

Mr Mishra is also an accomplished teacher and loves to take classes in Logic and Mathematics. He also grooms candidates with interpersonal skills for job interviews etc.


He and his team have trained 10,000+ Students for various Competitive Exams.

SPEAKER REPORT: DR MOUSIKI KAR, TOPIC: SEMI-CONDUCTOR TECHNOLOGIES ROADMAP, TOWARDS AI-DRIVEN FUTURE BY VP RTN RUNJHUN GUPTA ON 26.10.2024

Dr Mousiki Kar, an engineering educator, associate professor in department of Electronics and communication engineering at Heritage Institute of Technology, India and founder, coordinator of IEEE in India, funded by IEEE USA demonstrated her passion for the field and knowledge sharing from the word go.

She took permission to get all the seasoned Metropolitans in student mode as she explained the importance of her focus, AI (Artificial Intelligence), the biggest buzz word that is slowly taking over our lives in all areas like Health, education, agriculture, finance, retail, energy, manufacturing, entertainment. She shared how the investment in AI has gone up by 2 to 2.5 times globally since last year, close to 200 million USD, with major conclaves happening across the globe.

She highlighted the advantages in different fields like in health, it will help with precise analysis, predictive diagnosis and making the complicated surgeries simplified through robotic surgeries. In finance, it can help detect fraudulent transactions at much faster pace, in time to prevent misuse and help better risk management for trading, calculation of credit scorings etc. In industries, it can help manage the health of machinery with IOT sensors and help improve the production and outputs. Product process and supply chain can be managed well understanding the demand, leading to less wastage through excess production. In education field, it can help bring standardisation in learning and teaching methodology. It can help in further identifying the type of learners and deliver personalised teachings along with providing resources. Smart content creation is already being widely used like ChatGPT and making process like checking answer sheets a simpler process. In Retail, the search engine like google, Facebook help in aligning multiple options for a single requirement, increasing market reach, and growing online sales. In transportation, google maps help to find easiest way to arrive in destinations on time. Work is in progress to get sensors





to alert about incoming traffic and force stop to prevent accidents. Al programs are getting developed that will help to align with like-minded people to carpool with. In agriculture, Al programs are getting developed where farmers would just need to deploy drones to monitor the crop conditions, apply relevant chemical solutions, understand the health of soil, predict yield and output. In entertainment, it creates an enhanced user experience understanding their preference based on choices made like in Netflix, prime video, etc. Virtual reality helps in going through a desired experience without the risk of real-life hurdles, for example getting the thrill of an adventure even without a permitting health condition. In energy conservation. Al helps in getting more accurate reports and conditions of our planet with respect to environment, resources, and its usage. For example, as per research, Kolkata is at the risk of drowning within 80 years if precautions are not taken, which is a scary reality that requires immediate action to ensure a better and safer world for our future generations.

In a nutshell, AI is based on programming derived out of inputs by various sources like keyboard, voice etc and the output is achieved through devices/chips which have semiconductors at their core. Semiconductors are made from silicon which is sourced from sand. So it is like a cycle that starts from dust and ends into dust, but during the journey, it consumes a lot of energy adding to the global warming. Hence its important to be aware of the cost and impact of this development, as the aim is to create more than 1000 trillion semi-conductor devices/transistors by end of 2030. AI needs to be used to compliment and collaborate with human effort. She ended with a message that we need to understand that AI is here to stay, it is important to be vigilant about how it can affect our lives and the need of the hour is about being prepared and not scared, because nothing can supersede the emotions and essence of being a human.

Before the group departed, the team leader recommended me to lead the six-member team from Alabama that would visit Nigeria the following year, which I did. There, I met people whose lives had been impacted by polio, including several family members of our hosts. I learned that polio reaches its victims across borders, economies, and religions.

That Foundation program - Group Study Exchange - opened my eyes to what Rotary is and what it can do. Taking part in the exchange set me on a path for new friendships and opportunities to serve on multiple continents.

Just as The Rotary Foundation has enriched my Rotary life, it can do the same for you. This month, during Rotary Foundation Month, I invite you to explore new Foundation experiences.

Look for ways you and your club can support Foundation-led efforts like polio eradication, disaster response, or the Rotary Peace Centers. Get involved in global grant or district grant projects.
