Rotary Ramkrishna Academy









In 2023, we established the Rotary Ramkrishna Academy, an English-medium primary school in Piyali, South 24 Parganas. Today, 115 children from low-income families are enrolled, with the capacity to serve 200. Our minimal fee structure ensures accessibility but leaves us with an annual shortfall of ₹12 lakhs. This fundraiser will directly support teacher training, digital learning tools, classroom infrastructure, and expansion for more students. We seek your generous cooperation and support in helping us nurture these young minds and secure their future.
