely an instrument, it is a sacred link between the artist and divine and I need your continuous support to pursue journey of my music." It was an honour to have his presence as he was felicitated with an applause and request for performance, which he agreed with modesty and humility.



PROF. MAQSOOD SIDDIQI

Final recipient of vocational award Prof Maqsood Siddiqi for his lifetime contribution to scientific research. PP Rtn Utpal Chatterjee, shared personal interactions with Prof Siddiqi, who with 45 years of

scientific research, teaching, public health, and institutional management experience in India and abroad, has created landmark research in the field of cancer, with his current interests including breast cancer awareness and the ongoing research trial on HPV vaccination in India.

Prof Siddiqi shared cancer research continues to be his passion and focus area of his research is finding the various causes for cancer, finding prevention and cure for the same. He said he realised that lot of work was not happening in the right direction and the hospitals seemed more interested in the entry of the patients. Hence post his retirement, like minded individuals got together an organisation focused on prevention, screening, and advocacy of cancer related health conditions and cure. They have made a conscious effort to cover north eastern part of India as a lot of support and awareness was missing there.

He invited Rotary to collaborate to help create better awareness and reach to support the research and cause. It was a privilege to have his presence and we were grateful for the doors to meaningful service that opened with this felicitation by the senior member of RCCM, PP Rtn Maitrayee Ray.




PP RTN UTPAL CHATTERJEE

LEG FOR LEGLESS- CONTINUOUS PARTNER IN SERVICE SINCE INCEPTION

The legacy of "LEG FOR LEGLESS" project being carried since inception-1986 both by Mahavir Seva Sadan and Rotary Club of Calcutta Metropolitan. This is one of the pilot projects of RCCM resulting in so many projects doing together for Artificial Limbs, Callipers, Polio Corrective surgeries, Tri-cycle and scholarship for physically challenged, Rehabilitation of Cerebral Palsy Children and out station camp both in India and abroad.

Any International visitor from Rotary will ensure the visit to Mahavir Seva Sadan. We are having our Joint meetings with Mahavir Seva Sadan every year on Republic Day (26th January) and Independence Day (15th August). This is prime example of Partner in Service for so many years.

The Joint meeting started with the Flag hoisting at their place in presence of District Governor Nominee Rtn Tapas Bhattacharya of RID-3291, President Emeritus Shri J S Mehta & President Shri Vijay Choraria and members of Mahavir Seva Sadan, President Rtn Sashi Dhacholia and members of Rotary Club of Calcutta Metropolitan, Inner Wheel of Calcutta Metropolitan, Guests and beneficiaries, who are provided with Artificial Limbs, Callipers etc.

After welcome brief address by President Shri Vijay Choraria about the journey of Mahavir Seva Sadan especially with Rotary Club of Calcutta Metropolitan.

President Rtn Sashi Dhacholia Medical announced that equipment under GG 19-80213 for Rehabilitation of Cerebral Palsy Children amounting to Rs.18,74,100.00 has been delivered to MSS Rehabilitation & Research Centre at Joka. We are also working for Change of Scope for an unspent amount for some instruments which is no longer required. We are working for the GG for USD 58,000/- for Artificial Limbs, Polio Corrective Surgeries etc. Hopefully it will be done before June-2025.

Chief Guest DGN Rtn Tapas Bhattacharya was highly impressed with the 38 years of synergy between Mahavir

Seva Sadan and RCCM, and applauded all the recommended work done. He requested MSS and RCCM to share the profile and contract note on the project to make it a district project. He wanted name of the contact person and President suggested name of PP Rtn Dr V K Nevatia, who has been involved with MSS since inception as the medical doctor. DGN also addressed the present beneficiaries and their families, thanking them for their trust and shared that both MSS and RCCM were playing the medium of God in helping make a difference to their lives and they could do the same by spreading awareness to as many people as they could who could benefit from this information to get the needed help. Even during his visit through the unit, he was amazed that the beneficiaries were the ones employed to create more artificial limbs to support the community further and even create items of utility like bags out of waste, saying he had not seen anything like this before and left more committed to take this project further. We are grateful for his support.

He talked about importance of collaboration, the prime example is of MSS and RCCM. The partnership is equally playing an important role to execute various social projects. DGN Rtn Tapas Bhattacharya was presented with Replica of Leg. He also requested RCCM and MSS to provide him about the details of their project on Artificial Limbs etc. to enable him to make the District-3291 project also.

There was demonstration of beneficiaries, who are provided with Artificial Limbs and callipers. They were also presented with lifelong Card, which will ensure them free artificial limbs.

DGN and President of RCCM distributed the scholarships to the needy physically challenged students.

After the President of RCCM done his Club business and the Acting Secretary Rtn Runjhun Gupta making necessary Club announcements, the meeting was terminated.




FELLOWSHIP DURING WINTER CARNIVAL ON 24.1.2025








DISTRIBUTION OF WOOLLEN BLANKETS ON 8.1.2025




water and first aid, taking care of all the basic needs ensuring there were no distractions in the way of them having fun.
