

GRATITUDE CONCLAVE FOR SCHOOL STUDENTS

A heart-warming and thought-provoking **Gratitude Conclave for school students** was organised to instil values that build character, compassion and emotional well-being among young learners.

The programme was graced by Chief Guest Rtn. Anirudh Roy Chowdhury (Director, Rotary International), along with esteemed dignitaries PDG Ravi Sehgal, PDG Mukul Sinha, PDG Prabir Chatterjee and Rtn. Brotindo Mallick..

The panel discussion featured an eminent line up of speakers - Dr. Jai Ranjan Ram (Child Psychiatrist), Prof. (Dr.) Deepali Singhee (Principal, iLEAD Institution) and Ms. Jessica Gomes Surana (Principal, Birla High School, Mukundapur) - and was skilfully moderated by PDG Rtn. Ravi Sehgal.

The programme was conducted seamlessly under the efficient compering of MC – Udita. Sangita Jain presented the *Project Brief*, setting the context and vision behind the initiative.

The event began on a musical note with a melodious welcome song by the Young Horizons School Choir, followed by an energetic performance by the Apeejay School band, Velvet Vibes, setting a joyful tone for the morning.

This was followed by the Panel Discussion on the topic of the day, moderated by Rtn. Ravi Sehgal.

Dr. Jai Ranjan Ram emphasised that gratitude develops when children see kindness in action - through observation, empathy and compassion. **Ms. Jessica Gomes Surana** highlighted the importance of the three magic words: Thank You, Sorry and Please, reinforced by the philosophy of Give and Grow.

Prof. (Dr.) Deepali Singhee reminded that words have immense power they can hurt, but they can also heal - encouraging students to treat others as they wish to be treated.

The session concluded with a meaningful reflection from moderator **PDG Rtn. Ravi Sehgal**, who emphasised that **we must respect our roots**, and that gratitude naturally leads to peace and harmony within communities. A beautiful Skit was staged on the topic of the day by students of St. Agnes School

Students from Apeejay School, MCKV School, St. Agnes School, Young Horizons School and Indus Valley School participated enthusiastically, totalling around 100 students.

Project Saksham – LN4 Prosthetic Hand Fitment Report

Date: 15th Nov 2025 Location: Rotary Camp, Dhanbad

Rotary Club of Dhanbad (RID 3250), along with their enthusiastic Rotaractors, successfully organised an LN4 prosthetic hand fitment camp under Project Saksham.

A total of 10 beneficiaries received LN4 prosthetic hands, each one guided and supported through the process. The fitments were completed by Rtn. Pravin, Rtn. Ranjan, and Rtn. Sangita, ensuring careful attention to every individual beneficiary. This was our 21st LN4 fitment camp overall, and the first camp for this Rotary year.



Toilet Seat Distribution at Champahati

On Saturday, 15 November 2025, RC Calcutta Presidency participated in a meaningful District Project by sponsoring 10 specially designed toilet seats for senior citizens. These seats were conceptualised by DG Dr. Homchoudhury, an orthopedic specialist, with the needs of underprivileged elders in mind — particularly those who find it difficult to squat and cannot afford a commode. Our RCC partner assisted by identifying and gathering the very old and needy residents of Champahati village. Club members personally handed over the curated toilet seats to the beneficiaries. As part of the district initiative, 10 seats were distributed, each costing Rs. 300.
